ROADS.

**H**IS Excellency the GOVERNOR-GENERAL, with the advice of the Executive Council, having deemed it expedient to open and make a Parish Road to be maintained at the expense of the parishes through which it is to pass, commencing at the first ford of the River William below the junction with it of the Chichester branch, and bearing south-easterly through the lands of Charles Archibald and Thomas Windeyer; thence through the south-west portion of M. A. M. Windeyer's (now Mrs. J. Thompson) grant of 960 acres; thence through Crawford Logan Brown's 728 and 904 acres purchases, crossing Myall Creek in the former of those purchases proceeding along the right bank of that

creek, and through C. L. Brown's 1280 acres grant, to Sugar Loaf Creek at the present crossing place, and through the reserve of Dungog to the intersection of Hook and Lord-streets in Dungog; again leaving Dungog from the junction of Mary and Lord-streets, and proceeding in a south-west direction through the adjacent section of Government land, leaving the Burial Ground on the right, crossing Tabbil Creek; thence southerly through D. F. Forbes' and J. Hook's 830 acres purchase; thence south-easterly through J. Hook's primary grant of 2560 acres, through the north-east corner of T. Nowlan's 640 acres, and through the Village Reserve into Verge's 2560 acres grant, crossing within the said grant Wallarobba Creek winding westward round Verge's Hill; thence south-easterly through T. C. Smeathman's, (now Rodd's) grant of 1280 acres; thence southerly through J. Hillier's 1280 acres grant, crossing Uwarabin Creek in that grant; thence south-easterly through Government land, southerly through the western portion of Felix Wilson's 640 acres purchase, and again through Government land, south-easterly through the Church and School Estate leased by Michael Casey and William O'Neil, and thence through Clarence Town Reserve to the intersection of Duke and Rifle-streets; Notice is hereby given, that, in conformity with the provisions of the Act of the Governor and Council 4th William IV, No. 11, intituled, "*An Act for making, altering, and improving the roads throughout the Colony of New South Wales, and for opening and improving the Streets in the Towns thereof*," a survey or tracing, shewing the intended line of the said Road, is now deposited in the Office of the Surveyor General, in Sydney; and all persons interested therein, are requested to transmit, in writing, to the Clerk of the Executive Council, within one month of this date, any well grounded objection which may exist to the formation of the said Road.

POSTAGE.—CORRESPONDENCE.

**H**IS Excellency the GOVERNOR has been pleased to direct, that in future all letters whatsoever addressed to the Departments and Officers of Government on the Public Service, and forwarded by Post, shall be pre-paid, otherwise it will be necessary to refuse them with a view to their being returned to the writers, who, under the 22nd clause of the Act of the Governor and Council 13 Victoria, No. 38, will be liable to pay the Postage thereon.

2. The only exception to this rule will be in the case of Clergymen or persons *not* in the Public Service, who may have occasion to send in Returns to any Department of Government of an entirely public nature; such, for instance, as the Returns of Births, Marriages, and Burials; but the nature of the Return must, in all such cases, be endorsed on the cover in which it is enclosed.

3. To reduce the cost of Postage to individuals having occasion to make remittances to the Colonial Treasury or any other Public Department, all sums under one pound, should be remitted in Postage stamps of the equivalent value, for which credit will be given as cash.

POSTAGE.—PETITIONS.

**S**OME recent cases having occurred, in which persons have forwarded to this Department, under sealed cover, Petitions addressed to the Governor, under the impression, apparently, that they were free of Postage, His Excellency directs it to be notified, that according to the provision contained in the 17th clause of the Act 13 Vict., No. 38, Petitions of the above nature, in order to be free of Postage, must be sent *without covers, or in covers open at the sides.*

2. In every case where this regulation is disregarded, the Petition will be liable to the usual Postage, which, in conformity with the rule laid down in the Notice of 11th January last, must be pre-paid.

3. For more convenient reference, the clause of the Act referred to is re-printed herewith.

"17. And be it enacted, That Members of the Executive and Legislative Councils may receive by the post, petitions and addresses to Her Majesty and His Excellency the Governor, and petitions addressed to either the Executive or Legislative Council, not exceeding thirty-two ounces in weight, exempt from postage: Provided such petitions and addresses be sent without covers, or in covers open at the sides."

QUEEN'S WHARF, BRISBANE.

**A**T 12 o'clock on Wednesday, the 27th day of August next, the Police Magistrate at Brisbane will cause to be put up to auction, at the Police Office, Brisbane, the Lease for Three Years, commencing the 1st day of September, 1851, of the Wharfage and Tonnage Rates, payable at the Queen's Wharf, Brisbane, under the provisions of the Act of Council 10th Victoria, No. 11.

The lessee will be entitled to the free use of the Wharf for depositing goods thereon, either for shipment or discharge, as well as for all other purposes appertaining to a Wharf.

The use of the Wharf will be reserved as a public thoroughfare, or for the landing or embarkation of passengers and other persons free of any charge whatsoever.

A bond in double the amount of the rent, with two sufficient sureties, will be required for the due observance of the conditions of the Lease, and the regular payment of the rent, by equal monthly instalments, before the expiration of seven days after the termination of each month respectively. A Warrant of Attorney will also be required.

Further particulars may be obtained on application to the Sub-Collector of Customs, at Brisbane, or at the Colonial Treasury.

SIR,

With reference to my Circular Letter of 15th May, addressed to the Magistrates, relative to the duties devolving upon them under the new Electoral Act, (14th Victoria, No. 48), I have now the honor, by direction of His Excellency the Governor, to inform you, that in conformity with the powers conferred upon him by the 8th clause of that Act, His Excellency has been pleased to appoint you to be the Returning Officer of the Electoral District of <sup>Enclosing Commission.</sup> and I beg to enclose the Commission which has accordingly been prepared in your favor.

2. It will be necessary that you should immediately make and subscribe the following declaration before a Justice of the Peace, who is required to transmit the same to the Colonial Secretary by the first convenient opportunity; and a similar declaration must be made by every one acting in any capacity under the Act. <sup>Declaration to be made.</sup>

3. I purpose, in the present communication, to draw your attention to the duties which will devolve on Returning Officers and Deputy Returning Officers, under the Act in question. <sup>General pur- port.</sup>

4. The first duty to be performed by the Returning Officer, is that pointed out in the 25th clause of the Act, namely,—That on the receipt of the revised Electoral Lists, on or before the 31st of August, from the Clerks of the different Benches, he is to cause a general alphabetical list of the Electors of the whole of the Electoral District for which he is appointed, to be fairly transcribed or printed with as little delay as possible, from the lists so delivered to him; and such list is thereby constituted the Electoral List or Roll of Electors entitled to vote at Elections in such Electoral District, for the year commencing on the 1st day of September, or for a further period of one year in the case contemplated in the proviso to the same clause. <sup>Electoral Lists.</sup>

5. As soon as it has been determined when the general Election shall take place, a Writ will be transmitted to the Returning Officer, in conformity with the 29th clause. <sup>Writs.</sup>

6. By the 30th clause, the Returning Officer is required to endorse on the Writ the day on which he received it, and forthwith to give public notice of the day of nomination, which is to be the day mentioned in the Writ. <sup>Receipt of Writ.</sup>

7. By the 31st clause, the Returning Officer is required to preside on the day of nomination mentioned in the Writ, at a meeting to be holden at noon, at the place named for that purpose in the Writ, and is thereupon to declare the purpose for which such meeting is held. If no more candidates be proposed than the number of Members to be returned, the Returning Officer is to declare such Candidate or Candidates duly elected, and to make his Return accordingly. But if more Candidates be proposed than the number to be elected, the Returning Officer is to call for a show of hands, separately, in favor of each Candidate, and to declare the person or persons on whom the Election has fallen, and is to return the same accordingly; unless a poll be then and there demanded by any Candidate, or by at least six of the Electors of the District on his behalf. <sup>Proceedings at Nomination.</sup>

Booths, &c.,  
may be erected.

8. By the 32nd clause, the Returning Officer is authorised, if it shall appear to him expedient for taking the Poll at any Election, to cause Booths to be erected, or rooms to be hired and used as Booths, in one place, or in several places, at each Polling Place, as occasion may require, and the same are to be divided and allotted into such compartments as shall seem most convenient. The Returning Officer is to appoint a Clerk or Clerks, to take the Poll at each compartment; and if there be a contest, he is required, before the day fixed for taking the Poll, to cause to be furnished, for the use of each Booth or Polling Place, a copy of the Electoral List of the Electoral District for which the Poll shall be taken, and to certify, under his hand, such copy to be true. It will be desirable, that at any Polling Place where there is a Clerk of the Bench, he should be appointed for that purpose.

9. If any of the Polling Places for the District should also be a Polling Place for any other District, separate booths or rooms must be appropriated for each separate Electoral District. A Deputy must also be appointed for each such room or booth, by the Returning Officer of the Electoral District, and the name of the Electoral District should be affixed on the most conspicuous part of the room or booth.

Expense of  
erecting  
Booths, &c.

10. In the erection of booths, or in otherwise providing accommodation for taking the Poll, it is very essential that no expense which can possibly be avoided should be incurred. Accounts for the same, and for the remuneration to be given to Polling Clerks, not being Clerks of Benches, in the form and with such vouchers as may be deemed necessary by the Auditor General, (who will furnish the proper forms and instructions for preparing them), are to be rendered to that officer, who will forward them to this office, when they will be submitted for the Governor's approval, and ordered for payment, under the authority granted to him by the 32nd clause.

Taking the  
Polling.

11. The Poll, if so demanded, is to commence at the different Polling Places for the District, on the day appointed in the writ for that purpose; and by the 36th clause, the voting at every Poll is to commence at 9 o'clock in the forenoon, and to be finally closed at 4 o'clock in the afternoon of the same day, unless adjourned by reason of riot or interruption.

Who to pre-  
side at Polling  
Places.

12. By the 33rd clause, the Returning Officer is directed to preside at one Polling Place of the District. He is also directed to appoint by writing under his hand a Deputy to act for him, and take the Poll at each of the other Polling Places of his District. No provision is made as to the time at which such appointments are to be made, but care should be taken that they are made and accepted in sufficient time to prevent inconvenience.

Qualification  
of Deputy  
Returning  
Officers.

13. Although the qualification of the Deputy Returning Officers, except for Sydney, is not defined by the Act, it is very essential that they should be persons in whom the Electors generally may have confidence: Magistrates of the Territory would be peculiarly eligible for the office. It will not be necessary, it is conceived, to grant any remuneration for this duty, although any reasonable expenses which may be incurred in its performance, will, of course, be allowed.

Adjournment  
in case of riot.

14. By the 35th clause, if the proceedings at the Election are interrupted or obstructed by riot, or open violence, whether on the nomination of Candidates or on taking the Poll, the Returning Officer or his Deputy, is not for such cause to terminate the business of such nomination, or finally close the Poll, but is to adjourn the nomination, or the taking of the Poll at the particular Polling Place or Places at which such interruption or obstruction happens, until the following day; and if necessary must further adjourn until such interruption or obstruction shall have ceased, when the Returning Officer, or his Deputy, shall again proceed with the business of the nomination, or with the taking the Poll, as the case may be, at the place at which the same was interrupted or obstructed. And the day on which the nomination shall have been concluded is to be deemed to have been the day fixed for the nomination, and the commencement of the Poll shall be regulated accordingly; and any day to which the Poll shall have been so adjourned, is as to such place or places to be reckoned the day of Polling at such Election, within the meaning of the Act; and whenever the Poll shall have been so adjourned by a Deputy Returning Officer, he is forthwith to give notice of such adjournment to the Returning Officer, who is required not to declare finally the state of the Poll, or the name or names of the Member or Members chosen, until the Poll so adjourned has been finally closed, and the voting papers delivered or transmitted to him.

15. By the 34th clause, the Registered Electors of other Electoral Districts than the City of Sydney, may vote at any Polling Place appointed for the Electoral District to which they belong, whether such Polling Place be situated within their Electoral District or otherwise. Where Electors to Vote.

16. By the 36th clause, every Elector is entitled to vote for any number of persons not exceeding the number of Members then to be chosen for the district, by delivering to the Returning Officer, or his Deputy, a voting paper, containing the christian names and surnames of the persons for whom he votes, the name of the Elector voting, and the name of the place in which the property for which his name appears on the Electoral Roll, is situated. Voting paper.

17. By the 42nd clause, it is provided, that no voting paper is to be rejected by the Returning Officer, or his Deputy, for mere want of form, provided that the name and qualification of the Elector, and the name or names of the person or persons for whom he votes, be intelligibly expressed, and in a manner to be commonly understood. Same.

18. By the 37th clause, no enquiry is permitted at the time of Polling, as to the right of any Elector to vote, except only as follows, that is to say, the Returning Officer, or his Deputy, may, if he shall think fit, or if required by any two Electors of the same Electoral District, put to any voter at the time of his delivering in his voting paper, but not afterwards, the following questions, or any of them, and no other:—

1st. Are you the person whose name is signed as A.B. to the voting paper now delivered in by you?

2nd. Are you the person whose name appears as A.B. in the Electoral Roll now in force for this Electoral District, being registered therein for property described to be situated in (*here specify the street or place described in the Electoral Roll*)?

3rd. Have you already voted, either here or elsewhere, at the Election for the Electoral District of \_\_\_\_\_?

4th. Have you the same qualification for which your name was originally inserted in the Electoral Roll for the district of \_\_\_\_\_ (*specifying in each case the particulars of the qualification as described in the Register*)?

19. The Returning Officer, or his Deputy, may also, if he shall think fit, or if required so to do by any Candidate, or his agent appointed by him in writing, require the person claiming to vote to make a solemn declaration, or affirmation, at the time of delivering in his voting paper, as follows:—

“ You do solemnly declare that you are the same person whose name appears as A.B. on the Register now in force for the Electoral District of \_\_\_\_\_.” Declarations at same time.

And also the following solemn declaration, if thought fit, or required as above.

“ I, A. B. do solemnly declare, that I have not received or had by myself or any person whatsoever in trust for me, or for my use and benefit, or for the use and benefit of any member of my family or kindred, or any friend or dependant, directly or indirectly, any sum or sums of money, office, place of emolument, gift or reward, or any promise or security for any money, office, employment, or gift, by way of consideration, either expressed, implied, or understood, for giving my vote at this Election.”

20. By the 39th clause, no person so required to answer the said questions, or to make the said declarations, or either of them, is qualified or can be permitted to vote, until he shall have answered such questions, or taken such declarations, as the case may be. But it may be proper here to observe, that under these provisions of the Act, neither the Returning Officer nor his Deputy is authorized to reject the vote of any person whose name appears on the Electoral Roll of the District, who may satisfactorily answer the questions, or make the declarations or affirmations therein mentioned. Any persons however, who may be afterwards proved to have falsely answered or declared, may be prosecuted under the Act. Not to vote until enquiries answered.

21. By section 41, it is enacted,—That no Elector shall be required to take any oath or affirmation, except the above, either in proof of his freehold or of his residence, age, or qualification, or right to vote; and no person claiming to vote No other oath required.

What to exclude persons from voting.

vote at any such Election, shall be excluded from voting, except by reason of its appearing to the Returning Officer or his Deputy, upon putting the above questions, or any of them, that he is not the person whose name is signed to the voting paper tendered by him, or that he is not the person whose name appears on the register, or that he has previously voted at the same Election, or that he has not the same qualification for which his name was inserted in the register, or except by reason of such person refusing to make either of the said Declarations.

Voting papers to be sealed up.

22. By the 43rd clause, each Deputy Returning Officer is required immediately on the close of the poll, to collect and seal up all the voting papers which have been taken at the polling place at which he presided, and with the least possible delay, to deliver them or cause them to be delivered to the Returning Officer of the Electoral District.

Declaration of state of the Poll.

23. By the 44th clause, the Returning Officer of each Electoral District is required, at the place of nomination, and as soon as practicable after the Election, openly to declare the general state of the poll at its close, as the same shall have been made up by him from the voting papers; and he is at the same time and place to declare the name or names of the person or persons who may have been duly elected; and in the event of the number of votes being found to be equal, for any two or more Candidates, he is by his casting vote, to decide which of the Candidates shall be elected. He is, however, prohibited from voting himself at any Election, for his Electoral District, except in the case of such an equality of votes. The Aldermen for the City of Sydney, and the Deputy Returning Officers for the other Electoral Districts, are not disqualified from voting by reason of their acting in such capacity.

Return of Writs.

24. By the 45th clause, the names of the persons elected are to be endorsed on the Writ by the Returning Officer, and the Writ returned to the Governor or Speaker as the case may require, within the time specified in it for its return, unless the Election shall have been delayed from any of the causes contemplated in the Act, and in that case it must be returned as soon after the close of the Election as shall be practicable.

Voting papers how disposed of.

25. By the 46th clause, all voting papers are to be sealed up by the Returning Officer, and transmitted to the Clerk of the Legislative Council. The sealed packets are to be described on the outside to be the voting papers of the Electoral District to which they relate, and to be signed by the Returning Officer.

Delay and impediment of a formal nature.

26. By the 53rd clause, it is enacted,—That no election shall be held void in consequence solely of any delay which may take place in holding the Election at the time appointed, or in the taking of the poll, or in the return of the Writ, or in consequence of any impediment of a merely formal nature; and the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, is authorized to adopt or cause to be adopted such measures as may be necessary for removing any obstacle of a merely formal nature, by which the due course of any Election may be impeded. Should any cause of delay unfortunately arise in your District, it will be your duty to communicate immediately to the Colonial Secretary, for the information of the Governor and Executive Council, fully, all the circumstances of the case, and to suggest such remedies as you may deem necessary, in order that no time may be lost in adopting the measures which may appear to be requisite under the powers granted by the clause now under consideration.

Things to be done falling on Sunday.

27. It will be perceived by the 75th clause, that if anything should be required to be done on a certain day, and that day happen to be Sunday, Good Friday, or Christmas Day, the matter is to be performed on the succeeding day.

Conclusion.

28. Having now gone through the whole of the provisions of the Act, which bear directly on the duties to be performed by the Returning Officers and their Deputies, in the order in which they are likely to occur, it only remains for me to impress upon you the very responsible nature of the office which thus devolves upon you, and to express the confidence with which His Excellency the Governor relies upon your efficient and impartial discharge of its important functions.

POSTAGE STAMPS.

**R**EFERRING to the Government Notice, dated 22nd December, 1849, respecting the issue of Stamps, in accordance with the 10th clause of the Act of the Governor and Council 13 Victoria, No. 38, intituled, "An Act to establish an uniform rate of Postage, and to consolidate and amend the Law for the conveyance and postage of Letters," His Excellency the GOVERNOR-GENERAL directs it to be notified, that it has become necessary to provide new Plates, on which, instead of the present design, there will be engraved the Queen's Head, with a laurel wreath and the words "New South Wales" in the border.

**SHIPPING.—CUSTOMS NOTICE.**

**M**UCH inconvenience having been felt by this Department, in the clearing of Vessels, from the hurried manner in which the Ship's papers are frequently put in by different persons at the same moment, it will in future be required, that Notice of intention to clear outwards, shall be given by the Master, Owner, or Agent, the day before such clearance is required.

2. The papers of all Ships bound to Europe or California must be handed to the Clearing Clerk, at or before 12 o'clock on the day of clearance, except on Saturdays, when the papers will not be received after 11 o'clock.

3. The papers of Ships bound elsewhere, must be delivered to the Clearing Clerk by 1 o'clock on the day of clearance.

4. **EXPORT OF GOLD.—CUSTOMS NOTICE.**

**I**T being considered important that correct accounts should be kept of the Export of Colonial Gold, with a view to the preparation of general Returns for the information of the Legislature and Public; and as some difficulty is at present experienced, in preparing such accounts, in consequence of the prevailing impression, that the precious metals are exempt from the usual regulations under which other goods are shipped, the attention of the Public is directed to the provisions of the 39th section of the Act of Council 9th Victoria, No. 15, from which it will appear that all goods intended for exportation, must be entered at the Custom House by Bill of Entry; and as no proviso is contained in any subsequent clause of the Act in favour of precious metals, it is requested that this regulation may be adhered to; but in order to avoid all apprehension that might be entertained of any risk consequent upon immediately making public the quantities exported in any particular ship, the information so obtained will be held to be confidential, and subject to be used only for the purpose of preparing the general Returns above referred to.
