ADJUSTED NEW RUNS.

IT is hereby notified, that Tenders having been received for the undermentioned New Runs of Crown Land, the boundaries of which required to be adjusted, so as to exclude lands already under lease or promise of lease, or applied for by other parties, sealed Tenders, in the prescribed printed form, will be received at this Office, until noon of Monday, the 6th day of October next, from the previous applicants, and from any other persons desirous to enter into competition with them, for the purchase of the lease of any one of the said Runs, according to the amended descriptions hereto annexed.

2. Every such Tender must state the term of years, (not exceeding fourteen if in an Unsettled District, or eight if in an intermediate District) for which it is proposed to take the Run; and whether in addition to the minimum rent required by Her Majesty's Order in Council, it is intended to offer any, and if any, what amount of *yearly* premium for the lease.

3. As the grazing capabilities of these Runs have not yet been determined, it will be necessary that each Tender contain an estimate of the number of sheep or cattle that the Run will carry.

4. Until the Runs have been regularly defined, and their grazing capabilities determined, the future lessees will be required to pay rent according to their own estimates as given in the Tenders; and in the event of the rent so paid proving to have been less than that determined by valuation, they will be required to make up the difference previously to the execution of the leases.

5. It is also to be distinctly understood, that the Government reserves to itself the right of excluding from the lease of any of these Runs, any land which it may be deemed proper to reserve for any of the purposes referred to in the 9th section of Chapter II. of Her Majesty's Order in Council, dated 9th March, 1847.

6. A separate Tender must be made for each separate Run.

WIDE BAY DISTRICT.

1.—A block of land called Brooyar, estimated to contain 16,000 acres.

Commencing at a large gum tree, marked on the north side Z, standing on the left bank of Wide Bay Creek, about a quarter of a mile above the crossing place from Woonga; thence north $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles; thence south-west by west 7 miles; thence south to the creek, and by the creek down to the starting point, Wide Bay Creek, being the southern boundary of the run.

2.—A block of land called Ger Ger or Running Creek, estimated to contain 16,000 acres.

Commencing at a large gum tree, on the right bank of Munna Creek, marked on the west side 6 with W over. The creek here takes a bend at nearly right angles from its previous course, and runs nearly east, the spot is about 2 miles below

the mouth of the Ger Ger or Running Creek; from the above tree 1 mile south; thence 5 miles west; thence north 5 miles; thence east to Munna Creek, and by the creek down to the starting point, Munna Creek being the eastern boundary as far as the first named tree.

3.—A block of land known as Calgon, or Marodian, estimated to contain about 16,000 acres.

Commencing at a large gum tree on the right bank of the Munna Creek, just below where it forms an island, and is joined by a small creek from the westward marked S on the north face, thence by a marked tree line 2 miles west, thence $5\frac{1}{2}$ miles south; thence east to Munna Creek, and by its bank upwards to the starting point, Munna Creek being the eastern boundary of the run.

4.—A block of land known as the Junction Station, estimated to contain 26 square miles.

To commence at a large gum tree marked Z on its north side, standing on the left bank of the Wide Bay Creek, about $\frac{1}{4}$ of a mile above the crossing place from Woonga; thence north about $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles to the road, where is a spotted gum tree marked T, and opposite to it another marked tree; thence north half west to Munna Creek; thence by the bank of the creek down to the River Mary, by the Mary up to the mouth of the Wide Bay Creek, and by the creek up to the starting point.

MARANOA DISTRICT.

5.—A block of land called Balle, estimated to contain 17,920 acres.

Seven miles of the Ballonne River, on the north side; commencing at the point where it receives the Dogwood Creek, and extending downwards to Mr. Bingham's boundary; on the west by this boundary; on the north by a line 7 miles in extent, running easterly, parallel with and 4 miles distant from the Ballonne River; and on the east by a line 4 miles in extent, striking the point of confluence of the Dogwood Creek with the Ballonne River at right angles.

6.—A block of land called Balle North, estimated area, 26,880 acres.

A square block of land extending 6 miles northerly from the northern boundary of the run called "Balle," that boundary forming the southern side of the square.

7.—A block of land called Balloonai, estimated area 16,000 acres.

Commencing at the junction of Dogwood Creek and Ballonne River, and extending 5 miles down the south bank, with a back run of 5 miles southerly therefrom.

8.—A block of land called Wal-Colly, estimated area 16,000 acres.

A square block of land extending southerly 5 miles from the southern boundary of Balloonai.

9.—A block of land called Balloonai West, estimated to contain 16,000 acres.

Five miles of the Ballonne River, bounded on the east by the run called Balloonai; on the west by a line at right angles with the river, 5 miles distant from the eastern boundary; on the north by the river; and on the south by a line 5 miles, extending from the eastern to the western boundary, running parallel with and 5 miles distant from the river.

10.—A block of land called Balloonai South, estimated to contain 16,000 acres.

A square block of land extending southerly 5 miles, and originating from the southern boundary of the run called Balloonai West.

11.—A block of land called Bungle, estimated area 11,200 acres.

On the west side of the Bungil Creek, commencing at a point 35 miles from the junction of the Bungil Creek with the Ballonne River, and extending up the Bungil Creek 5 miles on the west side, with a back run of $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles westerly.

12.—A block of land known as Trinidad, estimated area 11,200 acres.

Five miles frontage on Yalibone Creek, commencing at the termination of the run called Yalibone, and extending upwards; with back run extending $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles easterly.

LIVERPOOL PLAINS DISTRICT.

13.—A block of land known as Mopal Plains, estimated to contain about 15,360 acres.

Bounded on the west by the Brigalo Creek, 8 miles above a marked tree near the waterhole called Doono Waraldi; the northern boundary is a line running parallel with the general course of the River Namoi, say east and west, through a point on Brigalo Creek called Doono Warialdi, the eastern by a line running parallel to, and 3 miles from the western boundary; the southern by a line from east to west parallel to, and 8 miles distant from the northern boundary. This Run has no water back from Brigalo Creek.

BLIGH.

14.—A block of land known as Wamerawah, situate on the east bank of the Macquarie River, and estimated to contain 12,000 acres.

On the east side of the Macquarie River bounded by Mr. Parnell's Station; on the west by the Macquarie River; on the north by Mr. Parnell's Station; and on the south by a marked tree line extending 5 miles, joining Brewan Run and Grandool boundaries, without frontage to the Barwon River.

WELLINGTON DISTRICT.

15.—A block of land known as Mundagar, estimated to contain 16,000 acres.

Commencing at the east side of the Mara Creek at the lower boundary of the run called Lower Weeli East, held by Mr. James Kinghorne, and bounded by that creek downwards 5 miles; and on the other sides by east and west and north and south lines, to include the quantity, 25 square miles.

16.—A block of land known as Currumbar East, estimated to contain 16,000 acres.

Commencing on the east side of the Mara Creek at the lower boundary of the adjusted run Mundagar, and bounded by that creek downwards 5 miles; and on the other sides by east and west and north and south lines to include the quantity, 25 square miles.

17.—A block of land known as Currumbar West, estimated to contain 16,000 acres.

Commencing on the west side of the Mara Creek at the lower boundary of the Burrimal Run, and bounded by that creek downwards 5 miles; and on the other sides by east and west and north and south lines, to include the quantity.

MORUMBIDGEE DISTRICT.

18.—A block of land called Booroobanilly, estimated to contain 19,200 acres.

Situated on the Plains between the Billybong Creek and Murray River; commencing at the south-east terminus of the Coree Run, (H. Burchett's,) and running south for 10 miles; thence east 3 miles; thence north 10 miles; and thence west 3 miles to the starting point.

2. Every such Tender must state the term of years, (not exceeding fourteen, if in an Unsettled District, or eight if in an Intermediate District,) for which it is proposed to take the Run; and whether, in addition to the minimum rent required by Her Majesty's Order in Council, it is intended to offer any, and if any, what amount of yearly premium for the Lease.

MORETON DISTRICT.

1.—The Run known as Head of Cressbrook Creek, estimated to contain 16,000 acres.

Bounded on the north by ranges, dividing the waters falling into Cressbrook from waters falling into Andurrumba Creek; on the south by a marked tree line; on the north-east by the boundary of the run now occupied by Messrs. McConnel; on the south-west by a marked tree line, denoting the boundary between it and the run known as Crow's Nest.

LIVERPOOL PLAINS DISTRICT.

2.—A block of land on the Narran River, estimated to contain 16,000 acres, and known as Ballanbillian.

Bounded on the south by the Narran River, commencing at Forrester's Hut, as laid down by Mr. Assistant Surveyor Gorman, and extending downwards 5 miles by measurement; thence on the west by a line running north 5 miles; thence on the north by a line running east 5 miles; thence on the east by a line running south 5 miles to the point first mentioned.

3.—A block of land known as Imbegar, estimated to contain 16,000 acres.

Commencing from a marked tree on the Narran at the western end of a waterhole called Imbegar, and bounded on the west by a line south 5 miles; thence on the south by a line east 5 miles; thence on the east by a line north 5 miles to a marked tree on the Narran; on the north by the Narran.

4.—A block of land known as Imbegar North, estimated to contain 16,000 acres.

Commencing from a marked tree on the north bank of the Narran at the western end of a water hole called Imbegar, and bounded on the west by a line north 5 miles; thence on the north by a line east 5 miles; thence on the east by a line south 5 miles to a marked tree on the Narran; on the south by the Narran.

BLIGH DISTRICT.

5.—A block of land known as Mungabumbone, estimated to contain 16,000 acres.

Bounded by the Merry Merry; 5 miles frontage on the south-west side, that is $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles south of the old hut, and $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles north of the old hut, 5 miles bearing east of the lower corner pin, then 5 miles south to the intended corner pin, then 5 miles west to the Merry Merry Creek to include the quantity. The land is scrubby, at the same time it is pretty well grassed in many places, part of an old hut is standing on the land.

6.—A block of land known as Wingenbar, estimated to contain 16,000 acres.

Situated on the Merry Merry Creek, in the vicinity of the Castlereagh River, commencing at a large waterhole called Wingenbar, and extending up the creek on the right hand or (south-west) bank for the space of 5 miles, by a depth of 5 miles, and being about 12 miles below Tailby's Sheep Station on the same creek.

7.—A block of land known as Ballagabar, estimated to contain 16,000 acres.

Bounded on the east by Bimble, Reardon's Run; on the south by Mr. Walker's Run and boundary of his station called Coonamble; on the west by Granger's marked tree line of the run called Toloon; on the north by the marked tree line of the Bundy Run, Mr. N. S. Lawson's.

8.—A block of land known as Woorobomi, estimated to contain 15,000 acres.

Commencing at the lower or western boundary of the run called Walagangala, on Mitchell's Creek, extending along the said creek downwards 5 miles, and running back from the creek 2 miles, on the southern or side next to the Macquarie River and $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles on the northern side.

9.—The run known as Merry Merry Creek, and estimated to contain about 20,000 acres.

Bounded on the south by Merry Merry Creek; commencing at a crooked waterhole, and extending 5 miles west; by a pine scrub on the south; on the east by a small chain of plains; and on the west by a round plain.

WELLINGTON DISTRICT.

10.—The run called Warina West, estimated to contain 16,000 acres.

A block of land on the west side of the Mara Creek; commencing at a point 10 miles, measured on a north line, below the lower boundary of the lower run tendered for by C. W. Finch; and bounded thence by a west line 5 miles; thence by a north line 5 miles; thence by an east line to the Mara Creek; and thence by that creek upwards to the starting point.

11.—The run called Gonbondray, estimated to contain about 16,000 acres.

A block of land lying outside the boundary of Mr. John Dargin's licensed run Gobondry, on the Lachlan side of that run; and bounded by east and west and north and south lines to include the quantity, 25 square miles.

12.—The run known as West Cobong, estimated to contain about 30,000 acres.

A block of land on Cookopie Creek, bounded by the runs of Cobong, (J. Kite's), Coradgery, (Messrs. Bray & Palmer), Genanagic, (R. A. A. Morehead), and the adjusted run 15 mile water-hole, Cookopie Creek.

13.—The run known as Murrabuga, estimated to contain 16,000 acres.

On the west side of the Bogan River; commencing at the upper boundary of Derooble, a run tendered for by Mr. Andrew Kerr, extending up the river 5 miles, and bounded by section lines on the other sides to include the quantity.

14.—A block of land known as Hermitage West, estimated to contain 16,000 acres.

On the west side of the Mara Creek, commencing at the lower boundary of the Waughandary Run, and bounded by that boundary 5 miles; thence by a north line 5 miles, or to the upper boundary of C. W. Finch's upper run Weeli, on same side of creek should that boundary prove to be within 5 miles; thence by an east line to the Mara Creek; and thence by that creek to the starting point.

15.—A block of land known as Bucka Bucka, estimated to contain 16,000 acres.

On the east side of the Mara Creek, commencing at a point 15 miles, (measured on a north line,) below the lower boundary of C. W. Finch's Run Weeli on the same side of the creek, and bounded on the south by an east line 5 miles; thence by a north line 5 miles; thence by a west line to the Mara Creek; and thence by that creek to the starting point.

16.—A block of land known as the Stockyard Run, estimated to contain 16,000 acres.

On the west side of Mara Creek, commencing at a point 15 miles, (measured on a north line,) below the lower boundary of the lower run tendered for by C. W. Finch, and bounded thence by a west line 5 miles; thence by a north line 5 miles or to the back boundary of the runs on the Barwin, if that boundary be within 5 miles; thence by an east line or by that boundary to the Mara Creek; and thence by that creek upwards.

17.—A block of land known as Curra, estimated to contain 16,000 acres.

On the west side of the Gennarin Creek, commencing at the upper boundary of Mr. John Dargin's run, Gennarin, and bounded by that creek upwards 5 miles; and on the other sides by east and west, and north and south lines to include the quantity.

18.—A block of land known as Burrimal, estimated to contain 16,000 acres.

Commencing on the west side of the Mara Creek, at the lower boundary of C. W. Finch's lower run, Weeli, on the same side of that creek, and bounded on the south by that boundary 5 miles, thence by a north line 5 miles; thence by an east line 5 miles to the Mara Creek, and thence by that creek to the starting point.

19.—A block of land known as Duck Creek, No. 17, estimated to contain 25 square miles.

Commencing on the northern bank of the Duck Creek, at the lower boundary of the run

occupied by Mr. Charles York, extending 5 miles down that creek, and bounded on one side by the creek, and on the other three by east and west, and north and south lines to include the quantity.

20.—A block of land known as Bugubada, estimated to contain 16,000 acres.

Commencing on the north side of the Bogan River, at the centre of the large waterhole at Mudall, and bounded by that river upwards 5 miles; thence by a north line 5 miles; thence by a south line 5 miles; and thence by a west line 5 miles to the starting point.

21.—A block of land known as Birehen Lagoons, estimated to contain 16,000 acres.

Commencing on the west side of the Bullock Creek, at a point 1 mile, measured on a north line, below the waterholes on that creek, called Birehen Lagoons, and bounded by that creek upwards to a point 4 miles, measured on a south line, above Birehen Lagoons; and on the remaining sides by east and west and north and south lines to include the quantity.

22.—A block of land known as Duck Creek No. 11, estimated to contain 16,000 acres.

Commencing on the northern bank of the Duck Creek, at the lower boundary of Duck Creek No. 17, extending 5 miles down that creek, and running back 5 miles at right angles to it towards the Macquarie.

23.—A block of land known as Lower Canonba West, estimated to contain 16,000 acres.

Commencing on the southern bank of the Duck Creek, at the lower boundary of Upper Canonba West, extending 5 miles down that creek, and bounded on one side by the creek, and on the other three by east and west and north and south lines to include the quantity.

24.—The run known as Wammerawa, estimated to contain 16,000 acres.

Commencing on the west side of the Macquarie River, at a point distant 20 miles, measured on a north line from Patrick Sullivan's station Willie, and bounded by that river downwards 5 miles; thence by a line west 5 miles; thence by a line south 5 miles; and thence by a line east 5 miles to the starting point.

25.—The run known as Lower Wamarawah, estimated to contain 16,000 acres.

Commencing at a point on the west bank of the Macquarie River, at the back boundary line of Mr. Parnell's station, and bounded on the north by that boundary line extending west 5 miles; on the west by unlocated Crown Lands and a line bearing south 5 miles; on the south by unlocated Crown Lands and a line bearing east to the Macquarie River; and on the east by that river to the point of commencement aforesaid.

26.—The run known as Gennarin No. 1, estimated to contain 16,000 acres.

On the east or Bogan side of the Gennarin Creek; commencing opposite to the lower boundary of the Curra Run, and bounded thence by an east line 5 miles, or to the back boundary of the Bogan Ruus, if that boundary be within 5 miles; thence by a south line or that boundary 5 miles; thence by a west line to the Gennarin Creek, and thence by that creek downwards to the starting point.

LACHLAN DISTRICT.

27.—A block of land known as Stoney Creek, estimated to contain 3,600 acres.

Commencing at the confluence of Stoney Creek with the Burrowa River, and bounded on the north and west by that creek to Antony's Pad.

dock, thence by the paddock fence to its junction with the Stoney Creek, thence by that creek to a marked gum tree near a paddock erected by one Maloy, on the east side of Stoney Creek, which divides Stoney Creek run from Mr. James Chisholm's stations Narra Allen and Kenue; south by a marked tree line bearing east 179 chains crossing a stringy bark range about half-way between Goba Creek station and Stoney Creek to a range; east by a marked tree line along the aforesaid range to a rocky creek; thence by that creek to its junction with the Burrowa River, which divides Stoney Creek Run from Goba Creek, Mr. Samuel Moore's station, thence by that river to its confluence with the Stoney Creek aforesaid.

MORUMBIDGEE DISTRICT.

28.—A block of land known as Brindebilla, estimated to contain 16,000 acres.

Bounded on the north by the south line of the Curadigby Station, held under License by Mr. Williams; on the west by Curadigby River; on the east by lofty mountains; on the south by mountains.

29.—The run called Quelama, estimated to contain about 19,200 acres.

Situated in the Intermediate Districts, county of Buccleugh, and bounded on the north by the licensed station of Bondo (L. F. De Salis); on the east by the forfeited run of Aungalong; on the south by unoccupied Crown Lands and the run of Goberagandra (William Atkinson); and on the west by the Sandy Creek, separating this run from Shelley's Springs.

30.—A block of land known as the Back Plain, estimated to contain 40 square miles.

Commencing at a marked tree 2 miles to the westward of Mr. James Kennedy's south-east corner, and bearing south about 5 miles to a marked tree; from thence by a line west 8 miles to a marked point; and from thence by a line bearing north 5 miles and joining Mr. James Kennedy's south-western boundary.

MANEROO.

31.—The run called Bald Hills, estimated to contain about 16,000 acres.

Situated in the county of Wallace, and bounded on the north-east and north by the Gap Range; on the west by Hobbs Range; on the south-west by the Reedy Creek; and on the south and south-east by high ranges.

32.—A block of land known as Windy Corner, estimated to contain 3,840 acres.

Bounded on the west by King's Creek, commencing at its junction, and thence by its eastern branch to the head of Cowra Creek; on the north by the southern boundary of Cowra Run, until it meets the western boundary of the Umeralla Station (Kirwan's); on the east by the latter boundary to the Umeralla River, passing along the bottom of Ryan's cultivation paddock; and on the south-west by the river to the junction of King's Creek. The station is situated in the County of Beresford.
