PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

**W**HEREAS by an Act of the GOVERNOR and Legislative Council of New South Wales, passed in the fourteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled, "*An Act to extend the provisions of an Act passed in the eleventh year of Her present Majesty, intituled, 'An Act for the regulation of Steam Navigation, and for requiring 'sea-going vessels to carry boats,' to all Steam Vessels,*" it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the said Governor to extend the said Act to such parts and places in the Colony of New South Wales and its Dependencies, as he, from time to time, should think fit, by Proclamation in the New South Wales *Government Gazette*; and whereas it appears to me fit and proper that the said Act should be henceforth extended to the parts and places hereinafter mentioned: Now, therefore, I, the Governor aforesaid, in pursuance of the power and authority so vested in me by the said recited Act, do, by this my Proclamation, hereby direct that the provisions of the said Act be extended to the District of Port Phillip, in the said Colony, and to the Ports, Harbours, Rivers, and other waters comprised within the said District.

Given under my Hand and Seal, at Sydney, this third day of March, in the Year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one, and in the fourteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

**CROWN LANDS BEYOND THE SETTLED DISTRICTS.**

(TRANSFER OF LEASES.)

**I**T being directed by Her Majesty's Order in Council of the 18th July, 1849, that all pas-  
toral leases of land beyond the Settled Districts of  
the Colony shall be transferred under such conditions,  
and in such manner and form as shall be determined  
by the Governor or Officer administering the Go-  
vernment of the Colony; His Excellency the Go-  
vernor, with the advice of the Executive Council,  
has therefore been pleased to direct that it shall be  
competent to the holders of such Leases to assign  
and transfer the same to such persons and in such  
manner and form as they may respectively think  
proper, provided however that the operative words  
"transfer" and "assign" be used, and that no such  
transfer shall take effect until the same shall have  
been recorded in the Office of the Chief Commis-  
sioner of Crown Lands, and registered on payment  
of the usual fees in the general Office for the re-  
gistration of Deeds, in Sydney or Melbourne as the  
case may require, and that such transfer shall be  
wholly null and void, if previously to the making  
thereof, or in the interval between such making and  
the completion of the transfer, as above provided,  
the transferrer shall have committed any act of  
forfeiture, under the terms, conditions, exceptions,  
reservations, and provisoes, contained in Her Ma-  
jesty's Orders in Council of the 9th March, 1847,  
and the 18th July, 1849, or in the Lease intended  
to be transferred; or if the transferee, or intended  
transferee, shall be other than a natural born or  
naturalized subject of the Realm, or shall within  
the period of three years next before the date thereof,  
have committed any offence, for which, if he had  
then been a lessee of Crown Land, his lease would  
have been, or might have been adjudged to be for-  
feited under the 14th section of Chap. II, of Her  
Majesty's Order in Council, of the 9th March, 1847.
