## CONVEYANCE AND ESCORT OF GOLD.

**H**IS Excellency the GOVERNOR-GENERAL directs it to be notified, with reference to the notice of the 17th ultimo, that arrangements have been made for the conveyance of Gold, under the charge of an armed escort, from Ophir and Sofala to Bathurst or Sydney, and from Bathurst to Sydney, once in each week.

2. The Gold intended to be sent under this arrangement from Ophir or Sofala to Bathurst, or to Sydney, is to be delivered to the Commissioner of Crown Lands or Assistant Commissioner on the spot, to be transmitted in the Chests or Safes provided for the purpose, to the Police Magistrate at Bathurst, who will deliver the Bags addressed to that place to the persons or

agents appointed to receive them, and forward the Packages for Sydney by the Mail by which the escort proceeds to the Colonial Treasurer, at whose Office they may be obtained by the persons duly authorised for the purpose.

3. The Gold, whether received at Ophir or Sofala or at Bathurst, is to be placed in bags sealed, marked, &c., in the manner pointed out in the Notice of the 17th July, 1851; and the receipts to be granted and the authorities to be produced to the Police Magistrate at Bathurst, or to the Colonial Treasurer, Sydney, for obtaining the packages, are to be those required by that Notice.

4. A charge will be made for Gold, forwarded under this arrangement, from Ophir or Sofala to Bathurst, of one-half per cent., and from any of these places to Sydney, of one per cent. on its value, estimated at £3 1s. per ounce for washed Gold, and £2 8s. for Gold obtained by amalgamation; and payment is to be made to the Police Magistrate at Bathurst for Gold forwarded to that place, and to the Colonial Treasurer for that sent to Sydney.

5. The Mails, with escort, will leave Ophir and Sofala every Tuesday morning, and Bathurst every Wednesday, arriving in Sydney at 11 o'clock on Thursday forenoon.

6. It is to be understood that in the event of a loss, notwithstanding the protection afforded by the escort, the Government will not, as explained in the Notice of the 17th ultimo, be responsible for it.

## TENDERS FOR RUNS.

**I**T is hereby notified, for general information, that it has been deemed advisable to substitute the amended forms, (hereto annexed), of Tenders for new Runs, and for forfeited and vacated Runs respectively, for the forms hitherto used in tendering for Crown Lands beyond the Settled Districts; and that from and after the 1st October next, no Tender will be entertained unless made in the form now notified.

POSTAGE.—CORRESPONDENCE.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR has been pleased to direct, that in future all letters whatsoever addressed to the Departments and Officers of Government on the Public Service, and forwarded by Post, shall be pre-paid, otherwise it will be necessary to refuse them with a view to their being returned to the writers, who, under the 22nd clause of the Act of the Governor and Council 13 Victoria, No. 38, will be liable to pay the Postage thereon.

2. The only exception to this rule will be in the case of Clergymen or persons *not* in the Public Service, who may have occasion to send in Returns to any Department of Government of an entirely public nature; such, for instance, as the Returns of Births, Marriages, and Burials; but the nature of the Return must, in all such cases, be endorsed on the cover in which it is enclosed.

3. To reduce the cost of Postage to individuals having occasion to make remittances to the Colonial Treasury or any other Public Department, all sums under one pound, should be remitted in Postage stamps of the equivalent value, for which credit will be given as cash.

POSTAGE.—PETITIONS.

SOME recent cases having occurred, in which persons have forwarded to this Department, under sealed cover, Petitions addressed to the Governor, under the impression, apparently, that they were free of Postage, His Excellency directs it to be notified, that according to the provision contained in the 17th clause of the Act 13 Vict., No. 38, Petitions of the above nature, in order to be free of Postage, must be sent *without covers, or in covers open at the sides.*

2. In every case where this regulation is disregarded, the Petition will be liable to the usual Postage, which, in conformity with the rule laid down in the Notice of 11th January last, must be pre-paid.

3. For more convenient reference, the clause of the Act referred to is re-printed herewith.

"17. And be it enacted, That Members of the Executive and Legislative Councils may receive by the post, petitions and addresses to Her Majesty and His Excellency the Governor, and petitions addressed to either the Executive or Legislative Council, not exceeding thirty-two ounces in weight, exempt from postage: Provided such petitions and addresses be sent without covers, or in covers open at the sides."

QUEEN'S WHARF, BRISBANE.

AT 12 o'clock on Wednesday, the 27th day of August next, the Polico Magistrate at Brisbane will cause to be put up to auction, at the Police Office, Brisbane, the Lease for Three Years, commencing the 1st day of September, 1851, of the Wharfage and Tonnage Rates, payable at the Queen's Wharf, Brisbane, under the provisions of the Act of Council 10th Victoria, No. 11.

It is to be understood that the Mails are to be despatched on the days and hours to be fixed by the Postmaster-General, either according to the present arrangement, or as he may afterwards determine for the public convenience.

It will be optional with parties to offer for one or more of the above lines of stages, and to propose the mode of conveyance; but on all roads where wheel vehicles can travel, a preference will be given to carriage conveyance, and the Contractors will be held strictly bound to use the conveyance they propose, and to travel at the rate agreed upon. The rate of travelling is not to be less than six miles per hour, including all stoppages. The Contractors are to carry all bags, letters, and newspapers which may be delivered to them under authority of the Postmaster-General, or any of the Postmasters, and to provide secure lockers for the Mails in carriages and dry coverings for the bags on horseback.

Contractors will be bound to prevent the conveyance of any letter or packet, by any of their servants or passengers, or otherwise to the prejudice of the Post Office Revenue, under penalty of £5 for each and every offence.

Contractors will be liable to a fine of five shillings for every five minutes delay after the specified time of starting; and to a like penalty for every ten minutes delay after the specified time of arrival, except for the first five or ten minutes respectively.

Contractors will be strictly bound not to assign any portion of their Contract without consent of the Postmaster-General.

A Mail Cart or Carriage, drawn only by one horse, must not carry more than one passenger; by two horses not more than three passengers; and by three or more horses, not more than six passengers, exclusive of the driver, under a penalty of £3 for each offence.

### EXPORT OF GOLD.—CUSTOMS NOTICE.
