## VICTORIÆ REGINÆ.

By His Excellency Charles Joseph La Trobe, Esquire, Lieutenant Governor of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council.

## No. VI.

An Act for granting Duties of Customs in the Colony of Victoria. [Assented to 19th January, 1854.]

HEREAS it is expedient to amend the Law relating to the Duties Preamble. of Customs in the Colony of Victoria Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Licutenant Governor of the said Colony by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:

I. From and after the passing of this Act an Act of the Lieutenant Repeal of 16 Vic. No. Governor and Legislative Council of the said Colony of Victoria passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria intituled "An Act for granting Duties of Customs in the Colony of Victoria" shall be and the same is hereby repealed except as to any arrears of duty or damphage. of duty or drawback due or payable at any time before the passing of this

Act under the provisions of the said Act hereby repealed.

II. From and after the passing of this Act in lieu and instead Duties. of all other duties of Customs heretofore levied there shall be collected and paid to Her Majesty Her Heirs and Successors upon Goods Wares and Merchandize imported into the said Colony of Victoria, the several duties of Customs as the same are respectively inserted described and set forth in figures in the Table marked A to this Act annexed subject to the exemptions hereinafter contained.

III. A drawback of the whole of such duties shall be allowed for Remission of duties intended for the consumption of the Officers of Her Majesty's on Wines for Military and Naval Wines intended for the consumption of the Officers of Her Majesty's Troops serving in the said Colony of Victoria and of the Officers of Her Majesty's Navy serving on board any of Her Majesty's Ships in the seas adjoining thereto or such Wines may be landed on first importation or delivered out of bond free of duty subject to such regulations as the Lieutenant Governor of the said Colony may from time to the subsequently of subsequently sold behalf appoint: Provided that if any such Wines shall be subsequently for use of officers to be for-Her Majesty's Military or Naval Officers serving as aforesaid the same shall be forfeited and be liable to seizure accordingly.

IV. All Goods Wares and Merchandize imported into the said Remission of duties Colony

on Goods for Her Colony of Victoria for the supply of Her Majesty's Land or Sea Forces Majesty's service. or for the use of Her Majesty's Government shall be exempt from all duties and imposts of every description whatsoever

Goods in warehouse at the commence-ment of these duties deemed subject to them.

V. Any Goods Wares or Merchandize hereby liable to duty which shall have been warehoused without payment of duty upon the first importation thereof and which shall be in the warehouse at the time of the passing of this Act shall be deemed and taken to be liable to the duties hereby imposed.

Wine containing more than 25 per cent of alcohol to be deemed spirits.

VI. All wine containing more than twenty-five per cent of alcohol of the specific gravity of eight hundred and twenty-five at the temperature of sixty degrees according to Fahrenheit's thermometer shall be deemed

Duties to be levied according to Standard Weights and Measures.

spirits and charged with duty accordingly.

VII. All duties of Customs under this Act shall be imposed paid and received according to the Standard Weights and Measures by Law established and in all cases where such duties are imposed according to any specified quantity the same shall be deemed to apply in the same proportion to any greater or less quantity.
