WHEREAS by an Act passed in the fifth year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled, "*An Act for the Transportation of Offenders from Great Britain*," it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, from time to time, to appoint any place or places beyond the Seas, either within or without His Majesty's Dominions, to which Felons and other Offenders under sentence, or order of Transportation, or punishment, should be conveyed.

And whereas by an Order made by Her Majesty, with the advice of Her Privy Council, on the 4th day of September, 1848, Her said Majesty was pleased, in pursuance of the power so vested in Her as aforesaid, to appoint New South Wales, Van Diemen's Land, and Norfolk Island, and the Cape of Good Hope, together with the Dependencies comprised under the Government of the aforesaid Colonies respectively, to be places to which, from and after the 25th day of

November, 1848, Felons and other Offenders in the United Kingdom, there being or thereafter to be under sentence of order of Transportation, should be conveyed under the provisions of the said recited Act.

And whereas by another Order made by Her Majesty, with the advice of Her Privy Council as aforesaid, on the 8th day of January, 1850, Her Majesty was pleased to revoke so much of the said first recited Order as concerns the Cape of Good Hope.

And whereas it hath seemed fit to Her Majesty, on the advice of Her said Privy Council, also to revoke so much of the said recited Order in Council as concerns New South Wales and its Dependencies.

Now therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the power vested in Her Majesty in Council by the said recited Act of Parliament, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, doth Order, and it is hereby Ordered, that upon and from the day of the date of this present Order in Council, so much of the said recited Order in Council, of the 4th day of September, 1848, as concerns New South Wales, shall be and the same is hereby revoked, so far as respects any act, matter, or thing to be done from the day of the date of this present Order in Council.

And the Right Honorable Earl Grey, and the Right Honorable Sir George Grey, Bart., two of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

MILITARY CIRCULAR.

Sir,

It has appeared to me that the clause numbered 4 of the paper entitled "Information for the use of Military and Naval Officers proposing to settle in the British Colonies" is liable to lead to the erroneous impression that officers who have become permanent residents in any Colony, without having obtained permission to retire from the Army or Navy for that purpose, previously to their leaving this country, are

entitled to share in the advantages held out in that paper. I have accordingly thought it proper that the clause in question should be omitted, and I transmit to you herewith a copy of the paper so amended.

INFORMATION FOR THE USE OF MILITARY AND NAVAL OFFICERS PROPOSING TO SETTLE IN CERTAIN OF THE BRITISH COLONIES.

1. The Colonies in which Military and Naval Officers are allowed privileges in the acquisition of public Lands, are the following:—*First*, The Australian Settlements, consisting of New South Wales, Van Diemen's Land, South Australia, Western Australia, and the Northern Province of New Zealand; *Secondly*, Ceylon; and *Thirdly*, the Cape of Good Hope.

2. In the different Australian Settlements, in Ceylon, and at the Cape of Good Hope, land is disposed of by sale only; but Officers purchasing land, are allowed a remission of the purchase money, according to the undermentioned scale:

Field Officers, of 25 years' service and upwards, in the whole ...	£600
Field Officers, of 20 years' service and upwards, in the whole ...	500
Field Officers, of 15 or less years' service, in the whole	400
Captains, of 20 years' service and upwards, in the whole.....	400
Captains, of 15 years' service or less, in the whole	300
Subalterns, of 20 years' service and upwards, in the whole	300
Subalterns, of 7 years' service and upwards, in the whole.....	200
Subalterns, under 7 years' standing, are not entitled to any remission in the purchase of Land.	

Regimental Staff Officers, and Medical Officers of the Army and Navy, are allowed the benefit of this Rule.

3. Officers of the Army or Navy, proposing to proceed to the Colonies, in order to take advantage of this indulgence, should provide themselves with certificates from the Office of the Commander-in-Chief, or of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, or of the Master General of the Ordnance, shewing that their emigration has been sanctioned, and stating exactly their rank and length of service. No document from the Office of the Secretary of State is necessary.

4. Military Chaplains, Commissariat Officers, and Officers of any of the Civil Departments of the Army; Purser, Chaplains, Midshipmen, Warrant Officers of every description, and Officers of any of the Civil Departments of the Navy, are not allowed any privileges in respect of land. Although members of these classes may have been admitted formerly, and under different circumstances, they are now excluded. Mates in the Royal Navy rank with Ensigns in the Army, and Mates of three years standing, with Lieutenants in the Army, and are entitled respectively to corresponding privileges in the acquisition of lands.

5. Gentlemen who have ceased to belong to Her Majesty's Service are not allowed the advantages to which they were entitled while in the Army or Navy. This rule, however, is not to affect Officers who desire to quit the Service, for the express purpose of settling in the Colonies; it is only required, that when they resign their

Commissions, they should apply for a certificate from the Commander-in-Chief, or from the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, or from the Master General of the Ordnance, that they do so with the view of emigrating, and such certificate, if produced to the Governor of any of the Colonies before mentioned within one year from its date, *but not otherwise*, will be a sufficient warrant for allowing the bearer the same advantages as Officers who are still in Her Majesty's Service.

6. An actual residence of two years in the Colony must be proved before the Titles can be granted, except in cases in which death may have occurred before the expiration of that period.

7. For the convenience of Officers, the following heads are subjoined of the Rules for the sale of Land in the Australian Settlements:—

All Lands are disposed of by sale alone, and must have been once at least exposed to public auction.

The lowest upset price is not less than £1 per acre; but the Government has power to raise the same by Proclamation, though not again to reduce it.

The lands are distinguished into three different classes; viz., Town Lots, Suburban Lots, and Country Lots.

Upon Town and Suburban Lots, as well as upon a proportion not exceeding one-tenth of the whole of the Country Lots offered for sale at any auction, the Governor has the power of naming a higher than the general or lowest upset price; these last to be designated "Special Country Lots."

Town and Suburban Lots are in no case disposed of except by public auction; but Country Lots, which have already been put up to public auction, and not sold, may be disposed of afterwards by private contract at the upset price.

No Lands are sold by private contract, except for ready money. When sold by public auction, one-tenth at least of the whole purchase money must be put down, and the remainder within one calendar month, or the deposit is forfeited.

Lands are put up for sale in lots not exceeding one square mile in extent.

8. In Ceylon, land is sold by auction at an upset price, which is to be fixed by the Governor, but which is not to be less than £1 per acre. Before the Lands are exposed for sale, they will be surveyed by the Government and duly advertised.

9. At the Cape of Good Hope the upset price is 2s. per acre in the old Colony, and 4s. per acre in the District of Natal.

10. The several prices above-mentioned are of course subject to a revision at any time by the proper authorities, and the pecuniary amount of the Remission made to Officers cannot be increased on account of an increased value set upon the Lands.

ESCORT OF GOLD FROM ARAUEN TO GOULBURN, AND FROM THENCE TO SYDNEY.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR-GENERAL directs it to be notified, with reference to the notice of the 17th ultimo, that arrangements have been made for the conveyance of Gold, under the charge of an armed Escort, from Arauen to Goulburn and Sydney, and from Goulburn to Sydney once a fortnight.

2. Persons having Gold to transmit will therefore have the opportunity of forwarding it with the security of the protection which the Government will be able to afford; but it is to be understood, that, in the event of a loss notwithstanding that protection, the Government will not be responsible for it.

3. The Gold intended to be sent under this arrangement from Arauen to Goulburn, or to Sydney, is to be delivered to the Commissioner of Crown Lands, or the Assistant Commissioner on the spot, who will Escort the chests or safes provided for the purpose to Goulburn, where he will deliver the bags addressed to Goulburn, to the persons or agents appointed to receive them, and forward to the Colonial Treasurer the packages for Sydney by the Gold conveyance, by which the armed Escort proceeds, at whose Office they may be obtained by the persons duly authorised for the purpose.

4. The Gold whether received at Arauen or at Goulburn, is to be delivered to the Commissioner of Crown Lands, or Assistant Commissioner, who after weighing it, will place it in bags, which are to be sealed, numbered, addressed, and marked by him with the weight, in the presence of the parties bringing it, and receipts will be granted by him, in which these particulars will be specified, as well as the description of the Gold, and the names of the agents or persons, to whom it is to be delivered in Goulburn or Sydney.

5. A charge will be made for Gold forwarded under this arrangement from Arauen to Goulburn, of one-half per cent., and from either of these places to Sydney, of one per cent. on its value, estimated at £3 per ounce for washed gold, and £2 8s. per ounce for gold obtained by amalgamation; and payment is to be made to the Commissioner or Assistant Commissioner at Goulburn, for Gold forwarded to that place, and to the Colonial Treasurer for that sent to Sydney, on the delivery of the packages.

6. The chests or safes containing the Gold intended for conveyance to Sydney, will be consigned to the Colonial Treasurer, in Sydney, who will deliver the bags to the persons or agents appointed to receive them, on their producing authorities corresponding with the receipts given by the Commissioner, and with the return which will be transmitted by him to the Treasurer.

7. The conveyance by which Gold may be sent under the protection of an Escort, will leave Arauen once a fortnight, on a day and time to be named by the Commissioner or Assistant Commissioner (of which due notice will be given) in sufficient time to reach Goulburn on a Friday, and the Government Gold Conveyance will leave Goulburn early in the morning of each alternate Monday, commencing on the present date, and will arrive at the Colonial Treasury on the Friday following at 1 o'clock p.m.

8. The packages of Gold will be delivered at the Colonial Treasury, to the agents or parties authorised to receive them, between the hours of 1 and 3 o'clock p.m. on the day of arrival, and between the hours of 9 and 10 o'clock a.m., of every other office day.

CONDITIONAL PARDONS.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR-GENERAL has been pleased to make the following modification in the Regulations of the 1st May, 1846, in reference to the granting of Conditional Pardons to Prisoners of the Crown transported to this Colony, prior to the year 1842, viz. :—

Any such Convicts who may have held a Ticket of Leave, with continued good conduct, during two consecutive years, and who may be recommended by the Bench of Magistrates or Commissioner of Crown Lands of the District in which he resides, and by two persons of respectability known to the Government, may apply, through the Principal Superintendent of Convicts, to the Governor-General for a Conditional Pardon.

ROADS.

WITH reference to the Government Notice of the 14th October last, relative to the intention of the Government to open a certain parish road from Dungog towards Stroud, notice is hereby given, that as no objections have been made within the period allowed by law to the line in question, His Excellency the GOVERNOR-GENERAL, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to confirm the said road as already notified, in conformity with the Act of Council 4th William IV., No. 11, intituled, "*An Act for making, altering, and improving the Roads throughout the Colony of New South Wales, and for opening and improving the Streets in the Towns thereof,*" and it is hereby declared expedient to open and make the said road according to the map or plan and Book of Reference to be seen at the Office of the Surveyor General, Sydney, and at the Police Office, Dungog; and all persons intending to claim compensation in respect of the said line, are hereby reminded that notice must be served upon the Colonial Secretary, within forty days from the date hereof, in such manner and form as provided by the 6th section of the Act above referred to, or they will be for ever foreclosed from such claim.

PUBLIC ACCOUNTS.

ALL Persons having claims on the Colonial Treasury are requested to furnish their accounts through the proper channel, before the end of the year, or as soon thereafter as practicable.

2. The several Collectors and Officers in the receipt of Public Money, will pay over to the Colonial Treasurer on or before the 31st of December, the amount of all collections remaining in their hands respectively up to that date, so that the entire Revenue collected by each, may be credited in the accounts of the year within which it was received.

3. The Heads of Departments and other Officers who have received advances to enable them to defray expenses incurred under their superintendence, are requested to furnish to the Audit Office, as far

as practicable, and with all convenient despatch, the amount of the expenditure thereof, and on or before the last day of December, to pay into the Colonial Treasury, the unexpended balance of such advances, that the adjustment of the same may appear in the accounts to the 31st proximo.

4. They will also, as soon as practicable after the close of the year, bring forward accounts of all the expenses incurred within the same, which do not admit of being previously settled, so that if possible, all the expenses incurred in the present year may be finally adjusted and liquidated within one month after its termination.

5. The Colonial Treasurer is requested to use his endeavours to give effect to these directions, and to report through the proper channel, for the information of His Excellency the Governor-General, any instance of neglect in complying therewith, on the part of the Government Officers concerned.
