## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS
FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal
Hanoverian Guelphic Order, GovernorGeneral of all Her Majesty's Australian Possessions, and Captain-General and Governorin-Chief of the Territory of New South
Wales and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

THEREAS by an Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the fifth and sixth year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for the Government of "New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land," it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor of New South Wales for the time being to fix such place or places within any part of the said Colony, and such times for holding the first and every other Session of the Legislative Council constituted under the said recited Act, as he may think fit: Now, therefore, I, Sir Charles Augustus Fitz Roy, as such Governor aforesaid, do hereby, in pursuance of the power and authority so in me vested, announce and proclaim that the first Session of the present Legislative Council, for the despatch of business, shall commence and be holden on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of October now next ensuing, at Twelve o'clock at noon, in the building known as the Council Chambers, situated in Macquarie-street, in the City of Sydney; and the Members of the said Council are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Government House, Sydney, this twenty-sixth day of September, in the fifteenth year of Her Majesty's reign, and in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one.

Chilcott, Master of the barque "Arabia," reporting the existence of a dangerous sunker rock off No. 8 Island, (Claremont Group,) in Torres Strait.

I wish to bring to your notice the fact, that the rock discovered by me off No. 8 Island, (Claremont Group,) in the Straits, is still omitted in the Admiralty Charts—those that I have, at least, do not contain it and they are your charts, with additions by Captain Owen Stanley. The Island bore west  $\frac{1}{9}$  south, by compass  $1\frac{1}{9}$  mile. You will immediately perceive, on reference to the charts, that the rock is directly in the way, and if its existence is not made known by the time the steamers pass that route, the danger will be considerable. I passed this time about 30 yards to the eastward of it, (it was low water spring tides, and then only a wash.) The rock is about two ships' length north and south, and about eight yards east and west.
