PRISON BOUNDARIES OF THE HULK SACRAMENTO.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HOTHAM,
Knight Commander of the Most Honorable
Military Order of the Bath, Lieutenant
Governor of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c.,
&c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed by the
Lieutenant Governor and Legislative
Council of the Colony of Victoria, in the sixteenth
year of Her present Majesty's Reign, intituled,
"An Act to make provision for the better con-
trol and disposal of Offenders," it was
amongst other things enacted, that it should be
lawful for the Lieutenant Governor of the said
Colony to proclaim any Hulk or Floating Prison
to be used as a public Prison for the reception
and safe keeping of all Prisoners convicted and
sentenced for any offences by any Court of the
said Colony, and to define the limits and bounda-
ries in and around such hulk within which no
person shall come, and the place of embarking
and landing Prisoners to and from such Hulk,
and such Proclamation and the said limits and
boundaries from time to time to vary, alter, new
assign, and revoke; And whereas by a Proclama-
tion dated the 15th day of March, 1854, the
Hulk *Sacramento* was declared to be a public
Prison, and the limits and boundaries around the
same were thereby defined, which limits and
boundaries were altered by a Proclamation dated
the 26th day of July last past; And whereas
the said Hulk has been removed from its former
moorings, and is now moored within 300 fathoms
distance of the Lighthouse on Gellibrand's Point,
which bears S.W., the first red beacon at the
entrance of the River Yarra bearing N.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. :
Now therefore I, the Lieutenant Governor of the
said Colony, by virtue of the authority of the
said recited Act, do hereby revoke so much of
the said Proclamation of the 26th day of July
last past, as relates to the limits and boundaries
around the said Hulk *Sacramento*, and I do
hereby proclaim the limits and boundaries be-
tween which and the said Hulk no person shall
come, to be indicated and defined by four yellow

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painted buoys at right angles with each other,
each moored within one hundred yards of the
said Hulk; and that the place of landing and
embarking Prisoners to and from the said Hulk
shall be Gellibrand's Point aforesaid.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the
Colony, at Melbourne, this thirteenth
day of December, in the year of Our
Lord One thousand eight hundred and
fifty-four, and in the eighteenth year of
Her Majesty's Reign.

LICENSES TO WORK COAL FIELDS.

APPLICATION having been made to the Government by Charles Black, Esquire, on behalf of Richard Davis and John Watkins, the reputed discoverers of a workable coal field in the vicinity of Cape Paterson, for a lease of such portion of land in that locality as may lead to a thorough test of the usefulness of the discovery, and some doubt having arisen as to the power of the Local Government to grant more than annual licenses, and that such licenses should be offered by auction, the Lieutenant Governor has been pleased, pending the decision of the Right Honorable the Secretary of State (to whom application has been made respecting the leasing of mineral lands not auriferous), and with a view to determine without delay the actual benefit of this discovery, to order that annual licenses to occupy the sections of lands hereafter described and said to contain coal shall be put up to auction at an upset price of £10 per section.

The purchaser of the section now in the occupation of the said Charles Black shall pay over to the present occupant the value of his improvements; the amount whereof will be notified in the *Government Gazette* prior to sale.

BOUNDARIES OF SECTIONS.

Commencing at a point on the sea coast near Cape Paterson, where the Coal Creek enters the sea, thence on the south by the sea coast in a westerly direction to a road one chain wide, which is the eastern boundary of section 16; on the west by that road bearing north 43 chains; on the north by a line bearing west 79 chains; on

2. Messages must be written with ink, in a clear and legible manner, and bear a proper date, address and genuine signature.
3. Messages will be delivered free of charge within one mile of the Office, over that distance portorage will be charged; and messages to be delivered on shipboard, an extra charge to cover boat expenses will be made.
4. Messages will be transmitted in the order of their reception, and no precedence will be allowed in transmission, except for Government Despatches, the Police Service, and in cases of sickness or of death.
5. All messages will be held strictly confidential.
6. Payment of charges in advance will be required, except for replies to interrogatory messages on which may have been written the words, "Reply paid for."
7. To lessen as much as possible any liability to error in the transmission of messages from defective manuscript, it is desirable that the use of figures should be avoided, and that words at length be substituted; and the public in using the Electric Telegraph, are requested to be particular in giving a full and correct address to every message, so that no delay in delivery may occur.

SCALE OF CHARGES.

For any distance under ten (10) miles, one shilling and sixpence for the first ten words, and one penny for each additional word.
