# RESERVES FROM LEASE OF CROWN LANDS BEYOND THE SETTLED DISTRICTS.

Colonial Secretary's Office,  
Melbourne, 24th March, 1853.

**H**IS Excellency the Lieutenant Governor directs it to be notified, that he has, with the advice of his Executive Council, caused the several portions of Crown Lands hereafter described to be reserved from Lease under Her Majesty's Order in Council, 9th March, 1847.

Lands thus reserved are already, or will hereafter be, appropriated as Townships, with occasionally an adjoining quantity, for agricultural purposes, and are situate on main lines of road or thoroughfares in suitable localities, and at distances convenient for public accommodation, and for facilitating the improvement and settlement of the Colony.

Previous to the issue of Leases of Runs, the Reserves under consideration will be held to be withdrawn from Annual License except in instances hereafter mentioned.

Until it may be found necessary to sell, lease, or otherwise appropriate these Reserves, the land comprised within them will be left in the undisturbed and sole possession, for pastoral purposes, of the authorized occupants of the Runs on which the Reserves are situate; but when any portion of a Reserve shall have been sold, or appropriated under terms of this notice, such portion shall be at once withdrawn from the possession or occupation of the Lessee or Occupant of the Run.

It is to be clearly understood that the notification of the Reserves now enumerated does not preclude the subsequent reservation of such additional land as may be shown to be absolutely necessary for public interest and requirements in the manner intimated in the 9th section of the Orders in Council referred to.
