WIDE BAY.

No. 2.

Brierley Abram and Mactaggart John D.
Name of Run—Upper Kilkivan.
Estimated Area—15,000 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—4,000 Sheep.

From Ballaro Hut by the Kilkivan boundary line west 2 miles to a tree marked M, from thence south 6 miles to the head of the Kilkivan Creek, from thence east across the head of Kilkivan Creek 2 miles; from thence north 5 miles to a tree marked A; and from thence 2 miles by the Ballaro boundary line to Bitally Creek.

No. 3.

Corfield Henry Cox.
Name of Run—Jubar.
Estimated Area—16,000 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—6,000 Sheep.

A block of land situate between the junctions of Eel Creek and Dry Creek with Munna Creek; bounded therefore on the north-west and east by those creeks—a line to be drawn from a gum tree situated on the south bank of Eel Creek about 5 miles above the crossing place of the road to Degilba, marked on its south-west side to Dry Creek, to include the quantity.



No. 4.

Gibbon James.

Name of Run—Doongul.

Estimated Area—12,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—640 Cattle, or 4,000 Sheep.

From the place where the Gayndah and Maryborough Road crosses the Doongul Creek, about 2 miles down the creek, or north-easterly to a large gum tree on the bank marked G, thence north in continuation through a spotted gum tree on the ridge also marked G, 5 miles, thence west 5 miles; thence south to the creek; thence by the creek to the starting point—the creek being the southern boundary of the run.

No. 5.

Ross John.

Name of Run—Woonga.

Estimated Area—16,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—4,000 Sheep.

Undulating ridges, with silver-leaved ironbark and apple tree; from the lagoons north north-west to a tree marked JR conjoined; from thence south 4 miles to a tree marked R; from thence east 6 miles to a point on the River Mary; from thence north 4 miles by the River Mary to a tree marked J; and from thence west 6 miles to the starting point (a tree marked JR conjoined.)

No. 6.

Tooth W. B. & Co.

Name of Run—Orange Tree.

Estimated Area—16,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—600 Cattle.

Commencing at a large gum tree marked (very high up) T on north face, on the right bank of the main Wijji Wijji Creek, about a mile above the junction of two branch creeks; thence by a line east 3 miles; thence by a line parallel with the general course of the creek upwards, or southerly, 8 miles; thence west to the creek; thence by the creek down to the starting point.

No. 7.

Tooth W. B. & Co.

Name of Run—Basin of Wijji Widgee.

Estimated Area—15,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—600 Cattle.

Commencing at a large gum tree, marked T on the west face on the left bank of the main Widgee Creek, about half a mile below the junction of two branch creeks, and near where the scrub first joins the creek, below the gap leading from Woonga; thence west 3 miles; thence in a line parallel with the general course of the creek upwards 8 miles; thence east to the creek, then down by the creek to the starting point.

Uhr Edmund B.

Name of Run—Mariana.

Estimated Area—16,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—600 Cattle.

From the old Burnett Road, where it crosses the Twelve Mile Creek, to the first fork of that creek above; thence about 3 miles west to a tea tree creek, a tree there marked U; thence by a line south in continuation from a tree marked V, about 5 miles to a deep myrtle creek, on the bank of which is a large gum tree marked U, thence

by the creek to the River Mary, thence down to the mouth of the Twelve Mile Creek, thence to the starting point.

Archer Charles.

Name of Run—Geumga.

Estimated Area—20,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—4,000 Sheep.

This run is a narrow strip of country on the River Burnett, backed by broken and unavailable ranges, coming, in some places, down to the river; on the south it is bounded by a small creek, which forms the northern boundary of Malmoe, the run of Mr. William Archer; on the east by the broken country already referred to; on the north by a chain of waterholes, forming the south boundary of Dalingal, Mr. H. McKay's run; and on the west by the Burnett, which separates this run from Eidswoold and Tellemark, the runs of Mr. Thomas Archer.

No. 32.

Name of Run—Malmoe.

Estimated Area—20,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—4,000 Sheep.

Bounded on the south by a line (3) three miles east, commencing at the White Rock, being part of the northern boundary of the Mundouran Run; on the east by broken and scrubby country, extending to Boundary Creek; on the north by that creek; and on the west by the Burnett River to the White Rock.

No. 33.

Archer William.

Name of Run—Mundowran.

Estimated Area—16,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—4,000 Sheep.

Bounded on the east by a line north 4 miles from the River Burnett, commencing at Boundary Mountain; on the north by a line west about 8 miles, parallel with the River Burnett until it intersects that river at the White Rock, above the great bend; on the west and south by the River Burnett to the Boundary Mountain.

No. 34.

Freill Philip.

Name of Run—Burradowan, No. 1.

Estimated Area—24,640 acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—4,000 Sheep.

A block of land on the River Boyne, one of the heads of the Burnett River; bounded on the north by a line at right angles with the river, commencing at a tree marked RG, being the dividing boundary of Lawson and Alexander's station; on the south by a tree marked PF, about 9 miles above on the river; on the west by the River Boyne; and on the east by the western boundary of Burradowan, No. 2.

No. 35.

Freill Philip.

Name of Run—Burradowan, No. 2.

Estimated Area—25,760 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—4,000 Sheep.

A block of land on the River Boyne, bounded on the north by a line from Shelley Topped Range, and continued to the dividing range between Boyne and Stuart Rivers, distant about 2½ miles below the road to Cushnie; on the south by a line running from near Dungore Mountain, on

the dividing range between the Boyne and Stuart, due west about 6 miles; on the west by the eastern boundary of Burrandowan No. 1; and on the east by the dividing range between Boyne and Stuart.

No. 36.

Freill Philip.

Name of Run—Burrandowan, No. 3.

Estimated Area—15,840 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—4,000 Sheep.

A block of land on the River Boyne; bounded on the north by a line commencing from the river near a tree marked RG, the same mentioned in block No. 1, and continuing due west about 5 miles through Waterloo Scrub, being the boundary between Lawson and Alexander's stations; on the south by a line commencing from the river, distant from tree marked RG, about $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles above the river, running due west 6 miles; on the west by the main dividing range between eastern and western waters; and on the east by the River Boyne.

No. 37.

Freill Philip.

Name of Run—Burrandowan, No. 4.

Estimated Area—17,920 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—4,000 Sheep.

A block of land on the River Boyne; bounded on the north by a line distant from tree marked RG, about $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles above the river, commencing from the river and running due west about 6 miles; on the south by a line commencing from the river parallel with the north boundary, distant from it about 4 miles; on the west by the main range dividing the eastern and western waters; and on the east by the River Boyne.

No. 38.

Freill Philip.

Name of Run—Burrandowan, No. 5.

Estimated Area—22,400 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—4,000 Sheep.

A block of land on the River Boyne; bounded on the north by the south boundary of block No. 4; on the south by a line commencing from the river, parallel with the northern boundary, distant therefrom about $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles; on the west by the dividing range between the eastern and western waters; and on the east by the River Boyne.

No. 39.

Freill Philip.

Name of Run—Burrandowan, No. 6.

Estimated Area—23,520 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—4,000 Sheep.

A block of land on the River Boyne; bounded on the north by the southern boundary of blocks Nos. 1 and 2; on the south by a line commencing from the dividing range between Boyne and Stuart, distant from north boundary and parallel to it about 4 miles; on the west by the River Boyne; and on the east by the dividing range between the Boyne and Stuart.

No. 40.

Freill Philip.

Name of Run—Burrandowan, No. 7.

Estimated Area—25,200 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—4,000 Sheep.

A block of land on the River Boyne; bounded on the north by the south boundary of block No. 6; on the south by Craig's Range or dividing range between Darling Downs and Burnett Districts; on the west by the heads of the Boyne; and on the east by the dividing range between the Boyne and Stuart.

No. 41.

Freill Philip.

Name of Run—Burrandowan No. 8.

Estimated Area—29,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—4,000 Sheep.

A block of land on the River Boyne; bounded on the north by the south boundary of block No. 5; on the south by Craig's Range; on the west, dividing range between Darling Downs and Burnett District; and on the east by the River Boyne.

No. 42.

Humphreys William and Herbert Henry, (now William Humphreys.)

Name of Run—Ginoondam.

Estimated Area—16,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—4,000 Sheep.

Ten miles by four; on the south bank of the Burnett River; commencing at the boundary of the Crown Land Commissioner's reserve.

N. B.—This run has been transferred, with the sanction of the Government, to William Humphreys.

No. 43.

Jones Richard.

Name of Run—Baramba.

Estimated Area—25 Square Miles.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—500 Cattle or 4,000 Sheep.

Commencing at the junction of Munday Womba Creek with Baramba Creek, then westerly with the Baramba, the northern boundary, to another creek running into the Baramba, following this creek south for the western boundary, and bounded on the east by Munday Womba Creek and the Brisbane ranges; on the south by a line running east and west from Munday Womba Creek to Baramba Creek, to include the estimated quantity of land.

No. 44.

Jones Richard.

Name of Run—North Baramba.

Estimated Area—25 Square Miles.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—500 Cattle, or 4,000 Sheep.

Commencing 3 miles east of the junction of Munday Womba Creek with the Baramba Creek; from thence 10 miles to the westward on the latter creek, which is the southern boundary; and on the north by ranges and dense scrubs, names not known.

No. 45.

Jones Richard.

Name of Run—East Baramba.

Estimated Area—25 Square Miles.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—500 Cattle, or 4,000 Sheep.

Commencing at the junction of Munday Womba Creek with the Baramba Creek, then due east along the latter creek 8 miles, being the northern boundary, then a line south to the Brisbane ranges; and on the south and west by a portion of those ranges, and from them along the Munday Womba Creek to the junction before named.

No. 46.

Jones Richard.

Name of Run—Mundure.

Estimated Area—18,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—500 Cattle, or 4,000 Sheep.

Bounded on the north by Baramba Creek; on the west by a line running south from that creek,

commencing 1 mile east of the head station; and on the east by a line south, commencing at the creek, about 2 miles east of a sheep station; and on the south by a line east and west, to include the quantity of land required.

No. 47.

Jones Richard.

Name of Run—Mundure North.

Estimated Area—18,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—500 Cattle, or 4,000 Sheep.

Bounded on the south by Baramba Creek; on the west by a scrub meeting that creek, about 2 miles west of the station, and on the opposite side of the creek; on the north by that scrub; and on the east by a scrub, meeting the said creek about 2 or 3 miles east of a sheep station on the south side of the creek.

No. 48.

Mackay Hugh, (now James C. Mackay.)

Name of Run—The Island.

Estimated Area—20,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—640 Cattle.

Bounded on the south by the boundary line of Dalginal station; north by the broken ranges of the Burnett River; west by the Burnett River; east by broken ranges.

N. B.—This run has been transferred, with the sanction of the Government, to James Cruickshank Mackay.

No. 49.

Mackay Hugh, (now James C. Mackay.)

Name of Run—Three Moon Station.

Estimated Area—20,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—640 Cattle.

Bounded on the south by the dividing range between Thomas Archer and Hugh Mackay; on the east by Burnett River upwards to the confluence of Three Moon Creek; north by the Splinter Creek run; west by a broken range that comes into Three Moon Creek.

N. B.—This run has been transferred, with the sanction of the Government, to James Cruickshank Mackay.

No. 50.

Mackay Hugh, (now James C. Mackay.)

Name of Run—Dalginal.

Estimated Area—20,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—4,000 Sheep.

Bounded on the south by a chain of lagoons, running east; west by the Burnett River; north by the broken ranges that come into the river; east by broken ranges.

N. B.—This run has been transferred, with the sanction of the Government, to James Cruickshank Mackay.

No. 51.

Mackay Hugh, (now James C. Mackay.)

Name of Run—Broadwater.

Estimated Area—18,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—4,000 Sheep.

Bounded on the south-east by the boundary line on Three Moon Creek; south-west by broken ranges; north-west by a high sugar loaf mountain and where the ranges come close to the creek; north-east by broken ranges.

N. B.—This Run has been transferred with the sanction of the Government, to James Cruickshank Mackay.

No. 52.

Mackay Hugh.

Name of Run—Splinter Creek.

Estimated Area—18,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—640 Cattle.

Bounded on the south by Three Moon Creek; east by the Burnett River; north by the broken country on the head of the Burnett; west by a marked tree at Splinter Creek.

No. 53.

Oliver Wm. Elliot, (now R. B. and D. Barker.)

Name of Run—Coolabunia.

Estimated Area—16,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—640 Cattle.

Bounded on the north by a line running east and west at a marked tree, being the southern boundary of Booie Run; on the south by Nanango Run; on the east by a range dividing the Brisbane from the Burnett Waters; on the west by a scrub dividing the Stewart from the Baramba Waters. This run is watered by Baramba Creek and Lagoons.

N. B.—This Run has been transferred with the sanction of Government, to Messieurs R. B. and D. Barker.

No. 54.

Oliver Wm. Elliot, (now R. B. and D. Barker.)

Name of Run—Booie.

Estimated Area—16,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—640 Cattle.

Bounded on the north by Messrs. Ferriter and Uhr's Station Baramba; on the south by Coolabunia Run; on the east by a range dividing the Brisbane from the Burnett Waters; and on the west by a scrub dividing the Stewart from the Burnett Waters. This Run is watered by the Baramba Creek and Lagoons.

N. B.—This Run has been transferred with the sanction of the Government, to Messrs. R. B. and D. Barker.

No. 55.

Oliver Wm. Elliot, (now R. B. and D. Barker.)

Name of Run—Nanango.

Estimated Area—16,000 acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—640 head of Cattle.

Bounded on the north by a line running east and west at a marked tree, being the southern boundary of "Coolabunia" Run; on the south by the range dividing the Brisbane from the Burnett Waters, and partly by Mr. Borthwick's Run; on the east by the range dividing the Brisbane from the Burnett Waters; on the west by Mr. Borthwick's eastern boundary. This Run is watered by Baramba Creek and Lagoons.

N. B.—This Run has been transferred with the sanction of the Government, to Messieurs R. B. and D. Barker.

No. 56.

Reid James B.

Name of Run—Binjour.

Estimated Area—16,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—4,000 Sheep.

Bounded by the River Burnett from a marked tree on the north side, 2 miles above the confluence of Binjour Creek with the river to the point forming the upper boundary of Tanjour Run on the river, and including the Valley of Binjour Creek to a marked tree on the bank of the creek 7 miles from the river.

No. 57.

Reid James B., (now George Mocatta.)
Name of Run—Mt. Debateable.
Estimated Area—16,000 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—4,000 Sheep.

Mt. Debateable Run is bounded on the north by the River Burnett for 6 miles, commencing at the junction of Granite Creek with the River Burnett, and extending to Messrs. Humphrey and Herbert's marked tree on the same river; on the east by a line running south dividing it from the Government reserve; on the south by a dense scrub; and on the west by the Granite Creek which is the lower boundary of Mr. Bouverie's Run.

N. B.—This Run has been transferred with the sanction of Government, to George Mocatta.

No. 58.

Reid James B.
Name of Run—Jonday.
Estimated Area—16,000 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—4,000 Sheep.

Jonday includes the Valley of Binjour Creek, commencing at a tree 7 miles from the River Burnett forming the upper boundary of Binjour run, and extending upwards to a lagoon called Jonday.

No. 59.

Reid James B.
Name of Run—Tanjour.
Estimated Area—16,000 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—4,000 Sheep.

Bounded on the east by the River Burnett, commencing at a point where a ridge runs into the river, about a mile below the junction of Binjour Creek, and extending down the river to a mountain known as "Yeuda," (the upper boundary of Mr. Wilkins' Run,) and on the north, south, and west by a range of hills dividing the waters of Binjour Creek from those of the River Burnett.

No. 60.

Stephen P. S. F. (now C. C. Macdonald.)
Name of Run—Courka.
Estimated Area—25,000 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—640 Cattle.

This run is bounded on the north by a marked line running from George's Creek to Cadarga; on the south by the range dividing Courka from Charley's Creek; on the east by the range dividing Cadarga and Courka Creeks; and on the west by the range dividing Farquharson's or Johnson's Creek from Courka.

N. B.—This run has been transferred, with the sanction of Government, to C. C. Macdonald.

No. 61.

Stephen P. S. F. (now C. C. Macdonald.)
Name of Run—Cadarga.
Estimated Area—20,000 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—640 Cattle.

This run is bounded on the north by the range dividing Burnia and Cadarga Creeks; on the south by the range dividing Cadarga and Courka Creeks; on the east by the range dividing Lawson and Alexander's Creek from Cadarga; and on the west by the north branch of George's Creek.

N. B.—This run has been transferred, with the sanction of the Government, to C. C. Macdonald.

No. 62.

Strathdee William.
Name of Run—Derrarabungy.
Estimated Area—21,480 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—4,000 Sheep.

Bounded on the north side by the northern branch of the Dererabungy Creek; on the east by the Boyne River; on the south by the dividing

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ridge between the Dundara and Dererabungy Creeks; and on the west a line running north and south 8 miles from the Boyne, and parallel with it. Forest land, with scrub in patches.

No. 63.

Strathdee William.
Name of Run—Toondoonganamingy.
Estimated Area—22,040 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—4,000 Sheep.

Bounded on the north by a marked line running east and west; on the east by the dividing ridge between the Boyne and Toondoonganamingy; on the south by a marked line running east and west; and on the west by the broken country between the Brorinio and Toondoonganamingy Creeks. Very sandy and scrubby.

No. 64.

Strathdee William.
Name of Run—Cooranga.
Estimated Area—15,300 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—4,000 Sheep.

Bounded on the north and west by the Boyne River; on the south by the Cugubar Creek running east and west by Spring Creek.

No. 65.

Trevethan Adolphus.
Name of Run—Rawbell.
Estimated Area—20,000 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—4,000 Sheep.

Bounded on the east by the Coomingleh run; on the north by a line running west from its north-eastern point; on the south by a line running west 8 miles from its south-eastern point; and on the west by a line running north from its south to its north boundary line.

No. 66.

Trevethan Adolphus.
Name of Run—Dry Creek.
Estimated Area—20,000 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—4,000 Sheep.

Dry Creek is the north-west branch of the Great Sandy Creek, and this run is bounded on the west by Mount Fortitude Run; on the east by scrub and sandstone ranges; on the north by scrubby ranges; and on the south by the Rawbell Run. It is of the length of 8 miles by a breadth of 4 miles.

No. 67.

Trevethan Adolphus.
Name of Run—Coomingleh.
Estimated Area—20,480 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—4,000 Sheep.

From a tree marked T on the south side of a creek called Great Sandy Creek (the same being a western tributary to the River Burnett) to the junction of a small oak creek with it from the north; it is bounded on the east by a line running south 2 miles and north 2 miles from the tree beforenamed; on the north by a line running west 8 miles from the northerly termination of the eastern boundary; on the west by the small oak creek beforenamed to its junction, and from thence by a line running south 2 miles; and on the south by a line from the south point of the western to the same of the eastern boundary.

No. 68.

Trevethan Adolphus.
Name of Run—Mount Fortitude.
Estimated Area—20,000 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—4,000 Sheep.

Mount Fortitude commences at the termination of the Rawbell Run, continuing from thence up the creek, and is bounded on the west and north by the Dawson Ranges; on the east by the Dry Creek Run and the Rawbell Run; on the south by ranges dividing it from the watershed to other country, it is of the breadth of 5 miles by a length of six.

Walker John.

Name of Run—Greystonelee of Hawkwood.

Estimated Area—16,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—640 Cattle or 4,000 Sheep.

Commencing at a marked tree at the eastern boundary line of Hawkwood Run No. 2, (Halketburn) about 2½ miles north of the south-east corner of said run, and bounded on the west by that boundary line to the corner aforesaid; on the south by a line extending east 6 miles, partly over open and partly over scrubby and ridgy country to a marked tree opposite the junction of a creek called Cheltenham Creek with the Auburn River; on the east by a line extending north about 6 miles over hilly country to a marked tree; on the north by a line extending west about 2½ miles over open country to a marked tree on the right bank of Cheltenham Creek, then by a curved line round the scrub to the commencing point.

No. 70.

Walker John.

Name of Run—Hillhouse Ridge of Hawkwood.

Estimated Area—16,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—640 Cattle or 4,000 Sheep.

Commencing at the marked tree on the right bank of Cheltenham Creek mentioned in the description of Greystonelee Run, and bounded on the south by that boundary line 1 mile to a marked tree thereon; on the east by a line extending north over ridgy country about 6¼ miles to a marked tree; on the north by a line extending west over open country about 4 miles to a marked tree near a round scrubby ridge; on the west by a line extending south along the scrub about 4 miles, then southerly by the scrub to the point of commencement, which point of commencement is about 4 miles due north-east of the north-east corner of Hawkwood Run No. 2, (Halketburn.)

No. 71.

Wilkin Robert.

Name of Run—St. David's Fall.

Estimated Area—16,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—640 Cattle or 4,000 Sheep.

This run comprehends all the watercourses joining the Burnett on its left bank, between a point where a high range abuts on the river and another point where a continuation of the range separating St. David's (or Waterfall) and View Hill Creeks runs close to the river; it is bounded on the east by the river; on the north by the range dividing St. David's Creek from View Hill Creek and its continuation previously mentioned; on the west by the range separating St. David's Creek from other waters on that side; and on the south by the range separating St. David's Creek from Sunday Creek, and a continuation of it terminating at the above mentioned high range.

No. 72.

Wilkin Robert.

Name of Run—Viewhill.

Estimated Area—16,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—640 Cattle, or 4,000 Sheep.

This run comprehends all the watercourses joining the Burnett, between a point where a continuation of the range separating Viewhill (or Stony) and St. David's Creeks, runs close to the river, and where a range covered with scrub abuts on it. It is bounded on the east by the Burnett; on the north by the range separating Pinegully and Viewhill Creek from other waters; on the

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—6,000 Sheep.

Commencing on the Murray River, at the western boundary of the Tirlee run; and bounded south by the River Murray, about 9 miles; east by a line north 5 miles; north by a line west 9 miles parallel with the general course of the river; west by a line south 5 miles to the junction of a small creek with the Murray, above the Beniaratool Run; so as to include the eastern side of Lake Benanee.

No. 25.

Shepherd Isaac.

Name of Run—Back of Whoey Run.

Estimated Area—16,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—640 Cattle, or 4,000 Sheep.

Commencing 5 miles north of the Pipeclay Waterhole, that hole being the east point of Whoey run, on the Lachlan River, running north 4 miles; on the north by a line west $6\frac{1}{2}$ miles; on the west by a line south 4 miles to the back of A. Long's Station (Hyandra); and on the south by a line east to the starting point, viz., Isaac Shepherd's north corner of Whoey run.

No. 26.

West Joseph, (Tertius.)

Name of Run—Cumbingingi.

Estimated Area—16,000 acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—640 Cattle or 4,000 Sheep.

Commencing on the Lachlan River at the western boundary line of Mr. Bell's licensed station of Wealbah, and bounded south by the Lachlan River 5 miles west, by a line north 5 miles; north by a line east 5 miles; east by a line south 5 miles, to the commencing point in the river.
