## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Governor-General of all Her Majesty's Australian Possessions, Vice-Admiral of the same, and Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS HER MAJESTY has been graciously pleased, by two several Commissions, under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, bearing date at Westminster, the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and fifty, to constitute and appoint me, Sir Charles Augustus Fitz Roy, Knight, to be Governor-General of all Her Majesty's Australian Possessions, including the Colony of Western Australia, and also to re-appoint me to be Governor of New South Wales, with the style of Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief: Now, therefore, I, the Governor-General and Governor-in-Chief aforesaid, do hereby proclaim and declare that I have this day taken the prescribed Oaths before His Honor Sir Alfred Stephen, Knight, the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the said Territory of New South Wales, and that I have accordingly assumed the said office of Governor-General, and re-assumed the said office of Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief.

And I do hereby further proclaim and declare, that Her Majesty has been pleased to nominate and appoint the undermentioned Officers to be Members of the Executive Council of the said Territory of New South Wales, that is to say:—

- The Senior Officer in Command of Her Majesty's Land Forces, for the time being;
- The Colonial Secretary of the said Territory, for the time being;
- The Attorney General of the said Territory, for the time being; and
- The Colonial Treasurer of the said Territory, for the time being.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Government House, Sydney, this twelfth day of June, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one, and in the fourteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ Roy, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, passed in the second year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, "*An Act for regulating the Police in the Towns of Parramatta, Windsor, Mailland, Bathurst, and other Towns respectively, and for removing and preventing nuisances and obstructions, and for the better alignment of Streets therein*," it was amongst other things enacted, that whenever the Governor or Acting Governor of the said Colony for the time being, should deem it expedient to extend the said Act to any other Towns in the said Colony, it should and might be lawful for the said Governor or Acting Governor for the time being, to declare the same by Proclamation: Now, therefore, I, the Governor aforesaid, in pursuance of the power and authority so vested in me, by the said recited Act, do by this my Proclamation, hereby direct that the provisions of the said Act, as amended by a certain other Act of the said Governor and Council, passed in the eleventh year of Her said Majesty's Reign, intituled, "*An Act to amend an Act for regulating the Police in the Towns of Parramatta, Windsor, Mailland, Bathurst and other Towns respectively, and for removing and preventing nuisances and obstructions, and for the better alignment of Streets therein*," be extended to the Town of Kilmore, in the County of Dalhousie, and District of Port Phillip, and that the following shall be deemed to be the boundaries of the said Town for the purposes of the said first recited Act, that is to say:—commencing at the south boundary line of Rutledge's special survey at a chain of ponds, 5 chains 50 links from the eastern boundary of the Sydney Road, and bounded on the east by that chain of ponds about 5 chains, and a line bearing north 45 chains; on the north by a line bearing west 46 chains; on the west by a line bearing south 53 chains 75 links; and on the south by a line bearing east 47 chains 25 links to the commencing point;—Also, that portion commencing at the south-east corner of Rutledge's special survey, and bounded on the north by a line bearing west 41 chains 50 links; on the west by a line bearing south 80 chains; on the south by a line bearing east 41 chains 50 links; and on the east by a line bearing north 80 chains.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Government House, Sydney, this tenth day of June, in the Year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one, and in the fourteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

## CROWN LANDS BEYOND THE SETTLED LANDS.

(RENEWAL OF PASTURAGE LICENSES.)

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR, with the advice of the Executive Council, directs it to be notified for general information, that the preliminary proceedings necessary for the issue of leases for runs beyond the Settled Districts, being as yet for the

most part incomplete, existing Licenses for the occupation of Crown Lands so situated, will be renewed on the 1st July next, on the same terms as licenses have been granted for the now current year, subject of course to the adjustment of the license fee, according to the quantity of stock returned by the Commissioner as pastured on every such run.

2. The Licenses must be taken out on or before the 30th day of September next.

3. If, within the year commencing on 1st July next, the Government shall be in a position to grant leases of runs under Her Majesty's Order in Council, any licensee under this notice who may obtain a lease, will receive credit in the payment of his first year's rent, for so much of the amount paid for his license, as may be proportionate to the unexpired part of the term for which the license was granted.

4. It will be understood that the licenses to be renewed under this notice, are those for pastoral runs beyond the Settled Districts only. Leases of lands held for other than pastoral purposes, and of runs or parts of runs brought within the Settled Districts by the operation of Her Majesty's Order in Council of 9th March, 1847, are provided for by the Notice issued from this Office, on the 11th February last.

## QUIT RENTS.

UNDER the authority of the Right Honorable the Secretary of State, and with the advice of the Executive Council, His Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that on the expiration of the year ending on the 31st December next, all Quit Rents on Country Lands of higher annual amount than two shillings for each one hundred acres will be reduced to that uniform rate, provided that the holders of the lands shall have made the four annual payments, according to the rates fixed in their respective Grants, which will then have become due under the Regulation of the 9th of October 1846, and provided that the future Rents be punctually paid until the claim to them on the part of the Crown, shall have been extinguished by the completion of twenty annual payments, or by an equivalent payment in cash, according to the scale laid down in the said Regulation. It is to be understood, that parties having made the four annual payments at the present rate, in the manner above directed, will be entitled to redeem at the reduced rate of two shillings per one hundred acres, the further payments necessary to complete twenty years rent, according to the scale set forth in the notice above referred to.

2. It is further notified, that the Quit Rents on allotments in Country Towns will be reduced to one fourth of the rates fixed in the Deeds of Grant, but in all other respects the same principle is to be applied to them as is laid down in this notice respecting Country lands.

**CONTRACT FOR GRANITE OR BLUE STONE FROM PORT PHILLIP.**

**T**ENDERS will be received at this Office, until 12 o'clock of Tuesday, the 24th June next, from persons desirous of supplying the undermentioned Blocks of Granite from Port Phillip, for the public works on Cockatoo Island, viz.:—

Twenty-five Blocks of Granite, each 3 feet by 2 feet by 4 feet.

Twenty-five Blocks of Granite, each 2 feet by 2 feet by 4 feet.

Sixty Blocks of Granite, each 6 feet by 2 feet by 3 feet.

2. The Stone must be of the best quality procurable, free from flaw, shake, or crack, and will be subject to the approval of the Civil Engineer at Sydney, or such other person as may be appointed.

3. It is required with a rough quarry dressing, and must be capable of squaring only, to the above specified dimensions; the price will be adjusted at per cubic foot; but no surplus measurement in the Blocks will be computed.

4. The Blocks are to be delivered at the Wharf on Cockatoo Island, where assistance will be afforded in landing them.

5. Tenders must state the period to which the Stone will be delivered, and a specimen, which need not exceed half a cubic foot in size, must accompany the Tender.

6. Separate Tenders will be received—  
For the supply and delivery of the Granite at Melbourne, ready for shipment.

For its shipment and freight from Melbourne to Cockatoo Island; or, the whole may be included in one Tender.
