ROADS.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR-GENERAL, with the advice of the Executive Council, having deemed it expedient to open and make certain Parish Roads, to be maintained at the expense of the Parishes through which they are to pass, leaving Clarence Town along the line of Queen-street, from the junction of Queen-street and Marshall-street, and bearing south-westerly into and through Francis Allman's grant of 640 acres crossing Stony Creek, the western boundary of that grant, at the present crossing place; thence still bearing south-westerly through Government Land into and through Fisher's grant of 1,500 acres, now in possession of Richard Lang, passing along upwards and crossing Tumble-down Creek, at the present crossing place within the said grant; thence bearing still south-westerly into Government Land, situate adjacent and westward of that grant; thence leaving said Government Land in a more southerly direction into Still's grant of 1,280 acres, also now in possession of Richard Lang, and crossing the north branch of Wattle Creek, at the present crossing place; thence on a south-easterly bearing, entering a bush paddock of Richard Lang's and crossing the south branch of Wattle Creek, at a point known as the "Flaggy Crossing Place"; thence onwards in a south-easterly direction through another bush paddock of Richard Lang's into Torrence's grant of 2,000 acres, now in possession of John Clode, continuing south-easterly through the said grant outside the cultivation fences, and along the right bank of the River William into Dixon's grant of 1,600 acres; continuing south-easterly along the cultivation fences of said grant, turning westerly round the base of Dixon's Hill, and crossing Mooghin Creek at Mooghin Bridge,

thence again bearing south-easterly along the present usage road, into the Village Reserve of Seaham, at a point 10 chains west of Scott-street, and onward to the junction of Warren and Torrence-street; again leaving the junction of Warren and Torrence-streets on a south-west bearing through the Village Reserve of Seaham, passing the Cemetery Ground on the south-east and crossing Green-wattle Creek at the second crossing place west of Warren's corner; thence more westerly into Bartie's grant of 2,560 acres, and passing through that grant westerly to its west boundary line at Bartie's Bridge over Bartie's or Black-wattle Creek and into Jones Agnew Smith's 700 acres; thence through that land on a bearing of south 60 degrees west to the north boundary line of Alexander Livingstone's grant of 1,075 acres, at a point where it is crossed by the present usage road from Hinton to Paterson; thence on the one hand along the said usage road south-easterly till it meets the already proclaimed road from Hinton Punt; and on the other hand westerly along the boundary line between the lands of Jones Agnew Smith, Richard Lang, again of Jones Agnew Smith, and of John Tucker on the north, and the lands of Alexander Livingstone and John Galt Smith on the south, to a point in the said boundary line where it is met by the present usage road from Dunmore Punt through the land of John Galt Smith; and thence on bearings south and north of west to Dunmore Punt, at Lang's Steam Mill on the River Paterson: Notice is hereby given, that in conformity with the provisions of the Act of the Governor and Council 4th William IV, No. 11, intituled, "*An Act for making, altering, and improving the Roads throughout the Colony of New South Wales, and for opening and improving the Streets in the Towns thereof*," a Plan and Book of Reference, shewing the intended lines of the said Roads, are now deposited in the Office of the Surveyor-General, in Sydney, and at the Police Office, Raymond Terrace, and all persons interested therein, are requested to transmit in writing to the Clerk of the Executive Council, within one month from this date, any well grounded objection which may exist to the formation of the said Roads.
