WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, made and passed in the sixteenth year of the Reign of her present Majesty, intituled, "An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria," it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, from time to time, to proclaim and declare any such portion of the said Colony as to him should seem meet, as and to be a Road District for the purposes in the said Act contained, and also to define the boundaries of every Road District thereby pro-No. 2.—January 6th, 1854.—1.

HEREAS by a Proclamation made in pursuance of an Act of the Licutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the Reign of Her Majesty, intituled, "An Act to "alter the Laws relative to Jurors and Juries "in certain Districts," and bearing date the first day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-two, the Northern Circuit District therein mentioned, was declared and appointed to be a Special District under the provisions of the said Act; And whereas it is expedient to revoke the said Proclamation and to declare and appoint the Districts hereinafter mentioned to be Special Districts under the provisions aforesaid; And whereas by a Proclamation bearing even date herewith, certain Districts were appointed and defined in and for which amongst others the several County Courts of Castlemaine, Kyneton, Sandhurst, Heathcote, and Beechworth, should be holden: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant Governor aforcsaid, with the advice of the Executive Council. and by virtue of the powers vested in me in that behalf, do hereby revoke the said first mentioned Proclamation, and do declare and appoint the districts severally aforesaid to be "Special Districts," under the provisions of the said Act; And I do hereby direct, limit, and appoint, that the said Jury List for the Special District of the County Court of Castlemaine shall be prepared and published on or before the tenth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, and shall be corrected, revised, and recorded on or before the twelfth day of the said month of January, and that the Jurors' Books shall be made therefrom on or before the thirteenth day of the said month January, and that such Jurors' Books shall be brought into use and be used in and for the said District from and after the thirteenth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four; And I do hereby direct, limit, and appoint, that the said Jury Lists for the Special Districts of the County Courts of Sandhurst, Heathcote, and Becchworth, shall be prepared and published on or before the fifteenth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, and shall be corrected, revised, and recorded respectively on or before the nineteenth day of the said month of January, and that the Jurors' Books shall be made therefrom respectively on or

before the twentieth day of the said month of January, and that such several Jurors' Books shall be brought into use and be used in and for the said Districts respectively from and after the said twentieth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four; And I do hereby direct, limit, and appoint that the said Jury Lists for the Special District of Kyneton aforesaid shall be prepared and published on or before the first day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, and shall be corrected, revised, and recorded, on or before the first day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, and that the Jurors' Book shall be made therefrom on or before the third day of the said month of March, and that such Jurors' Book shall be brought into use and shall be used from and after the said third day of March aforesaid.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency CHARLES JOSEPH LA TROBE, Esquire, Lieutenant Governor of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation bearing date the third day of January, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fiftythree, it was, amongst other things declared and appointed, that certain County Courts, to be called respectively the North Eastern County Court, the Northern County Court, and the Western County Court, should be established and holden in and for the several portions of the Colony therein particularly described; And whereas it is expedient to alter the said County Courts, and the names thereof, and the portions of the said Colony in and for which they shall have jurisdiction, and the boundaries thereof respectively, and to appoint that other and additional County Courts be established and holden as hereinafter mentioned: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant Governor aforesaid, by virtue of the powers vested in me in that behalf, do hereby alter the said County Courts, and the names thereof, and the portions of the said Colony in and for which they shall have jurisdiction, and the limits thereof as hereinafter mentioned; And I do further, by virtue of the powers vested in me in that behalf, declare and appoint that the several County Courts hereinafter mentioned shall be established and holden in and for the respective portions of the said Colony, including counties and parts of counties hereinafter described, that is to say :-

The County Court of CASTLEMAINE in the said Proclamation described as the Northern County Court to be holden in and for that portion of the said Colony of which the boundaries are hereby defined as follows: that is to say—Commencing at the source of the River Avoca in the Great Dividing Range, near Mount

Cole; thence by that Range and the boundaries of the county of Talbot to the most northern part of the said county, north of Mount Alexander; thence by a line westerly to the junction of McNeil's Creek with the River Loddon at Thalack Thalack; thence by the Rivers Loddon and Murray to the western boundary of the township reserve of Castle Donnington, including the whole of that reserve; thence by a line south-easterly to Lake Bael Bael and the River Avoca, and by that river to its source in the Great Dividing Range aforesaid.

The County Court of SANDHURST to be holden

in and for that portion of the said Colony of which the boundaries are hereby defined as follows: that is to say—Commencing at the junction of McNeil's Creek with the River Loddon, at Thalack Thalack; thence by a line easterly to the most northern point of the county of Talbot, north of Mount Alexander; thence by the Mount Alexander Range and the Myrtle Creek to the confluence of that creek with the River Coliban, being part of the boundary of the said county; thence by the River Coliban to its confluence with the River Campaspe; by the Rivers Campaspe and Murray to the River Loddon; and by that river upwards to the junction of McNeil's

Creek aforesaid. The County Court of HEATHCOTE to be holden in and for that portion of the said Colony of which the boundaries are hereby defined as follows: that is to say—Commencing at the confluence of the Rivers Campaspe and Coliban; thence by a line south-easterly to the source of the McIvor or Patterson's Creek, above John Hunter l'atterson's sheep station; thence by a line north-easterly to the confluence of Hughes' Creek with the River Goulburn, and by that river to the Murray; thence by the River Murray to its confluence with the River Campaspe, and by the River Campaspe upwards to the confluence of the Rivers Campaspe and Coliban aforesaid.

The County Court of BEECHWORTH to be holden in and for that portion of the said Colony of which the boundaries are hereby defined as follows: that is to say-Commencing at the source of the most eastern branch of the Broken River, in the Great Dividing Range, near Mount Bullen; thence by that river, including the whole of the township reserve of Benalla, to the junction of the Broken Creek; thence by that creek to its confluence with the Back Creek; thence by a line north to the River Murray; by that river up to its source in the Australian Alps, and the Great Dividing Range, to the source of the most castern branch of the Broken River, near Mount Bullen aforesaid.

The County Court of KYNETON to be holden in and for that part of the County of Dalhousie the boundaries whereof are hereby defined as follows: Commencing at the source of the River Coliban in the Great Dividing Range; thence by that river to its confluence with the River Campaspe; thence by a line south-easterly to the source of the McIvor or Patterson's Creek; thence by a line southerly to the confluence of Mollison's Creek and William's Creek; and thence by William's Creek to its source in the Great Dividing Range; and by that range to the source of the River Coliban aforesaid.

of Anglesea, and in and for that portion of the County of Dalhousie the boundaries whereof are hereby defined as follows: that is to say-Commencing at the source of William's Creek in the Great Dividing Range, thence by that creek to its confluence with Mollison's Creek; and thence by a line northerly to the source of the McIvor or Patterson's Creek; thence by a line northeasterly to the confluence of the River Goulburn with Hughes' Creek; thence by the River Goulburn upwards to where it is joined by the Dabyminga Creek; and thence by that creek to its source in the Dividing Range; and by that range to the source of William's Creek aforesaid. And in and for all that part of the District of Murray of which the limits are hereby defined to be as follows, that is to say: Commencing at the source of the most eastern branch of the Broken River in the Great Dividing Range, near Mount Bullen; thence by that river, excepting the Township Reserve of Benalla, to the Broken Creek, by that creek to the junction of the Back Creek; thence by a line northerly to the Murray; by the Rivers Murray and Goulburn, and the northern boundaries of the Counties of Anglesca and Evelyn to the Great Dividing Range; thence along the Great Dividing Range to the source of the Broken River, near Mount Bullen aforesaid, being the commencing point.

The County Court of PORTLAND to be holden in and for the Counties of Normanby and Follett, in the said Colony.

PARIS INDUSTRIAL EXHIBITION. OF 1855.

Downing-street, 9th May, 1853. SIR,-At the request of the French Ambassa dor at this Court, I have to acquaint you that a Universal Exhibition for Agricultural and Industrial Products will be held at Paris in May, 1855; and that every facility will be afforded at the French Custom Houses to the admission of goods belonging to parties residing in the British Colonies, who may be desirous of forwarding . articles for exhibition.

I shall have the honor of communicating to you further particulars on this subject so soon as the necessary arrangements shall have been com-pleted by the French Government.

SIR,-With reference to my Circular Despatch of the 9th May, I have further to communicate to you the liberal intentions of the Government of His Imperial Majesty the Emperor of the French, respecting the admission of foreign pro-hibited goods to the Great Industrial Exhibition at Paris in May, 1855.

His Majesty's Government have decided that all foreign prohibited goods may be admitted for exhibition, and may be afterwards either re-exported free of all duties, or may be sold in France upon the payment of an ad valorem duty at the rate of thirty per cent.

AMENDED REGULATION RESPECTING LICENSES TOCUT TIMBER ON CROWN LANDS.

WITH reference to the Regulations dated the 6th July, 1852, relating to the issue of Licenses to Cut Timber on Crown Lands, it is hereby notified for general information that with respect to the issue of such Licenses within the Settled Districts, the boundaries of which Districts are specified below, the eighth clause of the said Regulations shall be held to be cancelled on and after the 1st January, 1854, and the following clause substituted in lieu thereof.

FEES.

"VIII. The Fee for a License to Cut and "remove Firewood shall be £8 per annum, and "for a Sawyer and Splitter £10, which sum "must be paid to the Crown Commissioner "receivable to the Crown Commissioner" "previously to the issue of the License."
