**GUNPOWDER IN STORE AT GOAT ISLAND.**

**T**HE attention of the owners of Gunpowder in store at Goat Island, is drawn to the Act of the Governor and Council 15 Vic., No. 10, by which they will observe that the Gunpowder for the sale or destruction of which the Act provides, may be retained, provided that before the 15th of next month, they duly pay all arrears of rent and other charges, if any, due thereon, together with such sum of money as the Deputy Ordnance Storekeeper shall reasonably demand for the cost of securing the packages containing the Gunpowder, or of providing new packages and removing the said Gunpowder into the same, as to him shall seem fit.

TRANSFERABLE AND REMITTABLE LAND AND  
IMMIGRATION DEBENTURES.

SEALED Tenders will be received at this Office, until noon of Tuesday, the thirty-first of January next, from persons desirous of advancing the whole or any portion of the Sum of Thirty thousand Four hundred Pounds on the following security, and subject to the undermentioned terms and conditions, viz. :—

(1.) Each Tender must be for an even sum of hundreds of Pounds, and must be endorsed "Tender for Debentures."

(2.) If the Tender be accepted, Land and Immigration Debentures for £100 each, secured upon the Territorial Revenue of New South Wales will be issued for the sum advanced, and will bear interest at the rate of 3½d. per diem, or £4 18s. 10½d. per £100 per annum, payable half-yearly, on the first of January, and first of July.

(3.) They will be receivable as cash at any time for the purchase of Crown Lands in this Colony, or for any other payment due on account of the Territorial Revenue within the same.

(4.) The principal will not otherwise be payable for a period of less than one year from the date of the Debenture, but it will be redeemable at par at any time thereafter at the option of the Government, but not of the holder, on three months' notice to that effect being given in the New South Wales or London *Gazette*, according as the same may be payable in the Colony or in England.

(5.) The principal will also be redeemable at par, at the option of the holder for the time being, after the expiration of five years from the date of the Debenture, on his giving three months' notice to that effect to the Colonial Agent General, in London, or the Colonial Treasurer, in Sydney, as the case may be.

(6.) At the expiration of the three months' notice given either by the Government or the holder, the interest on the Debenture to which such notice shall apply, will cease and determine.

(7.) The principal and interest of each Debenture will be payable at the option of the holder for the time being, either in Sydney or London; any change which it may be desired to make in this respect, being previously registered at the Colonial Treasury, in Sydney, and in the office of the Colonial Agent General, in London, and endorsed upon the Debenture, which must be presented accordingly at both these Offices for that purpose.

(8.) Whenever a Debenture may be made payable in London, a Duplicate thereof will be transmitted by the Colonial Treasurer to the Colonial Agent General, by such opportunity as the holder may desire, in order that the same may be available on proof of the loss of the original.

(9.) The Debentures will be transferable if made out in blank, in the same manner as Exchequer Bills; but if made payable to any individual or firm, then by endorsement as in the case of Bills of Exchange.

(10.) Any number of Debentures will, for the convenience of the holders, be consolidated into one or more of the aggregate amount, on application at the Colonial Treasury, provided that such consolidated Debentures shall be issued for even sums of £500 or £1000 only.

(11.) The amount tendered, if accepted, will be received either in cash, or in Treasury or Bank Bills. The tenders must, of course, express the intended mode of payment, and, if in Bills, at what rate of exchange.

PUBLIC ACCOUNTS.

ALL Persons having claims on the Colonial Treasury are requested to furnish their accounts through the proper channel, before the end of the year, or as soon thereafter as practicable.

2. The several Collectors and Officers in the receipt of Public Money, will pay over to the Colonial Treasurer on or before the 31st of December, the amount of all collections remaining in their hands respectively up to that date, so that the entire Revenue collected by each, may be credited in the accounts of the year within which it was received.

3. The Heads of Departments and other Officers who have received advances to enable them to defray expenses incurred under their superintendence, are requested to furnish to the Audit Office, as far as practicable, and with all convenient despatch, the amount of the expenditure thereof, and on or before the last day of December, to pay into the Colonial Treasury, the unexpended balance of such advances, that the adjustment of the same may appear in the accounts to the 31st proximo.

4. They will also, as soon as practicable after the close of the year, bring forward accounts of all the expenses incurred within the same, which do not admit of being previously settled, so that if possible, all the expenses incurred in the present year may be finally adjusted and liquidated within one month after its termination.

5. The Colonial Treasurer is requested to use his endeavours to give effect to these directions, and to report through the proper channel, for the information of His Excellency the Governor-General, any instance of neglect in complying therewith, on the part of the Government Officers concerned.
