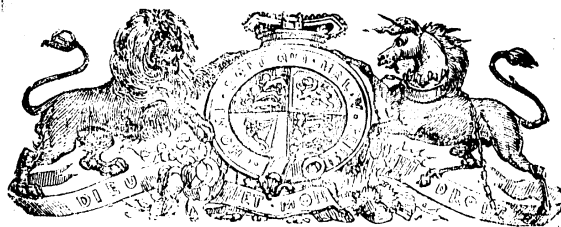

CROWN LANDS.

(EXTENDED DISTRICT.)

REFERRING to the Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* of the 15th instant, by which the limits of the Lower Darling District are so far extended as to include the Country lying between the River Darling and the South Australian Frontier, His Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that as this additional portion of Country has been brought within the reach of the protection and control of the Crown Commissioner, it will be competent for persons to Tender for New Runs in that locality, in terms of the Regulation of 1st January, 1848.

2. But in order that persons who reside at a distance from Sydney may have a fair opportunity of tendering for any Runs so situated, the first Tenders therefor will be opened on the first Monday in the month of September next, and not sooner.

IMMIGRATION.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that the Regulations dated 26th May, 1846, under which free passages to the Colony were offered to be provided for such of their children as were left at home by married Bounty Immigrants, who left Great Britain on or before the 7th January, 1842, have been cancelled.

2. Passages, however, can still be secured for the children of such Bounty Immigrants, under the Immigration Remittance regulations of 22nd December, 1848, at the rates of payment under the conditions therein prescribed.

FERRY AT GRAFTON.
