PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency CHARLES JOSEPH LA TROBE, Esquire, Lieutenant Governor of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, made and passed in the sixteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "*An Act for making and improving*

"Roads in the Colony of Victoria," it is amongst other things enacted, "That it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to declare that Tolls should be payable and collected at any Punt or Ferry which should be constructed, repaired, or supported at the public expense, and to cause such Toll-houses and Ferry-houses, Gates, Bars, Chains, Rails, and Fences to be built and set up as should be deemed necessary to prevent any person, beast, or carriage from passing by or over such Ferry or Punt unless there should be paid the Tolls lawfully payable thereat under the authority of this Act." And whereas it is expedient that Tolls should be payable and collected at the Punt or Ferry situate at Richmond, in the parish of Jika Jika, and county of Bourke: Now therefore I, Charles Joseph La Trobe, Esquire, as such Lieutenant Governor as aforesaid, by virtue of the said Act, and in furtherance of the power and authority thereby in me vested, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that Tolls shall be payable and collected at the Punt or Ferry situate at Richmond, in the parish of Jika Jika, in the county of Bourke and Colony of Victoria.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE MELBOURNE GENERAL CEMETERY.

*Established by Act of Council, 1850,
14 Victoria, No. 19.*

In pursuance of the 5th section of the above Act of Council, whereby it is enacted, "That the Trustees of the said Cemetery shall have power and authority to make such rules and regulations, and to do and perform, and cause to be done and performed, all such acts, matters, and things as may be necessary and proper for any of the purposes aforesaid, and also for determining and directing the order and position of all graves and vaults to be made in the same Cemetery, and for protecting the buildings, monuments, shrubberies, plantations, and enclosures therein and thereof from destruction or damage; and shall have power to prosecute all persons who shall or may at any time do or cause to be done any damage to any such buildings, monuments, tombstones, shrubberies, plantations or enclosures: Provided nevertheless, that the said Trustees shall not by any rule or regulation, or any act, matter, or thing, at any time interfere, directly or indirectly, with the performance of any religious ceremony in the burial of the dead, according to the usage of the communion to which the deceased may have belonged, or with the original distribution of the said land, made, or intended to be made, by the grant thereof to and amongst separate and distinct religious denominations or communions: Provided further, that no rite or ceremony shall be performed in any portion of such Cemetery set apart for any particular denomination, except according to the usage of such denomination, and by a duly recognised Minister of the same." The Trustees of the said Cemetery, with the concurrence and approval of the Government, make and promulgate the following Rules and Regulations:—

Rules and Regulations.

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.
2. By the 7th section of the Act, "Any person making a vault, or erecting and placing a monument in the Cemetery, by and with the permission of the Trustees, and under these rules, and upon the payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to, and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons, and his or their heirs, or near relations for ever."
3. Application for such permission to be made at the office of the Trustees, a certificate of permission in the form set out in the schedule will be granted to the party applying for such permission, on payment of the charges in the schedule.

4. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such Cemetery on a certificate of a Minister of religion, or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the Trustees, that such person was a pauper, or that the relations and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.

5. Orders for interment to be given either to the keeper at the lodge, or at the office of the Trustees; if given at the office of the Trustees, such notice to be given between the hours of ten A.M. and three P.M. the previous day; if not, an extra charge will be made.

6. The Trustees will cause all common graves to be dug; but parties wanting brick graves or vaults, will be required to construct them under the direction of the Surveyor; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent (in writing) of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.

7. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death, of the deceased, must be stated at the time of giving the order.

8. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the Cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

9. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from ten A.M. to six o'clock P.M., in the months of September to April inclusive; and from ten A.M. to four o'clock P.M. in the other four months, except on Sundays, when the usual and only hours for funerals will be from two to five o'clock P.M. throughout the year.

10. All monuments, vaults, graves, and grave stones, to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

11. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron.

12. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription, to be submitted to the Trustees for approval, who are required by the 7th section of the Act, "To determine and fix the position of any unobjectionable monument according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said Cemetery in an appropriate manner." In the erection of tablets, copper cramps must be used.

13. No catacombs nor any wooden fencing allowed.

14. No servant or other person employed by, or engaged in any duty on behalf of the Trustees, will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

15. The ground will be open daily to the public from sunrise to sunset.

16. A plan of the Cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the office, and may be inspected at the charge set out in schedule; and registers of all grants are kept by the Secretary.

17. The keeper has orders to turn out or take into custody (as the case may require) any person who shall behave indecorously, or commit any trespass or injury to the trees, flowers, or erections, or otherwise infringe the Act of Council relating to the Cemetery, or the regulations for protection of the same; and such person will be proceeded against, according to the provisions of the 9th, 12th, and 13th sections of the Act.

18. The Trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations.

REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED IN THE HIRING OF IMMIGRANTS.

THE hiring of families and single men who arrive by a Government Immigrant Ship takes place in the Married Couples' Depôt; that of single women and widows without families, in the Single Females' Depôt.

MARRIED COUPLES' DEPÔT.

2. The families and single men are open for engagement in the Married Couples' Depôt between the hours of ten (10) o'clock A.M. and half past three (3½) o'clock P.M., on and after a day of which due notice is given, until the conclusion of the fourteen lay days allowed by the Charter Party. Those who have not been disposed of at the termination of the lay days are forwarded to one of the out ports.

3. Applications for servants at the Married Couples' Depôt should be made to the Overseer. It is his duty to point out such immigrants as are of the class sought for, and generally to assist employers in making the necessary arrangements. It is also his duty to see that no *unreasonable* engagement is made by an employer, and that no reasonable offer is refused by an immigrant.

4. If an unreasonable offer be made by an employer, the Overseer must report the circumstance to the Clerk in charge of the Depôt, whose duty it will be, in the first instance, to address the employer apart; and afterwards, if absolutely necessary, to warn and advise the immigrant.

5. All agreements are written out and registered by an Officer of the Immigration Department.

6. All immigrants are expected to take service; but those families or single men, who, from sufficient cause, decline to do so, are allowed to leave the Depôt as soon as the hiring commences. They must in every case take their baggage with them, and report their names and places of destination to the Overseer or Officer who superintends the hiring. No immigrant after leaving the Depôt is allowed to return without express permission from the Immigration Agent.

SINGLE FEMALES' DEPÔT.

7. The single women are open for engagement in the Single Females' Depôt between the hours of eleven (11) o'clock A.M. and two (2) o'clock P.M., on days of which due notice is given.

8. No person is admitted to the Single Females' Depôt to hire servants without an order, which may be obtained by personal application at the Immigration Office, during the usual hours of business.

9. Any employer, unknown to the Immigration Agent, may be required to bring an introduction from a respectable householder in Melbourne. No publican or lodging-house keeper is, on any pretence, permitted to hire servants at the Single Females' Depôt.

10. Applications for servants at the Single Females' Depôt should be made to the matron. It is her duty to point out those who are of the class sought for, and, generally, to assist employers in making agreements. She will report to the officer, who superintends the hiring, any *unreasonable* offers on the part of employers, or refusals by Immigrants of reasonable wages.

11. It is the duty of the officer who superintends the hiring, to prevent any unsuitable engagements being undertaken by women under twenty-one years of age, without the consent of their parents or guardians.

12. All agreements are written out and registered by an officer of the Immigration Department.

13. Single women who have parents in the Colony, or who, from some other cause, are unable to take service, are allowed to leave the Depôt with their baggage, between two (2) and three (3) o'clock, P.M.

GENERAL.

14. Any Immigrant who refuses a reasonable offer of service will cease to be maintained by the Government, and may be required to leave immediately. The fact of such refusal should be reported without delay.

15. With reference to clauses 3, 10, and 14, and for the guidance of employers and employed, certified lists of the current wages are posted in conspicuous places at the time of hiring.

16. Immigrants who have accepted service must leave the Depôts without delay, and cannot be re-admitted.

17. No person is allowed to visit the Depôts, except for the purpose of hiring servants, without especial permission.

18. No officer in the Immigration Department is permitted to engage servants for other persons, except under the special authority of the Immigration Agent.
