## ROADS.

**H**IS Excellency the GOVERNOR-GENERAL, with the advice of the Executive Council, having deemed it expedient to open and make a Parish Road, to be maintained at the expense of the parishes through which it is to pass; commencing at the north-east corner of Hooke and Dowling-streets, in the Village of Dangog, and bearing north along Dowling-street 5 chains; thence north 40 degrees, east

3 chains, north 68 degrees 30 minutes, east 8 chains, north 5 degrees, east 3 chains, and north 3 degrees, west 7 chains through the Village Reserve of Dungog, and C. L. Brown's and Laurence Myles's lands to the River Williams at the Port Stephen's Falls; thence in a north-easterly direction through Laurence Myles' land and the Church and School land to the present road to Stroud, from the upper falls of the River Williams at Dingadee: Notice is hereby given, that in conformity with the provisions of the Act of the Governor and Council 4th William IV, No. 11, intituled, "*An Act for making, altering, and improving the Roads throughout the Colony of New South Wales, and for opening and improving the Streets in the Towns thereof*," a plan and book of reference, shewing the intended line of the said road, is now deposited in the Office of the Surveyor General in Sydney, and also at the Police Office, at Dungog; and all persons interested therein are requested to transmit in writing to the Clerk of the Executive Council, within one month from this date, any well grounded objection which may exist to the formation of the said Road.

#### TWENTY-FIVE POUNDS REWARD, OR A CONDITIONAL PARDON.
