PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency CHARLES JOSEPH LA TROBE, Esquire, Lieutenant Governor of the Colony of Victoria, and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, made and passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "*An Act to make provision for the sale of Fermented and Spirituous Liquors, and of Refreshments in certain Districts,*" it is amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor of the said Colony, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time to proclaim any part or portion of the said Colony to be a District subject to the provisions of the said Act, to be called "A Special Licensing District," and to define the boundaries of such District: Now I, the Lieutenant Governor aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said Colony, do hereby proclaim the following part and portion of the said Colony to be a "Special Licensing District," under the provisions of the said Act, and do hereby define the boundaries of the same to be as follows, that is to say: Commencing at the source of the Avoca River near Mount Cole, and bounded on the east by that river to Lake Bael Bael, and thence by a line due north to the Murray River; on the north by that river to the South Australian Boundary Line; on the west by the South Australian Boundary Line to the Mosquito Creek; on the south by that creek to its head, thence by a line eastward to the source of Power's Creek, by that creek to its confluence with the Glenelg, by that river to its source between the Victoria Range

and the Grampians near Mount William, and thence by the Great Dividing Range to the source of the Avoca River near Mount Cole.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, made and passed in the sixteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "*An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria,*" it is amongst other things enacted, "That it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to declare that Tolls should be payable and collected at any Punt or Ferry which should be constructed, repaired, or supported at the public expense, and to cause such Toll-houses and Ferry-houses, Gates, Bars, Chains, Rails, and Fences to be built and set up as should be deemed necessary to prevent any person, beast, or carriage from passing by or over such Ferry or Punt unless there should be paid the Tolls lawfully payable thereat under the authority of this Act." And whereas it is expedient that Tolls should be payable and collected at the Punt or Ferry situate at Richmond, in the parish of Jika Jika, and county of Bourke: Now therefore I, Charles Joseph La Trobe, Esquire, as such Lieutenant Governor as aforesaid, by virtue of the said Act, and in furtherance of the power and authority thereby in me vested, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that Tolls shall be payable and collected at the Punt or Ferry situate at Richmond, in the parish of Jika Jika, in the county of Bourke and Colony of Victoria.

REMITTANCES IN CONNECTION WITH THE "FUND
FOR PROMOTING FEMALE EMIGRATION."

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant Governor directs it to be notified for the information of persons who have been introduced into this Colony under the auspices of the "Society for Promoting Female Emigration," that, should their improved circumstances enable them to make Remittances to the United Kingdom, the donation to the Fund of that Society of a sum equivalent to half the passage money (say £8 10s.) entitles them to name any Female relative or friend for a passage, provided she be a fit and proper person, and eligible under the rules of the Society.

1. In Melbourne the necessary forms will be filled up at the Immigration Office; but the donations must be paid, and the receipts signed at the Treasury.

2. In the Country Districts, the Clerks of Petty Sessions will receive any sum intended to be remitted for this purpose, on every public day during the sitting of the Court, and will procure for the Depositors the necessary documents for transmission to the persons in whose favor the donation is made.

3. It must, however, be distinctly understood, that these passages are not guaranteed by the Government, but by the "Society of the Fund for Promoting Female Emigration."

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE
MELBOURNE GENERAL CEMETERY.

*Established by Act of Council, 1850,
14 Victoria, No. 19.*

In pursuance of the 5th section of the above Act of Council, whereby it is enacted, "That the Trustees of the said Cemetery shall have power and authority to make such rules and regulations, and to do and perform, and cause to be done and performed, all such acts, matters, and things as may be necessary and proper for any of the purposes aforesaid, and also for determining and directing the order and position of all graves and vaults to be made in the same Cemetery, and for protecting the buildings, monuments, shrubberies, plantations, and enclosures therein and thereof from destruction or damage; and shall have power to prosecute all persons who shall or may at any time do or cause to be done any damage to any such buildings, monuments, tombstones, shrubberies, plantations or enclosures: Provided nevertheless, that the said Trustees shall not by any rule or regulation, or any act, matter, or thing, at any time interfere, directly or indirectly, with the performance of any religious ceremony in the burial of the dead, according to the usage of the communion to which the deceased may have belonged, or with the original distribution of the said land, made, or intended to be made, by the grant thereof to and amongst separate and distinct religious denominations or communions: Provided further, that no rite or ceremony shall be performed in any portion of such Cemetery set apart for any particular denomination, except according to the usage of such denomination, and by a duly recognised Minister of the same." The Trustees of the said Cemetery, with the concurrence and approval of the Government, make and promulgate the following Rules and Regulations:—

Rules and Regulations.

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.

2. By the 7th section of the Act, "Any person making a vault, or erecting and placing a monument in the Cemetery, by and with the permission of the Trustees, and under these rules, and upon the payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to, and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons, and his or their heirs, or near relations for ever."

3. Application for such permission to be made at the office of the Trustees, a certificate of permission in the form set out in the schedule will be granted to the party applying for such permission, on payment of the charges in the schedule.

4. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such Cemetery on a certificate of a Minister of religion, or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the Trustees, that such person was a pauper, or that the relations and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.

5. Orders for interment to be given either to the keeper at the lodge, or at the office of the Trustees; if given at the office of the Trustees, such notice to be given between the hours of ten A.M. and three P.M. the previous day; if not, an extra charge will be made.

6. The Trustees will cause all common graves to be dug; but parties wanting brick graves or vaults, will be required to construct them under the direction of the Surveyor; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent (in writing) of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.

7. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death, of the deceased, must be stated at the time of giving the order.

8. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the Cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

9. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from ten A.M. to six o'clock P.M., in the months of September to April inclusive; and from ten A.M. to four o'clock P.M., in the other four months, except on Sundays, when the usual and only hours for funerals will be from two to five o'clock P.M. throughout the year.

10. All monuments, vaults, graves, and grave stones, to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

11. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron.

12. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription, to be submitted to the Trustees for approval, who are required by the 7th section of the Act, "To determine and fix the position of any unobjectionable monument according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said Cemetery in an appropriate manner." In the erection of tablets, copper cramps must be used.

13. No catacombs nor any wooden fencing allowed.

14. No servant or other person employed by, or engaged in any duty on behalf of the Trustees, will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

15. The ground will be open daily to the public from sunrise to sunset.

16. A plan of the Cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the office, and may be inspected at the charge set out in schedule; and registers of all grants are kept by the Secretary.

17. The keeper has orders to turn out or take into custody (as the case may require) any person who shall behave indecorously, or commit any trespass or injury to the trees, flowers, or erections, or otherwise infringe the Act of Council relating to the Cemetery, or the regulations for protection of the same; and such person will be proceeded against, according to the provisions of the 9th, 12th, and 13th sections of the Act.
