BUOYS, BEACONS, &c.

IT having been represented to His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, that much damage and displacement has accrued to the Beacons placed at the entrance and along the banks of the River Yarra, in consequence of a practice prevalent amongst Ship Masters, Persons in charge of Lighters, &c., of making fast to them Warps for the purpose of heaving off when aground, as well as from their being run foul of, His Excellency has been pleased to direct the publication in the *Government Gazette*, for general caution and information, of the 60th Clause of the Port Regulations, having reference to this subject.

BUOYS AND BEACONS.

60.—“Every person removing, or wilfully injuring or destroying, any Buoy, Beacon, or Sea-mark in the Harbour, or in any Navigable Creek or River within the limits thereof, is liable to a Penalty of not less than £10, nor more than £50.”—(3 William IV., No. 6, sec. 8.)

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant Governor
directs it to be notified, that in conse-
quence of the former Tenderer having neglected
to fulfil the conditions of his Tenders for the
undermentioned portions of Crown Lands which
were formerly included in the Aboriginal Reserve
at Mount Rouse, the Lands in question are now
again open to public competition.

2. Sealed Tenders, in the prescribed printed
form, will be received at this Office until noon
of Wednesday, the fifth day of May next, from
any persons desirous of purchasing the Lease of
either of the Runs, according to the descriptions
hereto annexed.

3. Every such Tender must state the term of

years (not exceeding eight) for which it is pro-
posed to take the Run, and whether, in addition
to the minimum rent required by Her Majesty's
Order in Council, it is intended to offer any,
and if any, what amount of yearly premium for
the Lease.

4. As the grazing capabilities of these Runs
have not yet been determined, it will be neces-
sary that each Tender contain an estimate of
the number of Sheep or Cattle that the Run
will carry, which in no case must be less than
4,000 Sheep, or their equivalent in Cattle.

5. Until the grazing capabilities of these Runs
have been determined the Lessees will be re-
quired to pay rent according to their own
estimates, as given in the Tenders; and in the
event of the rent so paid proving to have been
less than that determined by valuation, they
will be required to make up the difference pre-
viously to the execution of the Leases.

6. It is also to be distinctly understood that
the Government reserves to itself the right of
excluding from the Lease of either of these Runs
any Land which it may be deemed proper to
reserve for any of the purposes referred to in the
9th Section of Chap. 2 of Her Majesty's Order
