POLICE DISTRICTS.

THREE new Police Districts having been recently established, namely, Gayndah, Maryborough, and Surat, and certain amendments having become necessary in the boundaries of the other Police Districts hereinafter described, His Excellency the GOVERNOR-GENERAL is pleased to direct the publication of the following boundaries of those Districts respectively, which, in the case of the Districts so altered, will supersede the boundaries assigned to them in the Notice of 17th January, 1850.

8. BRISBANE, (*amended*.) In the Pastoral District of Moreton, and embracing parts of the counties of Canning, Stanley, and Ward; bounded on the north by the Glass House Range from the Glass House Mountain to the sea; on the east by the sea to Point Danger, including all the islands between that point and the point where the Glass House Range meets the sea, thence on the south by the range dividing the waters of the Logan and other rivers from those of the Clarence, Richmond, and Tweed Rivers; on the west by the range dividing the waters of the Logan River from those of the Teviot Brook, and the range dividing the waters of that brook and Crow's Creek, to a point in the latter due south of Kent's Peak, thence by a line to Kent's Peak, and by the Mount Flinders Range to Mount Gochman, thence by a line north-easterly to the head of Woogaroo Creek, and by that creek to its confluence with the River Brisbane, thence by a spur of D'Aguillar's Range, and by that range to the Glass House Mountain aforesaid.

15. DRAYTON, (*amended*.) in the Pastoral District of Darling Downs; bounded on the north-west and west by Tanning or Sandy Creek, and by its source in the Great Dividing Range, and by Dogwood Creek to the Balonne; and thence by a line south by compass to the River Barwon, (known also as the Karaula or Macintyre); on the south by that river and the River Severn to the confluence of the Macintyre Brook with the latter river, and thence by the range dividing the waters of the River Severn from those of the Macintyre Brook, the range dividing the waters of the Condamine River from those of the Macintyre Brook, and the range forming the western watershed of Canal Creek to the confluence of that creek with the Condamine River, thence by that river upwards to the range dividing the waters of King's or Forbes' Creek from those of Dalrymple's Creek, and by that range to the Great Dividing Range; and on the east and north-east by the Great Dividing Range to the source of Tanning Creek aforesaid.

18. (B.) GAYNDAH, (*new*.) comprising the Pastoral District of Burnett; bounded on the south by the range dividing the waters of the Rivers Brisbane and Burnett from "Jemma" to the Great Dividing Range, and separating this district from the Pastoral District of Moreton; on the west by the Great Dividing Range to the source of Palm Tree Creek, separating this district in part from the Pastoral District of Darling Downs; on the north by Palm Tree Creek to the River Dawson, by that river to a point due west by compass from the northernmost source of the River Burnett, by a line to that source, and by the range forming the northern watershed of the River Burnett to a point due north by compass from the point where the range forming the western watershed of the Seven Hills or Degilba Creek meets the River Burnett; and on the east by a line to that point, by the last-mentioned range, and by the range dividing the waters of the River Burnett from those falling to Wide Bay and the sea coast south thereof, and separating this district from the Police District of Maryborough.

28. (B.) MARYBOROUGH, (*new*.) comprising the Pastoral District of Wide Bay; bounded on the south by the Glass House Range from the sea coast to Jemma, separating this district from the Pastoral District of Moreton; on the west by the range dividing the waters of the Burnett from those falling to Wide Bay and the sea coast south thereof, and the range forming the western watershed of the Seven Hills or Degilba Creek to the River Burnett, and thence by a line bearing north by compass to the range forming the northern watershed of the River Burnett, separating this district from that of Gayndah; on the north by the last-mentioned range to the sea; and on the east by the sea.

45. (B.) SURAT, (*new*.) comprising the pastoral district of Maranoa; bounded on the south by the surveyed and marked track from the River Barwan to Johnston's station called Cumingundi, on the River Mooni; on the west, thence by that river upwards to where the said marked track leaves the Mooni; thence by that track to St. George's Bridge on the River Balonne; thence by the Balonne to the confluence of the River Maranoa, and by the Maranoa to the confluence of the River Amby; on the north by the River Amby to its source in Mount Bindango; thence by a line across the Fitz Roy Downs to Mount Beagle; thence by a line across the same downs to the highest summit of the Grafton Range; and thence by a line east, by compass, to Tanning

Creek; on the east by Tanning and Dogwood Creeks to the Balonne; and thence by a line south, by compass, to the River Barwan, (known also as the Karaula or Macintyre); and again on the south by that river downwards to the point where the surveyed track aforesaid crosses it at a tree marked No. 87.

52. **WARIALDA**, (*amended*), in the pastoral districts of Gwydir and Darling Downs; bounded on the north by the range dividing the waters of the River Severn from those of Macintyre Brook to the confluence of those streams; and by the Rivers Severn and Barwan (also there known as the Karaula or Macintyre), downwards to the surveyed and marked track from the Balonne, and by that track to the River Mooni at Johnston's station, called Cunninghami; thence on the west by the River Mooni downwards to its confluence with the River Barwan, and by the Barwan to Pockataroo; on the south by the range dividing the waters of the River Gwydir from those of the River Namoi or Peel to the boundary of the New England District; and on the east by that boundary, being the western extreme of the table land to the north-west corner of that district; and thence by a line bearing north to the range dividing the waters of the Macintyre Brook from those of the Severn River aforesaid.

53. **WARWICK**, (*amended*) in the pastoral district of Darling Downs; bounded on the north by the range dividing the waters of King's or Forbes' Creek from those of Dalrymple's Creek to the Condamine River, and by that river downwards to the confluence of Canal Creek; on the west by the range forming the western watershed of that creek and the range dividing the waters of the Condamine River from those of the Macintyre Brook to the range dividing the waters of that brook from those of the Severn River; on the south by the last mentioned ranges and a line bearing south-east to the point where the Darling Downs Road crosses Quart-Pot Creek; and thence by a line bearing east to the great dividing range; and on the east by the great dividing range to the range dividing the waters of King's and Dalrymple's Creeks aforesaid.

54. **WEE WAA**, (*amended*) partly in the pastoral district of Liverpool Plains; bounded on the north by the range dividing the waters of the Namoi and Gwyder Rivers to Pockataroo, thence on the east by the Barwon River upwards to the confluence of the Mooni, by the Mooni River upwards to where the surveyed and marked track from the Balonne meets that river by that track to St. George's Bridge on the Balonne; and thence by that river upwards to the point where the 28 parallel of south latitude meets it; again on the north by that parallel westerly to the River Warrego; on the west by that river downwards to the 30 parallel of latitude; on the south by that parallel easterly to the Darling or Barwan River; and by that river upwards to the point where the range dividing the waters of the Namoi and Castlereagh Rivers meet it, and thence by that range and the Warrabangle Range; and on the east from the last mentioned range by a line bearing north, and passing through Mr. C. Doyle's station, Namoboy, to the range dividing the waters of the Namoi and Gwyder Rivers aforesaid.

FERRY AT PORT MACQUARIE.

TWENTY POUNDS REWARD OR A CONDITIONAL PARDON.

CONTRACT FOR GRANITE OR BLUE
STONE FROM PORT PHILLIP.

TENDERS will be received at this Office, until 12 o'clock of Tuesday, the 24th June next, from persons desirous of supplying the undermentioned Blocks of Granite from Port Phillip, for the public works on Cockatoo Island, viz.:—

Twenty-five Blocks of Granite, each 3 feet by 2 feet by 4 feet.

Twenty-five Blocks of Granite, each 2 feet by 2 feet by 4 feet.

Sixty Blocks of Granite, each 6 feet by 2 feet by 3 feet.

2. The Stone must be of the best quality procurable, free from flaw, shake, or crack, and will be subject to the approval of the Civil Engineer at Sydney, or such other person as may be appointed.

3. It is required with a rough quarry dressing, and must be capable of squaring only, to the above specified dimensions; the price will be adjusted at per cubic foot; but no surplus measurement in the Blocks will be computed.

4. The Blocks are to be delivered at the Wharf on Cockatoo Island, where assistance will be afforded in landing them.

5. Tenders must state the period to which the Stone will be delivered, and a specimen, which need not exceed half a cubic foot in size, must accompany the Tender.

6. Separate Tenders will be received—

For the supply and delivery of the Granite at Melbourne, ready for shipment.

For its shipment and freight from Melbourne to Cockatoo Island; or, the whole may be included in one Tender.

7. Further particulars respecting the Contract may be obtained on application to the Civil Engineer, Sydney.

8. Separate Tenders will also be received for the supply of Blue Stone procurable in the neighbourhood of Melbourne, in the same quantities and dimensions, and under the same conditions, as the Granite is to be tendered for; but it must be understood, that in the event of an offer for either the Granite or Blue Stone being accepted, the supply of the other description will not be required.

9. At the foot of every Tender there must be a memorandum signed by the party tendering and two responsible persons as sureties, agreeing to be responsible for the due performance of the Contract, in the event of the Tender being accepted, and undertaking, in that event, that they will severally execute and deliver at the Office of the Civil Crown Solicitor, within seven days from the date of the usual notification of acceptance of such Tender, a Bond to Her Majesty in the penal sum of £300 for securing such performance, otherwise the Tender will not be taken into consideration.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, made and passed in the present year of the reign of Her Most Gracious Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, "An Act for the regulation of the "Police Force in New South Wales," and numbered "38," it was amongst other things enacted, "That all Police Magistrates, Magistrates, Superintendents of Police, or other persons having the management or control of the Constabulary, or any portion of the Constabulary, in this Colony, and also all Inspectors of Police, Chief Constables, Constables, and other Peace officers whosoever, appointed, and acting at the time of the passing of this Act, shall, and they are hereby respectively authorised and required, notwithstanding the passing of this Act, to continue to discharge and execute their several duties and offices, with the like powers, privileges, and authorities, and subject to the like obligations, restrictions, liabilities, directions, and regulations as heretofore, until it shall be notified by a Notice to be inserted in the New South Wales Government Gazette, by the Inspector General to be appointed under this Act, that the Constabulary Force for the said Colony, or for any portion or district thereof, named in such Notice, is fully organized according to the provisions of this Act; and upon such notification, the appointment and offices of all such Police Magistrates, Magistrates, Superintendents of Police, and other persons as aforesaid, appointed or acting within any such District, so far as the same shall relate to the supervision or control of the Constabulary Force, or any portion thereof, or be otherwise incompatible with the provisions of this Act, or any regulation made in pursuance thereof; and the appointments and offices of all Inspectors of Police, Chief Constables, Constables, or other Peace officers whomsoever, appointed, or acting within any such district, shall become and be void, and they shall severally discontinue acting under any Act, usage, or regulation now in force; and all houses and out-houses, appurtenances, horses, arms, accoutrements, saddles, bridles, clothing, books, papers, and appointments, articles, and things whatever, rented, held, or provided for the use or accommodation of the present Police Force, shall be applied, transferred and employed, and converted to the use and accommodation of the Constabulary Force so organized; and the right, property, and interest therein shall, immediately upon such notification, vest in the Inspector-General for the time being, appointed under this Act."

Now, I, William Spain, the Inspector-General of Police throughout the Colony of New South Wales, duly appointed under the before in part recited Act of Council, in pursuance of the power and authority so vested in me by the said Act, do hereby give notice that the Constabulary Force for the portion or district of the said Colony hereinafter described, that is to say:—

The City of Sydney and suburbs; bounded on the north by Middle Harbour and Cowan Creek, being the northern boundaries of the parishes of Willoughby and Gordon; on the west by the western boundary of the parish of Gordon, and by Lane Cove to the Parramatta River, by that river upwards, and by the western boundaries of the parishes of Concord and St. George; on the south by George's River and the waters of Botany Bay; and on the east by the sea, including all the islands in Port Jackson and the Parramatta River, is fully organised according to the provisions of the said recited Act.

To the Most Reverend Father in God, John Bird,
by divine providence Archbishop of Canterbury,
Primate of all England and Metropolitan.

WHEREAS we, William Grant, by divine permission, Bishop of Sydney, and Metropolitan of the province of Australasia, are by the law and usage of the Church Catholic, and of the United Church of England and Ireland in particular, entitled by virtue of our Metropolitan authority aforesaid, to consecrate Bishops within our said province, with concurrence of the suffragan or provincial Bishops thereof; and whereas we did lately receive an application in writing, under the hand of the Reverend Thomas Jackson, Doctor in Divinity, now or heretofore Prebendary of the Cathedral Church of Saint Paul, in the Diocese of London, within the province and Jurisdiction of Canterbury, whereby he, the said Reverend Thomas Jackson, did represent unto us, that with the advice and agreement of Your Grace, and also of the Right Reverend Charles James, Bishop of London, he, Thomas Jackson aforesaid, had been designated to be Bishop of a Bishop's See within the now existing Diocese of New Zealand, to be erected and called the Bishoprick of Lyttelton, by virtue of the authority of Her Majesty, to be signified by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom, with the consent of the Right Reverend George Augustus, Bishop of New Zealand, first obtained and signified thereto; and whereas the said Bishop of New Zealand has, by writing under his hand, bearing date the twenty-first day of February, in the present year, signified to us his approval of the erection of the said See of Lyttelton, and has, on behalf of himself and his successors, freely consented that all that portion of the Diocese of New Zealand lying to the south of the 43rd parallel of south latitude, and including the Islands called and known by the names of Chatham, Auckland, and Stewart's Islands, shall be wholly separated from the said Diocese of New Zealand, for the purpose of constituting the Diocese to be annexed to the See of Lyttelton, and placed under the jurisdiction of the Bishops thereof, subject nevertheless to the

Bishop of the Metropolitan See of Sydney and his successors; and whereas the aforesaid Reverend Thomas Jackson, Bishop Designate of Lyttelton, has, by writing under his hand, dated on the third day of March in the present year, represented unto us, that for divers weighty and sufficient causes him thereunto moving, he is desirous that the form and order of his consecration to the office of Bishop of Lyttelton should be solemnized in the Metropolitan and Cathedral Church at Canterbury, and therefore prays, that we, on his behalf, will dispense with, surrender, and forego our right in that respect: We, therefore, the aforesaid Bishop of Sydney, Metropolitan of Australasia, do hereby dutifully signify to Your Grace, our agreement in the said application, and do request that Your Grace, under the guidance of Holy Spirit, will proceed to consecrate the said Reverend Thomas Jackson, Doctor in Divinity, to be a Bishop of the Church of Christ, in this our Province, he having been first examined carefully as to his fitness for the said office of a Bishop, whereunto he is called, and as to his ability to execute the same to the edifying of the Church, and to the honor, praise, and glory of God.

And we do hereby promise and engage that, if he, the said Right Reverend Thomas Jackson, shall produce to ourselves or our successors, a declaration under the hand of Your Grace, setting forth that he has been duly ordained and consecrated, according to the form and order of the Church of England, to be Bishop of Lyttelton aforesaid, we will receive and acknowledge him, the said Right Reverend Thomas Jackson, as Bishop of the said See, and him will as freely and fully, and with as entire brotherly affection, consult, commune, and confer with, on all matters touching our mutual pastoral charges, and the welfare of the flock of God committed to us, as if he, the said Right Reverend Thomas Jackson, had been ordained and consecrated by us, and our Bishops Suffragan, within this our Metropolitan See.

In testimony whereof we have hereunto set our hand, and the seal of our said Diocese, this thirty-first day of May, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one, and of our translation the fourth.
