TWENTY POUNDS REWARD.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the government, that on the night of the 9th instant, a large stack of wheat, at Bannuke near Belfast, belonging to Mr. James Parke, farmer, was wilfully set on fire and totally destroyed, together with a barn containing a considerable quantity of threshed wheat, two hundred bushels of which were also destroyed; Notice is hereby given, in His Excellency's name, that a reward of Twenty Pounds will be paid to any person or persons, who may within six months from the present date, give such information as shall lead to the apprehension and conviction of the party or parties guilty of the above outrage.
