## POLICE DISTRICTS.

CERTAIN amendments having become necessary in the boundaries of the undermentioned Police Districts, His Excellency the Governor is pleased to direct the publication of the following, as the Boundaries of those Districts respectively, in lieu of those assigned to them in the Notice of 17th January, 1850, viz.:—

4. BALRANALD, comprising the pastoral district of the Lower Darling; bounded on the west by a line due north from "Chowella," Fowler's station on the River Murray, being the approximation to the 141st meridian of east longitude, to the 30th parallel of south latitude; on the north by that

parallel, easterly to the River Darling; on the east by that river downwards to Fort Bourke, thence by a line bearing south-easterly to the confluence of Kalingalungaguy Creek with the Lachlan River; and on the south by the Lachlan, Murrumbidgee, and Murray Rivers to "Chowella" aforesaid.

40. Port Macquarie, embracing the whole of the County of Macquarie; and bounded on the north by the McLeay River from its mouth to the first section line west of the eastern boundary of the parish of Kalateenee, by that section line southerly to the southern branch of the Maria River, by that branch to its head, in the range dividing the waters of the McLeay and Wilson Rivers, and by that range to Kippara, thence by a line to Mount Sea View to the west by a line from Mount Sea View to the confluence of the Manning and Barnard Rivers; on the south by the Manning River to the sea at Farquhar's Inlet; and on the east by the sea to the mouth of the McLeay River aforesaid.

### FERRY AT PORT MACQUARIE.

### NOTICE TO MARINERS.

IS Excellency the Governor directs the publication, for general information, of the following letter and translations of its enclosures, from Her Majesty's Consul at Tahiti, communicating the rectified positions of the Island of Toobouai and six of the Paumotu or Low Islands, as ascertained by recent Surveys of French Hydrographers.

SIR,

British Consulate, Tahiti, March 15, 1851.

As Vessels from New South Wales frequently pass amongst the Islands in this neighbourhood, many of which (particularly of the Paumotu Group,) appear to be very incorrectly laid down on the Charts, I do myself the honor of transmitting to your Excellency herewith, the copies of two letters which I have received from the French Commissioner at this place, communicating the rectified positions of the Island of Toobouai and six of the Paumotu or Low Islands, as ascertained by recent Surveys of French Hydrographers.

Papeete, (Tahiti,) 12th January, 1851.

On terminating his hydrographic operations, M. Delamarche, the Hydrographic Surveyor, addressed to me the following observation.

The Island of Toobouai is erroneously placed on the existing charts.

The Flagstaff, situated about the middle of the north extremity of the Island, is in 23° 21' 45" south latitude, and in 151° 55' 44" longitude west of Paris. (149° 35' 23" west from Greenwich.)

The variation is 9° 38' 10" N.E.

The anchorage, situated at the termination of the reef, at about 2500 metres, [2700 yards,] from the Flagstaff, bearing S. 4 E. true, is very bad, for the bottom being of coral, vessels are liable to drive or lose their anchors, and there is no shelter whatever; smaller vessels can however be conveniently anchored near the shore. As there are pilots, it would not be prudent to dispense with them.

These remarks being of importance to Navigators, I have the honor without delay to bring them under your notice, and to inform you, that I have also caused them to be made known in France, and to all our Consuls in these seas.

Papeete, (Tahiti,) 12th February, 1851.

The hydrographic labours performed, in pursuance of my orders, in October, 1850, by M. Delamarche and by Captain Gizolme, have, amongst other results led to the detection of very considerable inaccuracies in the positions which the existing Charts give to the Islands of the Pomotou Group Mani, Vahé, Rurick and Vliégen. As these Islands are situated in a track much frequented by Vessels coming to Tahiti from the northward, and are not to be discerned until one is (so to speak) actually upon them, I consider that it will be useful to make known to Navigators their exact position.

I have the honor to communicate to you the subjoined table relative to them.

## CONTRACT FOR GRANITE OR BLUE STONE FROM PORT PHILLIP.

TENDERS will be received at this Office, until 12 o'clock of Tuesday, the 24th June next, from persons desirous of supplying the undermentioned Blocks of Granite from Port Phillip, for the public works o Cockatoo Island, viz.:—

Twenty-five Blocks of Granite, each 3 feet by 2 feet by 4 feet.

Twenty-five Blocks of Granite, each 2 feet by 2 feet by 4 feet.

Sixty Blocks of Granite, each 6 feet by 2 feet by 3

- 2. The Stone must be of the best quality procurable, free from flaw, shake, or crack, and will be subject to the approval of the Civil Engineer at Sydney, or such other person as may be appointed.
- 3. It is required with a rough quarry dressing, and must be capable of squaring only, to the above specified dimensions; the price will be adjusted at per cubic foot; but no surplus measurement in the Blocks will be computed.
- 4. The Blocks are to be delivered at the Wharf on Cockatoo Island, where assistance will be afforded in landing them.
- 5. Tenders must state the period to which the Stone will be delivered, and a specimen, which need not exceed half a cubic foot in size, must accompany the Tender.

For the supply and delivery of the Granite at Melbourne, ready for shipment.

For its shipment and freight from Melbourne to Cockatoo Island; or, the whole may be included in one Tender.

Separate Tenders will also be received for the supply of Blue Stone procurable in the neighbourhood of Melbourne, in the same quantities and dimensions, and under the same conditions, as the Granite is to be tendered for; but it must be understood, that in the event of an offer for either the Granits or Blue Stone being accepted, the supply of the other description will not be required.
