PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Governor-General of all Her Majesty's Australian Possessions, and Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a certain Act or Ordinance of the Governor and Legislative Council, passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, "An Act to amend an Act, intituled, 'An Act to repeal an Act of the Governor and Council of New South Wales, intituled, 'An Act to authorise the erection of Pounds, and for regulating the Impounding of Cattle,' and to make further and other provisions in lieu thereof, and to extend the provisions thereof," it was amongst other things enacted, that whenever the Governor, or acting Governor, for the time being, should deem it expedient and advantageous to extend the provisions of the said Act, passed in the fourth year of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, so far as the same relate to any person suffering any cattle belonging to him, or in his charge, to stray or go about, or to be tethered or depastured in any street or public place within the limits, or reputed limits, of the several Towns in the said Act mentioned, to such other Towns now erected, or hereafter to be erected or established at any place within the said Colony as might thereafter be deemed necessary, it should and might be lawful for the said Governor, or acting Governor for the time being, to declare the same by Proclamation, to be published in the

Government Gazette: Now, therefore, I, the Governor-General, in pursuance of the power and authority so vested in me by the said recited Act, by this my Proclamation do hereby direct, that so much of the provisions of the said Act, passed in the fourth year of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, as is hereinbefore particularly specified, be extended to the Town of Singleton, in the County of Northumberland.

Given under my Hand and Seal, at Government House, Sydney, this seventeenth day of September, in the year of Our Lord, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-one, and in the fifteenth year of Her Majesty's reign.

OLD BARRACK SQUARE.

ON Wednesday, the 24th instant, will be sold by Public Auction, at the Court of Requests, Bent-street, Sydney, the materials forming parts of certain of the buildings and walls in the Old Barrack Square, as hereunder mentioned.

2. It is to be distinctly understood, on the part of the purchasers, that the materials in question must be removed within 21 days from the day of sale.

Lot 1.—Extends northerly 48 feet more or less along York-street, from the north or outside of the wall along the north side of the main building in the centre stack of old Soldiers' quarters, to the north side of a party wall bounding lot 2 by lines at right angles, westerly of 25 feet to the rear.

Lot 2.—Extends northerly from the north side of the party wall bounding lot 1, 47½ feet, more or less, along York-street, by lines at right angles, westerly of 25 feet, including wooden staircase.

Lot 3.—Extends 84½ feet, more or less, along York-street, from the south side of the wall at the south extreme of the centre stack of buildings formerly used as Soldiers' quarters, by a depth westerly to the rear of 25 feet.

**FIFTY POUNDS REWARD, OR A CON-
DITIONAL PARDON.**
