## QUARANTINE.

Colonial Secretary's Office, Melbourne, 18th September, 1852.

CASES of Hooping Cough, Measles, and Fever, having occurred on board the ship "Wanota," throughout her passage from England to this Port, His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, under the authority vested in him by the provisions of the Acts 3 William 4th, No. 1, and 5th Victoria, No. 12, of the Governor and Council of New South Wales, has deemed it necessary to place the vessel, crew, and passengers under Quarantine, of which all persons are hereby required to take notice accordingly.

The Boundaries of the Quarantine Station, Hobson's Bay, are specified in the Proclamation of the 26th December, 1851, of which His Excellency directs the re-publication.

## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Charles Joseph La Latrobe, Esquire, Lieutenant Governor of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies.

In accordance with the provisions of the Acts of the Governor and Council of New South Wales, 3 William 4th, No. 1, and 5 Victoria, No. 37.—September 18th, 1852.—1.

No. 12, I, by this Proclamation, declare and order that the Quarantine Ground in Hobson's Bay shall be the portion of the said Harbour commencing at a point two miles distant from the South end of St. Kilda, and bearing W. by S. from it; from thence extending for two miles in a southerly direction, at the same distance from and parallel to the Beach leading to Brighton, with an uniform width of one mile and a half; and I do hereby strictly prohibit all persons, not being themselves under Quarantine, or duly authorized for the purposes of necessary communication with Vessels under Quarantine, or the Quarantine Ground, from going, under any pretence whatever, within the limits hereinbefore described, in Hobson's Bay, when any Ship or Vessel is performing Quarantine in Hobson's Bay, or any persons, goods, wares, or merchandize, are undergoing Quarantine within the said limits, under the pains and penaltics prescribed by Law.


