TWENTY POUNDS REWARD, OR A CONDITIONAL PARDON.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Government, that on or about the night of the 19th December last, the hut, woolshed, and hurdles, of Alexander Robertson, Esq., at Hillside, Hovell's Creek, in the district of Carcoar, were maliciously destroyed by fire, His Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that a Reward of Twenty pounds will be paid to any free person

COTTON.

(PREMIUM FOR CULTIVATION.)

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that, with a view to encourage the cultivation of Cotton in New South Wales, the following sums have been voted by the Legislative Council to be given as premiums for the best samples of that article grown in any part of the Colony, and exhibited in Sydney, on or before the 1st of June, 1851, viz. :—

- 1st.—For the best sample of Cotton Wool, weighing not less than 50lbs..... £30
- 2nd.—For the second best sample, weighing not less than 50lbs £20

The particular qualities required are length, strength, fineness, and silkiness of staple, and brightness of color.

Proof will be required that the Cotton Wool exhibited is the produce of the Colony, by the certificate of a Magistrate, or of some other known person of respectability.

The samples are to be delivered at the Colonial Store at Sydney, and the awards will be made by a Board appointed by the Governor.

FERRY AT GRAFTON.

AT Twelve o'clock on Wednesday, the 23rd day of April next, the Bench of Magistrates, at Grafton, will cause to be put up to Auction, at the Police Office, Grafton, the Lease for one or more years, not exceeding five, commencing on the 1st day of May, 1851, of the dues authorised to be collected at the Ferry established at the crossing place of the River Clarence, between the Towns of North and South Grafton.
