IN reference to the Regulations under which Ticket of Leave Holders are required to pay to this Office the sum of £15 before they are entitled to be recommended Home for Conditional Pardons, Notice is hereby given, that the Right Honorable the Secretary of State has been pleased to approve of the following reductions being made in the above amount, according to the length of time the Ticket of Leave Holders may remain in the service of the same master, namely:—

2.—If a Ticket of Leave Holder should remain two consecutive years with the same master, in the second and third years of his service a corresponding deduction will be made from his payment for the last year. For instance, if he shall have paid £5 for the first year, and £5 for the second, he will be exempt from any payment for the third year.

3.—The Ticket of Leave Holders who derive the benefit of these Regulations, will further be required to furnish to this Office, half-yearly, reports of their conduct, signed by their Masters, and countersigned by the Bench or Commissioner of Crown Lands of their respective Districts; such certificates may however be transmitted with the annual payments.

4.—Ticket of Leave Holders who have complied with these Regulations may at the end of the second year, petition for their pardons, and they will then be recommended Home for the indulgence.
