PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Charles Joseph La Trobe, Esquire, Lieutenant Governor of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the authority in me vested by a certain Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the 5th and 6th year of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "*An Act for regulating the sale of Waste Lands belonging to the Crown in the Australian Colonies.*" I do hereby notify and proclaim that at eleven o'clock of Tuesday, the fourteenth day of October next, the following Town Allotments will be offered for sale by Public Auction, at the auction room of Messrs. CONVEYANCE being required for the Post Office Mails, from and to the undermentioned places, for one year from the 1st January, 1852, persons disposed to contract for providing the same, are invited to transmit their offers in writing to this office, by twelve o'clock on Wednesday, the 29th day of October next, endorsed "Tender for Conveyance of Mails."

Each Tender is to be distinct, for the line of road as called for, and it is to be described, by the number under which it is herein numbered; and as whether for once or twice a week, it is to be particularly described, and its respective cost viz:—

1. From and to Melbourne and Albury, by way of Kinlochewe, Kilmore, Seymour, Broken River, and Ovens, twice a week.
2. From and to Melbourne and Portland by way of Geelong, the Leigh, Wardy Yallock, Fiery Creek and the Grange, twice a week.
3. From and to the Grange and Mount Gambier, by way of the Glenelg, Post Office and Border Inn, once a week.
4. From and to the Grange and Lake Wallace by way of the Upper Glenelg Post Office once a week.
5. From and to Port Fairy, and Fiery Creek, by way of Muston's Creek, and Hexham, once a week.
6. From and to Port Fairy and the Grange by Mount Napier, once a week.
7. From and to Warnambool and Port Fairy by way of Woodford, once a week.
8. From and to Geelong and Lake Colac, by way of Barwon, twice a week.
9. From and to Colac and Port Fairy, by way of Timboon, and Warnambool, once a week.
10. From and to Wardy Yallock, and the Elephant Bridge once or twice a week.
11. From and to Mount Emu Bridge, and Chepstowe, once or twice a week.
12. From and to Geelong and Burn Bank, by way of Bunninyong, twice a week.
13. From and to Burn Bank and Horsham by way of Glenorchy on the Wimmera, once or twice a week.

14. From and to Burn Bank and Yowen Hill on the Avoca River once a week.

15. From and to Melbourne and Ballan by way of Bacchus Marsh, once or twice a week.

16. From and to Melbourne and Kyneton, by way of Bulla Bulla and Gisborne, twice a week.

17. From and to Kyneton and Swan Hill by way of Mount Alexander and the Serpentine Creek, once or twice a week.

18. From and to Kilmore, and Maidens, Punt by way of Campaspie Post Office; once or twice a week.

19. From and to Melbourne and Alberton, by way of Brighton, Dandenong and Flooding Creek, once a week.

20. From and to Mount Alexander and Carris brook on horseback once a week.

21. From and to Melbourne, Richmond and St. Kilda, daily.

22. From the Post Office in Melbourne to Vessels in Hobsons' Bay, as often as may be required, and from vessels in Hobson's Bay to the General Post Office in Melbourne, as often as mails may arrive always by the Eastern Beach; and

23. From and to the General Post Office in Melbourne, and Vessels at the Government or other Wharves, as the Postmaster General shall require.

It is to be understood that the Mails are to be despatched on the days and hours to be fixed by the Postmaster General, either according to the present arrangement or as he may afterwards determine for the public convenience.

It will be optional with parties to offer for one or more of the above lines of stages, and to propose the mode of conveyance; but on all road where wheel vehicles can travel, a preference will be given to carriage conveyance, and the contractors will be held strictly bound to use the conveyance they propose, and to travel at the rate agreed upon. The rate of travelling is not to be less than six miles per hour, including all stoppages. The Contractors are to carry all bags and letters which may be delivered to them, under authority of the Postmaster General, or any of the Postmasters, and to provide secure lockers for the Mails, in carriages and dry covering for the bags on horseback.

Contractors will be bound to prevent the conveyance of any letter or packet, by any of their servants or passengers, or otherwise, to the prejudice of the Post Office revenue, but all loose letters collected on the roads are to be delivered up to the Postmaster, at first Post Office arrived at, under penalty of £5 for each and every offence.

Contractors will be liable to a fine of five shillings for every five minutes delay after specified time of starting; and to a like penalty for every ten minutes delay after the specified time of arrival, except for the first five or ten minutes respectively.

Contractors will be strictly bound not to assign any portion of their contract without consent of the Postmaster General.

A mail cart or carriage drawn by one horse must not carry more than one passenger, by two horses not more than three passengers, and by three or more horses, not more than six passengers exclusive of the driver, under the penalty of three pounds for each offence.

All vehicles and horses employed in the conveyance of Mails, are to be at all times subject to the inspection and approval or rejection of the Postmaster General, or person appointed by him for that purpose.

The drivers and postmen are to be free men and of certified good character.

All fines and penalties incurred under the agreement, are to be deducted by the Postmaster General from the next quarterly instalment falling due to the contractors, and are to be considered as over and above any penalties established by any Act of Council.

Each party tendering, or an agent for him, must attend at this Office, on the day appointed for opening the Tenders, and each Tender must bear the signature of two respectable and solvent persons, engaging to enter into a bond with the contractors, for the safety of the mails, and the due performance of the contract, and every stipulation therein.

The hours for starting from each Post Office, or stage, and all other particulars may be ascertained at the Post Office, Melbourne, where parties proposing to tender are invited to seek information.

The several contractors will have to make out their own accounts (forms for which can be had on application at the General Post Office) and present them at the Treasury for payment.

Printed forms of tender may be had on application at the Melbourne Post Office, or any other Post Office in the Colony.

TICKET OF LEAVE REGULATIONS.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has been pleased with the advice of his Executive Council, to direct that the following "Regulations" for granting Tickets of Leave and for the conduct of men obtaining that indulgence shall be observed from this date.

1. Prisoners who have been sentenced to work on the Roads, or other Public Works of the Colony will be considered eligible to hold

Ticket of Leave when they have completed the following periods of service, if by the general tenor of their conduct they can be recommended for it, viz:—

Those under 3 years sentence, after they have served 2 years

Those under 5 years sentence, after they have served 3 years

Those under 7 years sentence, after they have served 4 years

2. Each prisoner will also be allowed the advantage of the Task work system, to enable him to obtain his Ticket before the expiration of the above period according to the amount credited to him.

3. A prisoner will forfeit all claim to a Ticket of Leave from misconduct, though by subsequent good behaviour he might be considered eligible for it, in which case his probation would commence from the period of his last punishment, unless circumstances of a favorable nature could be brought forward which might induce the Lieutenant Governor to shorten the period.

4. Tickets of Leave will be issued from the office of the Superintendent of Police, to all persons eligible to receive the same under these Regulations, and will be granted for one District only

5. The Officer under whose charge a prisoner may be serving should forward a statement to the Superintendent of Police of the man's sentence and service, with a report of his conduct as soon as he is due for a Ticket of Leave, upon the receipt of which the Superintendent of Police will either recommend the application, or offer such remarks as he may think proper, and forward it to the Colonial Secretary for the Lieutenant Governor's decision.

6. Every Ticket of Leave holder shall without delay after the receipt of his Ticket proceed to the District for which he shall have obtained the same, and there immediately report himself to the Police Magistrate or Clerk of the Bench of the Police District in which he is to reside.

7. Every Ticket of Leave holder is to produce his Ticket to any Magistrate or Constable whenever required to do so.

8. Every Ticket of Leave holder is required to aid and assist any Constable in the execution of his duty, when called upon.

9. All Ticket of Leave holders will be mustered on the 30th June and 31st December in each year by the Bench Clerk of the District for which their Tickets are granted, and the names of those who shall fail to present themselves at the appointed time are to be reported in the half yearly return to be made to the Superintendent of Police.

10. The Police Magistrate where there is one, or two, or more Magistrates of any Police District are authorised to grant passes for any period not exceeding one month to Ticket of Leave holders belonging to the District to proceed to some other District. But no one is to be permanently removed from the District for which he has obtained his Ticket without obtaining the Lieutenant Governor's permission through the Superintendent of Police.

11. Passes are to express the object for which they are granted, and must be returned to the benches at the expiration of the period.

12. Every Ticket of Leave Holder receiving a Pass, shall report himself immediately on arrival at the Police, of the district for which the same is granted.

13. Clerks of Petty Sessions are required to keep a register of all Passes granted by their respective benches, and also of those which are brought to them by ticket of leave holders from other districts.

14. The residence of each ticket of leave holder must be recorded at the Police Office of his district, and he must report to the clerk of the bench whenever he makes a change of residence within the district; the nature of his employment should also be known.

15. Whenever practicable, tickets of leave holders are required to attend Divine service.

16. A Return is to be furnished to the Superintendent of Police by each police bench, on the 30th June and 31st December, in each year, of all ticket of leave men in the district, and of all passes granted by the bench, shewing the period and the district for which granted.

17. Every ticket of leave holder found out of his district without a pass, or in a public house after 9 o'clock in the evening, unless he is actually employed, or is a lodger in the house, or is found drunk in any place, or who infringes any of these Regulations, or in any other way misconducts himself, will be subject to be apprehended and taken before the nearest bench of magistrates, who, upon proof of the offence, will report the circumstance to the Superintendent of Police, for the Lieutenant Governor's information and decision. Should his ticket be then ordered to be cancelled, or if it should appear advisable to the magistrates on first hearing the case, the man is to be sent to the Superintendent of Police to be dealt with.

LAND AND IMMIGRATION DEPOSIT.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant Governor directs the publication of the following regulation which has lately been received from Her Majesty's Land and Emigration Commissioners and which have been in force since May last.

The attention of Depositors under the "Land and Immigration Deposit Regulations of the 22nd December 1848," is called to this notice in order that they may be aware of the sums which their nominees will have to pay to the Commissioners before they can be provided with passages, the nominees being placed by the regulations upon the same footing as Emigrants selected by the Commissioner.

NOTICE ON GOVERNMENT EMIGRATION TO AUSTRALIA.

1. *Qualifications of Emigrants.*—HER MAJESTY'S COLONIAL LAND AND EMIGRATION COMMISSIONERS are prepared, for the present, to grant passages to New South Wales,—to Victoria, (lately that part of New South Wales called

Port Phillip), and to South Australia, at the sub-joined *reduced rates* of contribution, to 1st Class Emigrants—that is, to Agricultural Labourers, Shepherds, Female Farm and Domestic Servants, and, as regards South Australia, to Copper Miners; these being the description of persons whose services are now most in demand in the Colonies. A few country mechanics, and workmen employed in the building trade, may however, occasionally be assisted out to Victoria and South Australia.

2. The Candidates must be sober, industrious, and of a general good moral character; on all which point, decisive certificates will be required. They must also be in good health, free from all bodily or mental defects, and the adults must in all respects be capable of labour, and going out to work for wages.

3. The Candidates most acceptable are young married couples without children, and female domestic and farm servants between the ages of 20 and 30, who have been out in service and thoroughly understand their business.

4. *Ineligible Emigrants.*—Governesses, and females not being House or Farm Servants, Professional men, Schoolmasters, Clerks of every description, and, in short, all persons without capital who are not strictly Labourers, cannot be assisted, and are strongly recommended by the Local Authorities not to emigrate, as there are already a larger number of persons of this class in the Colonies than can find employment.

5. Families with more than three children under ten,—widows and widowers with young children,—unmarried females with children,—persons under 18 without their parents,—persons who intend to buy land or invest capital in trade,—or who are in the habitual receipt of parish relief cannot be taken. The reasons for declining widows and widowers, and families, with young children, are, because, as regards the former class, the children would be left friendless and destitute in a strange land if anything happened to their only parent, and because as regards the latter class, many young children on board ship increase the risk of disease and mortality, and the parents find a difficulty in obtaining employment on arrival. The separation of husbands and wives, and of parents and young children will not be allowed.

6. The Commissioners, moreover, reserve to themselves an unfettered discretion of selection and of declining any candidate, although apparently coming within the regulation. No one, therefore, is to consider that by filling up the usual form of application, he acquires any claim or will necessarily be accepted.

7. The Commissioners feel it their duty to be thus particular in their selections, as the Emigration Funds are furnished by the Colonies, and are required to be expended with an exclusive regard to their interests in obtaining a supply of the particular kind of labour most in demand there, and not with a view to the relief of distressed individuals in this country.

8. *Mode of Applying, &c.*—Persons who wish to enquire whether they are likely to be accepted, should communicate their ages and callings, and, if married, the number and ages of their children, to the Commissioners or to any of their agents appointed in various localities to supply gratuitously information and forms to suitable applicants. These agents, however, have no power to promise passages, nor to receive money. If, therefore, applicants wish to make their payments through the agents instead of in the manner pointed out in the "Approval Circular"

hereinafter mentioned, they must understand that they do so at their own risk, and that the Commissioners will be in no way responsible.

9. When Candidates are accepted by the Board, they will receive a printed "Approval Circular", pointing out how the required contribution is to be paid, before which time no preparation for departure should be made. When the money is paid an Embarkation Order, which is not transferable, will be issued, naming a particular ship, and the time and place of embarkation.

10. *Scale of Payments.*—The following is the scale of contributions in force, for the present. But to prevent misapprehension it is to be distinctly understood that this scale is liable to modifications from time to time, and that the rate will be increased when circumstances require it.

11. *Outfit, Tools, &c.*—The Emigrants must provide a proper outfit. The smallest quantity that can be admitted for each person is as follows—

For Males: two complete sets of exterior clothing, six shirts, six pairs of stockings, and two pairs of shoes.

For Females: six shifts, two flannel petticoats, six pairs of stockings, two pairs of shoes and two gowns, with three sheets for each berth, and three towels and 2 lbs. of soap for each person.

But the larger the stock of clothing the better for health and comfort during the voyage, which usually lasts about four months; and, as the Emigrants have always to pass through very hot and very cold weather they should be prepared for both. Two or three serge shirts for men, and flannel for women and children are strongly recommended.

12. Emigrants should take out with them the necessary tools of their trades; but bulky agricultural implements and furniture, especially mattresses and feather beds, cannot be admitted. The whole quantity of baggage for each adult Emigrant must not measure more than twenty cubic or solid feet, nor exceed half a ton weight. It must be closely packed in one or more boxes, but no box must exceed in size 10 cubic feet.

13. *Evasion of Rules.*—Any mis-statements, deception, or evasion of any kind, of the rules, will entail a forfeiture of the money paid and of all claim on the Commissioners, and will in some

cases, subject the offender to a heavy penalty under the Passengers' Act.

14. *Commissioners Shipping arrangements, &c*—The Commissioners engage none but first class vessels, which will proceed in the course of each month to Sydney and Port Phillip, and to Port Adelaide. The ships will be despatched from London and Plymouth, where the Commissioners have depots fitted expressly for the reception of the Emigrants, who are assembled there previous to embarkation, and are lodged and fed free of charge, from the day named in their Embarkation Order.

We the undersigned, being two of the Colonial Land and Emigration Commissioners, in exercise of the power vested in us by "The Passengers' Act, 1849," and by an Act passed in the present year, intituled "An Act to amend the Passengers' Act, 1849," and acting in this behalf under the authority of Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies, do hereby give notice, that from the 1st day of June 1851, the following articles of food, and in the following proportions, may be supplied by the Master of any passenger ship, by way of substitutes, for

the articles of food required by the said Passengers' Act, 1849, to be issued to passengers, that is to say, potatoes, beef, or pork, preserved meat, dried salt fish, bread, biscuit, or best wheaten flour, or split peas, may be substituted for oatmeal or rice, at the rate of ¾ lb. of beef, pork, or preserved meat, or ¾ lb. of dried salt fish, or 1 lb. of bread or biscuit, or 1 lb. of best wheaten flour or 1 lb. of split pease, for 1½ lb. of oatmeal, or for 1 lb. of rice.

Preserved potatoes may be substituted for potatoes, at the rate of ¾ lb. of preserved potatoes for 1 lb. of potatoes.

Sugar may be substituted for molasses, at the rate of ¾ lb. of sugar for 1 lb. of molasses.

Coffee or cocoa may be substituted for tea, at the rate of 4 oz. of coffee or cocoa for 2 oz. of Tea.

REQUISITIONS.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor has been pleased to approve of the following Regulations relative to Requisitions for supplies, and to direct that the former Regulations on this subject be cancelled.

The attention of Heads of Departments and others is called to the necessity of making all future demands for supplies of any description whatever, by means of a Requisition in the prescribed form hereunto annexed.

1. Requisitions for stationery, printed forms, clothing, bedding, tools, horses, arms and ammunition, and other descriptions of stores, are to be made in duplicate to the Clerk of Stores in the prescribed form annexed.

2. Applications for the repair or white-washing of colonial public buildings, and, where land is attached, for the repair of the gates, fences, and general maintenance of the premises in good order; and Requisitions for furniture also, in duplicate in the prescribed form, are to be made to the Colonial Architect. The description of the articles, and nature of the repairs required, should be stated as accurately as possible.

3. Requisitions are to be made by all the Departments, half-yearly, on the 1st June and 1st December, for all kinds of stores, printed forms and stationery, arms, &c., except for such things as are hereafter mentioned.

4. The period fixed for the issue of clothing, or clothing materials, whichever it may be customary to issue—to the inmates of the Lunatic Asylum—prisoners serving sentences of imprisonment in gaol—convicts at the penal establishment, are—1st May and 1st November. Officers at the head of the several respective Establishments are, therefore, expressly enjoined to transmit their Applications for the articles they may need to the Clerk of Stores, one month prior to these dates.

5. Clothing for the men attached to the Commissioners' of Crown Lands, will be supplied, as heretofore, on the 1st of July, in each year; but for such other stores, in accordance with the established scale as the respective Commissioners may deem necessary, either to replace unserviceable articles, or to complete their equipment, application must be made annually on the 1st December.

6. Requisitions from the Gaol must be signed by the respective Gaolers; those from the country countersigned by the Visiting Justices, and in all cases by the Sheriff.

7. Such articles only are to be demanded, as is usual to allow, and as are indispensable for the proper conduct of the public service; in all cases, the size, weight, measurement, or quantity is to be given, as well as a correct designation of the articles.

8. From any urgency of service that could not have been foreseen, it may become requisite to apply for stores during the periods intermediate between the dates set forth in these Regulations, in which case a Supplementary Requisition will not necessarily be objected to, provided it be accompanied with a report of the circumstances which caused the application to be made at an irregular period.

9. Requisitions for printed forms are to be made in a similar manner, but a copy of each form, either printed or in manuscript, is to be attached to the Requisition.

10. When the probable cost of supplies required has been ascertained by the Colonial Architect and the Clerk of the Stores, the Requisitions shall be forwarded by them to the Auditor General, and be by him submitted, with his remarks, for the approval of His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor.

11. Forms of Requisitions may be obtained at the Office of the Auditor-General, or from the Clerk of Stores.

POLICE REWARD FUND.

1. His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, is pleased to direct that the following "Regulations" for the management and disposal of the Police Reward Fund, as constituted by the provisions of the Act of Council 14th Victoria, No. 38, be henceforth observed by all Courts of Petty Sessions within the Colony of Victoria.

2. This fund shall consist of fines imposed upon Constables for misconduct, of penalties, or portions thereof, inflicted under the various Acts of Council, which direct a moiety to be paid to the informer, in all cases where a conviction followed an information laid by any member of the Constabulary, and also of fines imposed under the 15th and 18th sections of the above recited Act.

3. All sums accruing to this Fund are to be paid to the Colonial Treasurer, and the various Clerks of Petty Sessions in accounting for such payments will do so in a column distinct from that in which their other collections may be entered.

4. In the distribution of the Police Reward Fund, which will take place as soon as possible after the 30th June and 31st December in each year, awards will be made in the following manner:—

1. To such members of the Police Force as may have during the preceding six months performed some extraordinary act of courage zeal or intelligence.

2. To those who may have displayed the greatest activity in the detection and apprehension of persons charged with the commission of felonies.

3. To those constables who may have been the most active in bringing to justice parties who have committed minor offences, such as breaches of the Towns Police Act, and others affecting the general well being of the community.

4. It must also be borne in mind by the Constabulary, that those members who invariably display a desire to do their duty to the public and to act in accordance with their oath of office, without regard to mere pecuniary considerations, will have such honorable conduct taken into account and considered in conjunction with any special services which they may have performed when the Reward Fund is distributed.

5. Should a Constable who would have been entitled to participate in this fund die before its distribution, his wife or family will be entitled to receive the amount which would otherwise have been awarded to him.

6. Immediately after the 30th June and 31st December in each year, the Police Magistrate, where there is one, and two at least of the Magistrates in the other Police Districts, shall forward a return to the Colonial Secretary shewing the amount which has been paid to the credit of the Police Reward Fund within the previous six months from their respective Districts, accompanied by a statement showing the conduct and services of each Constable who is considered deserving of participating in this fund, either on account of general good conduct, or for the meritorious performance of the duties of his office, as pointed out in the preceding paragraphs; and upon the receipt of these reports, the Colonial Secretary will prepare a plan for the distribution of the Fund available for this purpose, which will be submitted to His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor and the Executive Council for approval.

**CONVEYANCE OF GOLD UNDER ESCORT
FROM BUNINYONG.**

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant Governor directs it to be notified that arrangements have been made for the conveyance of Gold from Buninyong to Melbourne and Geelong once a week under the charge of an armed escort.

2. The Escort will leave Buninyong every Tuesday morning at 6 o'clock, will arrive at Geelong that evening at 4 o'clock, and the following morning will leave for Melbourne, where it will arrive the same day at half past three o'clock.

3. Persons desirous of forwarding gold under the security afforded by this Conveyance are to take care that it is forwarded to Buninyong not later than 4 o'clock P.M. of the Monday preceding the departure of the escort, by which it is wished it should be sent. A responsible officer will be appointed to take charge of it at Buninyong into whose charge it is to be delivered, and he will be instructed previously to receiving it, to have it accurately weighed in the presence of the person bringing it, he will then tie it up in a leather bag, seal it, and attach a label to it, on which the weight of the gold is to be stated, the name of the person sending it, and also the name of the person to whom it is consigned, and whether residing in Melbourne or Geelong. The Officer acting for the Government in this matter will grant a receipt to the depositor of the Gold, containing the above particulars. A notification will shortly appear in the Government Gazette appointing an Officer to conduct this business.

4. There will be two boxes in which the gold to be escorted will be secured, the one for Geelong the other for Melbourne. On the arrival of the escort at Geelong both boxes will be placed in charge of the Police Magistrate, and he will the following morning deliver the box containing the gold for Melbourne to the Officer in charge of the escort, who upon reaching Melbourne will forthwith deliver it to the Colonial Treasurer.

5. Persons to whom the gold is consigned will receive it from the Colonial Treasurer or the Police Magistrate of Geelong, upon producing their authority, signing receipts for it, and paying the escort charge of one per cent on washed gold, to be estimated at the rate of £3 the ounce, and on gold mixed with a larger portion of stone at the rate of £2 10s. the ounce.

6. Every precaution will be taken for the safety of the gold sent under escort, but in the event of loss the Government will not be responsible for it.

DAILY RATIONS OF PROVISIONS.

No. 1. Emigrants—For men, 24 oz wheaten bread, 16 oz fresh meat, 8 oz vegetables, half oz salt, quarter oz tea, one and a half oz sugar, quarter oz soap. For women—16 oz wheaten bread, 12 oz fresh meat, 6 oz vegetables, half oz salt, quarter oz tea, one and a half oz sugar, half oz soap. Children under ten years to be allowed two-thirds the rations of female adults; above that age and under fifteen the same as adults.

No. 2. To prisoners of the crown and others in the employment of the colonial department—16 oz wheaten bread, 8 oz maize meal, 16 oz fresh meat, quarter oz salt, one oz sugar, quarter oz soap, 16 oz vegetables.

No. 3. To officers in charge of surveying parties when in field, and men composing such parties—24 oz flour, 16 ozs fresh or salt beef, half oz salt, half oz tea, two and a half oz sugar, half oz tobacco, quarter oz soap; or, in lieu thereof, if preferred, 24 oz flour, 24 oz fresh or salt beef one oz salt, half oz tea, 4 oz sugar.

No. 4. Prisoners confined in gaol—12 oz wheaten bread, 12 oz maize meal, 4 oz fresh beef, 8 oz vegetables, half oz salt, quarter oz soap. (Ration No 2 is issued to gaol attendants, and to witnesses, and others waiting bail; and if confined in solitary cells, ration No. 8.)

No. 5. Children of female prisoners confined in gaol—8 oz wheaten bread, 4 oz fresh beef, 1 pint milk, quarter oz yellow soap.

No. 6. Prisoners confined in lock-up or watch-houses—24 oz wheaten bread.

No. 7. Forage for horses and oxen, in all colonial service—8 lbs maize or barley, or 10 lbs oats as demanded, 4 lbs bran, 12 lbs oaten or cultivated grass hay, and 4 lbs wheat straw for each horse per day, and half the quantity for each bullock.

No. 8. For men attached to Lighthouses, Telegraphs, Water Police, and Harbour Master's boat's crews—24 oz wheat bread, 16 oz fresh beef, a quarter oz salt, one quarter oz soap.

No. 9. Fuel and light—sperm and common oil per gallon, mould and dip candles per lb, cotton wick ditto.

No. 10. For the Lunatic Asylum, Yarra, fresh beef, fresh mutton, suet, wheaten bread, bread of the 1st quality, flour 1st quality, raisins, rice, tea, sugar, salt, pepper, milk, tobacco, soap, vegetables, port wine, vinegar, sago, oatmeal, arrowroot, treacle, dip candles, common oil, common wick, forage, per ration, roach lime, straw, in such quantities as may be required.

Military rations of provisions for native Police or other mounted force, if required, 24 oz flour, 16 oz fresh or salt beef, half oz salt, half oz tea, two and a half oz sugar, half an oz tobacco, quarter oz soap.

For Hospitals, Aboriginal Establishments, Native Police, and all other services when ordered—20 per cent. flour, fresh beef and mutton, wheaten bread, (first, second, and third quality), maize, meal, bottled port wine, arrowroot, rice,

sago, pearl barley, tea, sugar, salt, oatmeal, yellow soap, colonial tobacco, vegetables, milk, vinegar, straw, common oil, dip and mould candles, rum, brandy, porter, cotton, wick, salt beef, and salt pork.

CONDITIONS.

1. All the articles required by this notice are to be of the best quality of their several kinds.

2. The flour and bread must be the produce of clean sound colonial wheat, from which on the rations of emigrants, surveying parties, border police, 20 per cent, and on the ration to prisoners of the crown 10 per cent. has been extracted in bran and waste.

3. Beef and mutton to be issued in such proportions as may be required, and when the quantity admits of it, to be delivered in fore and hind quarters alternately.

4. The maize meal to be similar in quality to the wheat meal, and to be twice ground.

5. When it may be necessary to substitute one article for another, the following proportions are to be observed, viz., 1 lb wheat flour or 1 lb biscuit equal to 1½ lb bread; 1 lb salt beef or 1 lb mutton, or 10 oz salt pork, equal to 1 lb of fresh beef.

6. The tobacco to be the best colonial.

7. The above substitutions are not to be made except on the requisitions of the officer authorised to draw the several rations.

8. Vegetables to be supplied in reasonable proportions of potatoes, greens, pumpkins, onions, &c. &c.

9. The supplies for road parties and surveying parties are to be delivered at the nearest fixed stations to the places where the party may be employed, on the requisition of the officer in charge; and in case the whole ration of forage be not required or delivered, each of the species to be reckoned as the portion of the ration undermentioned:—The maize or barley 4-12—the hay 5-12—the bran 2-12—the straw 1-12.

10. The supplies (not specified in the preceding paragraphs) are to be delivered direct to the parties or establishment entitled thereto, on the written order of the person duly authorised for the purpose.

11. Provisions and forage, when required by rations, according to the scales under their respective heads, the tenders are to express the price per ration only.

12. The tenders for forage are not required to state the price per ration for oxen, as when the latter is required, one half the allowance fixed for horses will be drawn, and one-half the price allowed to the contractor, whose engagement is to provide for both horses and oxen.

13. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the party receiving the supplies, as to the quality, the same is to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a Board of Survey according to the practice of the service. But in country districts, where a Board of Survey cannot be conveniently assembled, the party objecting will name one person as arbitrator, the contractor or his agent another, and these two will (previously to any other proceeding on their part) concur in naming a third, as umpire, who, in the event of the arbitrators not agreeing in opinion, will be called upon for his decision, which shall be final.

14. If the board, arbitrators, or umpire shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor.

failing of which it will be procured by the department requiring it, and the expense charged to the contractor.

15. In the event of any unnecessary delay or failure of the contractor to supply the articles when required, they will be otherwise procured and charged in like manner.

16. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or from some other cause, injury would be sustained either by the parties to whom the rations are due or the contractor, by waiting for a Board of Survey, the head of the department or officer in charge of the party or parties for whom the rations are to be received, shall have the power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality; it being distinctly understood that he will be responsible to the government for so doing; and that the contractor will have a right of appeal to the Governor, although in the meantime he must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead, failing of which it will be obtained by the officer or party requiring it, and the expense charge to the contractor.

17. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of any delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon the report of the officer in charge of the parties or establishment, to such mulct, not exceeding one-fourth the amount of his monthly account, as the Governor may direct. It will also be in the power of the Governor, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

18. It will be in the power of either party to limit the duration of the contract, by giving in writing a notice of three full calendar months to the opposite party, and to end the contract at the expiration of that period, it being understood that such notice can be given only from the first day of a month, and within the period for which the contract is made or agreed to be made.

19. The contractor will be required to prepare his own account, monthly or quarterly, in the prescribed form; and on the production thereof, with the requisite vouchers in a complete state, to the Auditor General for examination, and upon their approval, a warrant will be prepared, and payment made from the Colonial Treasury.

20. The value of all packages to be included in the prices demanded.

21. Printed forms of tender may be obtained from the Auditor General; and a security of £2000 will be required for the due fulfilment of the contract. No tender can be attended to unless accompanied by a certificate from two responsible parties proposed as security, stating they are willing to become bound as securities for the contractor accordingly, and the bonds must be executed within twenty days, from the day of acceptance of the tender being notified, failing of which the contracts will be again advertised or another tender accepted.

22. The tenders to contain the names of the tenderers and their sureties, and places of residence at length.

23. All tenders to be enclosed in a separate envelope, and marked "Tender for provisions, &c." and to be deposited in a box marked, "Tender" at the western entrance of the Government Offices.

24. The tenders must include the whole of the rations and separate articles above mentioned.

25. The tenders are to be given in for the un-dermentioned districts, which may be tendered for separately or collectively. When the latter

is the case each locality, as given below, must be stated in the tender.

1. Melbourne, including the county of Bourke the Mounted and Police Stations on the Goulburn and Broken Rivers, and any other Stations on or near the Sydney Road within the Province of Victoria, also the Aboriginal Stations at the Golbourn and Loddon.

2. Geelong, including the county of Grant.
