Schedule of the articles required, and form of Tender for each contract, may be seen and every particular obtained at the office of the Colonial Storekeeper.

For the supply of firewood and water at Geelong, the Schedule can also be seen at the office

of the Overseer of Works at Geelong, and for similar supplies at Williams town; at the office of the Harbour Master.

Tenders for each of the above to be enclosed in separate envelope, sealed and endorsed "Tender for" (as the case may be), and deposited in the box marked "Tenders for works and stores" placed in the entrance passage of the Colonial Treasury, William street, or forwarded per post prepaid, and addressed to the "Board for opening Tenders" Colonial Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any Tender.

CONDITIONS.

1. All the articles above enumerated, are to be of the best quality of their several kinds, and must be (in cases where samples are required), equal to those provided and left with the tenders at the Treasury.

2. One price is to be stated for each article.

3. All orders for supplies under this contract must issue from the Colonial Storekeepers' department, to which office the supplies must be delivered for inspection and approval.

4. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the party receiving the supply, as to the quality, such difference is to be decided by a Board of Survey, to consist of the party receiving the supply, the contractor, and a party appointed by him, and a second Government officer.

5. If the Board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere; and the extra expense, if any, deducted from the amount then due to the contractor by the party requiring it.

6. In the event of any unnecessary delay or failure of the contractor, to supply the articles when required, they will be otherwise procured and charged in like manner.

7. A repetition of irregularity in the quality or quantity of the supplies, or of any delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor to the forfeiture of his contract.

8. It will be in the power of either party to limit the duration of the contract, by giving in writing a notice of one calendar month to the opposite party, and to end the contract at the expiration of that period, it being understood that such notice can be given only on the first day of a month, and within the period for which the contract is made or agreed to be made.

9. Each supply must be accompanied by an invoice, shewing the quantity of the supply, which invoice must be signed by the party receiving the stores, and these receipts are to be produced with the contractors' quarterly accounts; no goods will be received unless accompanied by such an invoice.

10. The value of all packages to be included in the prices demanded.

11. The Contractors will be required to prepare their own quarterly accounts in the prescribed form, and leave them at the Auditor General's office, to be forwarded from that department to the Treasury, and upon approval payment will in due course be made.

12. Security will be required in the sum of one hundred pounds for the due fulfilment of the contract.

13. No tender can be considered unless accompanied by a certificate from the parties proposed as security for the contractor, and the bond must be executed within ten days from the notification of the acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract will be again advertised or another tender accepted.

14. The Tenders to contain the names of the tenderers and their sureties, with their places of residence at full length.

15. The Tenders for each Schedule must include the whole of the separate articles therein mentioned.

Regulations with regard to the appointment, &c. of Clerks in the service of the Colonial Government.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has been pleased to direct that the following Regulations be observed with respect to the appointment, promotion, remuneration and general duties of Clerks attached to the different departments of the Government of this Colony.

Appointment.

No person who has not previously been in the service of the Government, and by that means proved himself competent, is to be placed upon the permanent Establishment of an office, until he has been examined by a Board, to be appointed by His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, and reported upon as fitted for public employment.

The principal points to be ascertained by this examination are, that the applicant writes a clear legible hand with facility and quickness; that he is perfect in all rules of arithmetic necessary for the department to which he is to be attached; that he writes grammatically and that his orthography is correct. The applicant must also produce to the Board undoubted testimonials, of recent date, as to his respectability and general character.

As a general rule persons will not be appointed to fill the office of clerk in any department, who are under sixteen (16) or over forty (40) years of age; this rule does not of course refer to those who are transferred from one branch of the service to another. Extra clerks, or such as may be employed upon occasions for a short period need not be examined by a Board; heads of departments however are held responsible that they recommend no one for employment of this nature until, after due enquiry, they have reasonable grounds to believe he is in every respect qualified.

No extra clerk is to be taken permanently on the Establishment, unless upon a certificate signed by the head of the department, in the form A annexed, and after he has been for at least three months continuously employed.

Remuneration.

The rate of remuneration to clerks in the service of Government will be the same in all departments, except to those in the Post Office, to whom it is proposed to give a somewhat more favorable rate, in consequence of the daily office attendance being greater and of longer duration.

Clerks are to be divided into four classes, viz. extra, third, second and first classes.

Extra clerks for the first three months are to receive five shillings a day, and after that period if they have been in constant employment, at the rate of one hundred pounds a year. The third class clerks will receive salary at the rate of one hundred pounds a year. The second class one hundred and fifty pounds, and the third class two hundred and fifty pounds per annum.

In addition to these rates, an annual increase of ten pounds to the salaries of clerks of the third and second classes, and of fifteen pounds to those of the first class, will be granted, upon the production of a certificate in accordance with the form B annexed. It must however be distinctly understood that no one can claim such increase as a matter of right, it being intended solely as a reward to those who have displayed uniform diligence and attention to their duties, and are possessed of sufficient capacity and intelligence to fill progressively the higher and more important stations in the office. This annual increase will of course depend upon a vote of the Legislature. If no impediment intervene, the increase will be continued until it reaches one hundred and fifty pounds a year to the third class, two hundred and fifty pounds to the second class, and four hundred pounds a year to the first class.

To the clerks in the Post Office, the scale of salaries will be as above, except that the annual rate of increase will be fifteen pounds to each of the classes.

Should application for the annual increase not be made at the proper time, it will only be granted from the 1st of the month in which it is applied for and sanctioned.

The period which any one may have served as an extra clerk, will not be reckoned in an application for the annual increase; upon promotion the increase would commence upon the expiration of a year therefrom.

Promotion.

It will not necessarily follow that because a clerk has arrived at the maximum of his class, that he is to be promoted to the next; neither is it to be understood that a clerk is to be promoted when a vacancy occurs in a higher branch of an office, simply because he is the senior; in the latter case it is a matter which must be deter-

mined solely upon the merits of the individual, and his ability to undertake more responsible duties.

When the Head of a Department wishes to recommend any one of his Clerks for promotion, he must do so in the form Annexed, which will be submitted for the Lieutenant Governor's approval.

Removal from Office.

It must be distinctly understood, that should a Clerk be found to be incompetent, or should he contract habits which would render his further employment undesirable, he will subject himself to immediate removal from the service without any claim for compensation. His habitual infringement of any of the following general rules would also subject him to the same penalty.

General Rules.

The hours of attendance at the Post Office, are from 9 A.M. to 6 P.M., at all the other offices from 9 A.M. to half-past 3 P.M., except on Saturdays, when the offices will close at half-past 12 o'clock.

Should, however, a Clerk be in arrears with his work, or the requirements of the service demand a longer attendance at some particular period, it is to be understood that such must be given.

The whole of the time above specified must be entirely devoted by the Clerks of all Departments to their public duties, neither must they permit any one to visit them during office hours to occupy their attention upon any private business.

No fee, or anything else by way of remuneration, can under any pretence be allowed to be taken by a clerk, for the performance of anything connected with the office to which he is attached.

No information out of the usual course of duty is ever to be given from an office, unless by the express sanction of the head of the department.

All public property, as Furniture, Stationery, &c., in the charge of, or used by Clerks, is to be taken every care of.

Holidays.

The fixed Holidays to be observed by the several Departments, with the exception of the Post Office, are, New Years Day, Christmas Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, the Queen's Birthday, and the 1st July, being the anniversary of the foundation of the Colony.

PROCLAMATION,

By His Excellency Charles Joseph La Trobe,
Esquire, Lieutenant Governor of the Colony of
Victoria and its Dependencies, &c. &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, made and passed in the fifth and sixth years of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "*An Act for the Government of New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land*." It is amongst other things enacted, that there shall be within the said Colony of New South Wales a Legislative Council, to be constituted in the manner and for the purposes in the said Act mentioned. And that a portion of the Members of the said Council shall from time to time in the manner therein mentioned, be appointed by Her Majesty. **AND** WHEREAS by the said recited Act of Parliament, It is further enacted and provided that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty by any warrant or warrants to be from time to time issued by Her Majesty under Her sign manual, and countersigned by one of Her Principal Secretaries of State, to nominate such part of the said Council as according to the said Act is to be appointed by Her said Majesty, and to designate such Non-Elective Members of the said Council either by their proper names or as holders for the time being of any public offices within the said Colony. And that it shall also be lawful for Her Majesty by any such warrant or warrants from time to time to delegate to the Governor of the said Colony the power of nominating and designating such Non-Elective Members of the said Council, either by their proper names or as holders for the time being of any such public offices as aforesaid, such delegated power being exercised by any such Governor provisionally only and until Her Majesty's pleasure shall be known, and not to be exercised until the return of the Writs for the Election of all the Elective Members. And provided always that not more than half the number of such Non-Elective Members shall hold any office of emolument under the Crown within the said Colony. **AND** WHEREAS by an Act of the said Parliament made and passed in the thirteenth and fourteenth years of the Reign of Her said Majesty, intituled "*An Act for the better Government of Her Majesty's Australian Colonies*." It is amongst other things enacted, that after the separation of the said Colony of Victoria from the Colony of New South Wales there shall be within and for the said Colony of Victoria a separate Legislative Council, to consist of such number of members as shall be determined by the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, and that such number of the members of the said Legislative Council of the said Colony of Victoria as is equal to one third part of the whole number of members of such Council, or if such whole number be not exactly divisible by three, one third of the next greatest number which is divisible by three shall be appointed by Her Majesty, and the remaining members of the said Council shall be elected by the Inhabitants of the said Colony. **AND** WHEREAS by the aforesaid recited Act of Parliament, It is amongst other things enacted and provided that subject to the provisions of the said first recited Act as explained and amended by certain Acts of Parliament therein mentioned, concerning amongst other things the appointment of Non-Elective

Members of the said Legislative Council of the said Colony of New South Wales, shall apply to and be in force in the said Colony of Victoria. **AND** WHEREAS by a certain Act of the said Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, passed in the fourteenth year of Her said Majesty's Reign, known as "*The Victoria Electoral Act of 1851*." It is amongst other things enacted that the Legislative Council of the said Colony of Victoria shall consist of thirty members. **AND** WHEREAS in pursuance of the said recited Act Her Majesty has by a warrant under the sign manual, and countersigned by one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, delegated to me as such Lieutenant-Governor as aforesaid (in the absence of Her Majesty's Captain General and Governor-in-Chief in and over the said Colony of Victoria and its dependencies), the power of nominating and designating the Non-Elective Members of the said Legislative Council of Victoria, subject to the provisions of the said Acts as hereinbefore recited. **AND** WHEREAS the Writs for the Election of all the Elective Members of the said Legislative Council of Victoria have been duly returned: **NOW THEREFORE**, I, Charles Joseph La Trobe, Esquire, as such Lieutenant Governor as aforesaid, do hereby proclaim that I have accordingly in pursuance of the power and authority so vested in me, appointed the following gentlemen to be the Non-Elective Members of the said Council, until Her Majesty's further pleasure shall be known, viz.—

WHARFAGE AND TONNAGE RATES,

AT THE QUEEN'S WHARF.

AT Twelve o'clock on Friday, the twenty-eighth day of November next, the Colonial Treasurer will put up to auction, at the Treasury, Melbourne, the lease for one year commencing the 1st of January 1852, of the Wharfage and Tonnage Rates payable at the Queen's Wharf, Melbourne, at the upset price of Seven Hundred Pounds, under the provisions of the Act of the Governor and Council 10th Victoria, No. 11.

The Lessee will be entitled to the free use of the wharf, to collect dues, for depositing goods thereon, either for shipment or discharge, as well as for all other purposes appertaining to a Wharf.

The use of the Customs' Shed, near the Wharf, will be allowed to the Lessee of the Rates, when not fully occupied by the Customs' department.

The use of the Wharf will be reserved as a public thoroughfare, or of the landing or embarking of passengers, and other persons, at the same, free of any charge whatsoever, and the steps will have to be kept free from all goods or other obstructions.

The person who shall be declared to be the highest bidder, if the bidding be accepted, must immediately enter into a bond with two sufficient sureties, each of whom is to be present, at the knocking down of the rates, and warrant of attorney, securing regular payment of the rent by equal monthly instalments, before the expiration of seven days after the termination of each month, containing an engagement binding them to a due observance of the conditions.

It is to be understood that this notice does not include the Wharfage and Tonnage Rates at Geelong, but has reference to the Queen's Wharf, at Melbourne solely.

VACATED RUN.

IT is hereby notified that application having been made for the purchase of the Lease of the Run of Crown Lands hereunder described, which after having been occupied has become vacant, tenders in the prescribed printed form will be received at this office until noon of Wednesday the 5th day of November next, from the applicant, and from any other person desirous to enter into competition with him for the purchase of the lease of the said run.

2. Every such tender must state the term of years (not exceeding fourteen) for which it is proposed to take the run, and whether in addition to the minimum rent required by Her Majesty's order in Council it is intended to offer any and if any what amount of yearly premium per thousand sheep or equivalent number of cattle for the lease.

3. As the grazing capabilities of the run have not yet been determined it will be necessary that each tender contain an estimate of the Sheep or Cattle that the run will carry, which must in no instance be less than four thousand sheep or six hundred and forty head of cattle.

4. Until the run has been regularly surveyed and its grazing capabilities determined, the future lessee will be required to pay rent according to his own estimate as given in his tender; and in the event of the rent so paid proving to have been less than that determined by valuation, he will be required to make up the difference previously to the execution of the lease.

5. It is also to be distinctly understood that the Government reserves to itself the right of excluding from the lease of run, any land which it may be deemed proper to reserve for any of the purposes referred to in the 9th section of chapter 2 of Her Majesty's order in Council dated 9th March 1847.

6. Forms of Tender can be obtained from this office and also from the Crown Commissioner of the District.

GIPPS LAND DISTRICT.






