6. If the Board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which, it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, deducted from the amount then due to the contractor by the party requiring it.

7. In the event of unnecessary delay, or failure of the contractor to supply the articles when required, they will be otherwise procured and charged in like manner.

8. A repetition of irregularity in the quality or quantity of supplies, or of any delay in delivering or replacing them, when required, will subject the contractor to the forfeiture of his contract.

9. CONDITIONS.

1. All the articles required by this notice are to be of the best quality of their several kinds.

Every licensed Boatman of Williamstown shall and is hereby required to wear a badge, having inscribed thereon his name and the number of his license, which badge he shall and is hereby required to wear firmly attached to the left breast of his coat, jacket, or other external body dress, in order that the same may be distinctly visible at all times during which he may be lawfully required to ply his boat.

The number of persons allowed to be in each boat shall depend on the dimensions thereof. Boats of five feet beam may carry (including the crew thereof) one person to every two feet length; one person additional will be allowed for

every additional six inches of beam, and one less for every six inches under five feet of beam. Each boat may carry eight pounds (8lbs.) weight of luggage or cargo for each person, or one hundred weight (1 cwt.) in lieu of each person short of the complement allowed.

Every Boatman shall be at liberty to charge double fare from 1st April to 30th September (if he shall be required to ply his boat between the hours of eight at night and six o'clock in the morning), and from the 1st October to the 31st March (if he shall be required to ply his boat between the hours of nine at night and five o'clock in the morning). Any crew consisting of four men, when required by any person or persons, shall be entitled to charge double fares.

Any person desirous of returning by a boat which he has engaged may do so by paying half fare, in which case he may detain the boat for fifteen minutes, and no longer, without incurring any extra charge; and any person detaining any boat over fifteen minutes, and under thirty minutes, shall pay two shillings (2s.), and so on for every additional quarter of an hour's detention.

Whenever a chequered flag is hoisted at the masthead of the Williamstown Flag Staff every Boatman may charge one-half more than the fares herein specified, and in foul weather, when a blue flag is hoisted, double fares.

Every licensed Boatman shall and is hereby required at all times to have a printed copy of the foregoing Table, or Rates, Fares and Regulations, ready to produce whenever he shall be required to exhibit the same to any person or persons who may have hired or engaged any duly licensed boat.
