PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Charles Joseph La Trobe, Esquire, Lieutenant Governor of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

HEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the Reign of Her Majesty, intituled, "An "Act to make provision for the better control "and disposal of Offenders," it is amongst other things enacted, That it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor of the said Colon the Licutenant Governor of the said Colony to proclaim any Hulk or Floating Prison to be used as a public Prison for the reception and safe keeping of all Prisoners convicted and sentenced for any offences, by any Court of the said Colony, and to define the limits and boundaries in and around such Hulk, within which no person shall come, and the place of embarking and landing Pri-soners to and from such Hulk; And whereas it is expedient that the vessel now called and known as the Lysander should be converted into a Hulk, and should be and be declared to be a Public Prison, and the limits and boundaries thereof should be the same limits and boundaries as were assigned to the Deborah Hulk by Proclamation dated the first day of February, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-three: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant Governor aforesaid, by virtue of the said in part recited Act, and in furtherance of the power and authority thereby in me vested, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim that the vessel called the Lysander, now moored within the limits and boundaries of the Hulk Deborah, to the northward of the Lighthouse, Gellibrand's Point, in the said Colony of Victoria, shall be used as a Public Prison for the reception and safe custody of Prisoners, and that the limits and boundaries in and around the said Hulk Deborah, and the place of landing and embarking Prisoners to and from the said Hulk as already No. 23.—MARCH 21st, 1854.—1.

proclaimed, shall include and be applicable to the said Lysander as if the same were herein repeated.

RESERVES FROM LEASE OF CROWN

ELECTRIC TELEGRAPH.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant Governor hereby sanctions the following Arrangements and Scale of Charges for the use, by the Public generally, of the Electric Telegraph between Melbourne and Williamstown, to take effect on and after Monday, the 13th of March.

MELBOURNE.

1. Messages must be written with ink, in a clear and legible manner, and bear a proper date, address, and genuine signature.

2. Messages will be delivered free of charge within one mile of either of the Offices; over that distance porterage will be charged, and on Messages to be delivered on shipboard in Hobson's Bay an extra charge (to cover boat expenses) will be made.

3. Messages will be transmitted in the order of their reception, and no precedence will be allowed in transmission, except for Government despatches, the police service, and in cases of death.

4. All messages will be held strictly confidential. 5. Payment of charges in advance will be re-

quired in all cases.

6. Scale of Charges.—For any message under ten words, exclusively of the date, address, and signature (which are not charged for), two shillings and sixpence, and for each additional word threepence.

The only offices for the receipt and delivery of messages are situated at the corner of Williamstreet and Little Bourke-street, in Melbourne, and at Williamstown, and will be open for the transaction of business between the hours of 9 A.M., and 6 P.M., daily (Sundays excepted).

NOTICE is hereby given that the Government Assay Office, in La Trobe-street west, Melbourne, is now open to receive Gold for smelting and assay, subject to the following regulations :-

1. Deposits of crude gold will be received every day, except Saturdays, between the hours of

eleven and two.

2. Each parcel of gold so received will be weighed in the presence of the owner, or his agent, depositing the same at the Office, who will be required to sign the Deposit Book in which an entry of the particulars of the parcel is made, and will receive a corresponding deposit receipt, and the gold when assayed will be delivered to the person producing the deposit receipt. The individual depositing will, in every case, be taken to be the original owner of the gold.

3. Persons wishing to transmit gold per Escort to be passed through the Assay Office, are required to write in distinct characters on the outside of the parcel the words "For Assay." Parcels so directed will immediately on arrival in Melbourne be deposited at the Government Assay. Office, and as soon as assayed will be deliverable in the form of bar at the Assay Office instead of the Gold Office, on production of the receipt and the owner's name.

4. The delivery of assayed gold will be made either at the Assay Office or at one of the Banks with which arrangements for that purpose may

have been made by the depositor.

5. The detention at the Assay Office will in general be about three days, and will rarely exceed a week.

6. All parcels received at the Assay Office will be melted down and cast into bars and stamped with the Government Stamp, specifying the weight and fineness. The Delivery Notes will also specify the equivalent in British standard for facility of calculating the relief for facility of calculating the value.

7. The fineness will be expressed according to the decimal system now adopted at the Bank of England. For the guidance of those to whom the new system is not familiar, the fineness will also, for the present, be marked in carats.

8. According to the decimal system, fine gold is expressed as 1000-0, and standard gold of 22 carats as 916-6; gold of 12 carats would be 500-0; gold of 23 carats 958-3, and so on.

9. Upon each parcel of gold deposited, if not exceeding 50 oz. in weight, the Government charge will be 5 dwts. of gold taken from the bar: upon all parcels exceeding 50 oz., the charge will be one-half per cent.

10. Deficits will be allowed for at the rate of

Notice to Masters of Vessels.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Rates of Pilotage imposed on Ships arriving at or departing from any of the Ports of this Colony, or from any one part of a Port to any other, by the Act of Council, 16 Victoria, No. 12, will, from and after the publication of this Notice, be enforced as to all ships using or resorting to Port Fairy, with such exemptions as by law are allowed.

Schedule A of 16 Victoria, No. 12. Pilotage Rates.

"Ships arriving at, or departing from any of the Ports of the said Colony (of Victoria), " shall be charged a Pilotage rate of threepence " per ton, registered tonnage, such charge not to " be more than fifteen pounds, nor less than two
pounds and ten shillings for Pilotage in the " Port of Port Albert, nor than four pounds in " any other Port of the said Colony. An addi-"tional rate of one penny halfpenny per ton "will be charged if a Pilot of the Ports of Melbourne or Geelong be taken outside a line
between Points Nepean and Lonsdale, the
whole of the Pilotage rates in no case exceeding twenty pounds. Ships taking a Pilot
between the Ports of Melbourne and Geelong
shall be subject to half the first mentioned
charges.

"Ships returning to Port within forty-eight" hours after having been piloted to sea, and "ships towed, one-half only of the above rates."

Exemptions.

"All ships outfitting to or refitting from the fisheries.

"All ships employed in the coasting trade, "and all ships regularly trading between any "Port of the said Colony of Victoria, and of "any of the Colonies of New South Wales, Van "Diemen's Land, New Zealand, Western and "South Australia, and ships under fifty tons of "register measurement, are exempt from Pi"lotage, unless the services of a Pilot shall have been actually required and received. If a "Pilot be taken, the full rate of Pilotage shall be payable."

GOLD REGULATIONS.

IIS Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to authorise the promulgation of the following Regulations, and to direct that all Regulations previously published respecting the issue of Licenses shall be cancelled, with the exception of those provisions which are embodied in the Regulations now published.

None but Lessecs or Licensecs under the Act 17 Victoria, No. 4, entitled to mine for gold.

No person who is not the holder of a Lesse or License under the Act 17 Vic. No. 4, intituled, "An Act for the better management of the "Gold Fields of Victoria," will be permitted to mine for gold or employ any person to mine for gold in any land whatsoever in the Colony of

Victoria

· Penalties.

No person, unless provided with a Lease or License under the aforesaid Act, will be permitted to carry on or follow any business, or become resident upon any of the Gold Fields, or Gold Mines or Waste Lands of the Crown, under penalties as follow, viz.:—

For the first offence, a sum not exceeding five pounds. For the second offence, a sum not exceeding fifteen pounds nor less than five pounds. And for the third and every subsequent offence, a sum not exceeding thirty pounds nor less than fifteen pounds.

Exceptions.
With the exception of—

1st. Holders of any License or Lease for pastoral purposes, within the limits of their own runs.

2nd. Officiating Ministers of Religion and Schoolmasters.

3rd. The servants of such holders, Ministers and Schoolmasters, residing with and being in their actual employment respectively.

in their actual employment respectively.

4th. The servants residing with and being in the actual employment of holders of Licenses to carry on the business of storekeepers.

5th. All females not mining or trading, and children under fourteen years of age who shall only reside, but not mine, on any Gold Field.

All persons recited in the four first divisions of the above exceptions will on application to the Commissioners of the Gold Fields, or their assistants, be provided with Exemption Tickets, without which they will be liable to the penalties provided by the Act for unauthorised occupation of Crown Lands.

Those recited in the 5th division, however, need not be so provided with Exemption Tickets.

Licenses to Mine.

Licenses to mine will be issued by the Commisioners for the Gold Fields and their Assistants, for the periods, and at rates, as follow:—

For One month...... One pound
Three months ... Two pounds
Six months Four pounds
Twelve months ... Eight pounds.

Licenses for Storekeepers.

Licenses to carry on business as Storekeepers will be issued for periods, and at rates, as follow:—

For Three months... Fifteen pounds
Six months.... Twenty-five pounds
Twelve months Fifty pounds.

Licenses to take effect from date of issue.

The Licenses will have effect from the date of issue, and are available throughout the Colony of Victoria.

All persons required to take out Licenses are held obliged to do so with all possible dispatch after arrival on the Gold Fields, and to produce them whenever demanded by any duly authorised person.

Leases

Leases will only be granted within such tracts of auriferous land as shall be from time to time proclaimed in the Government Gazette as open to lease subject to the charges specified in the Act, and such considerations as His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, may be pleased to publish, and no applications to lease auriferous lands will be entertained unless for portions of land so proclaimed.

Portions of land which it may be so intended to lease will, after being surveyed, be described as open to applications for Leases at the expiration of not less than six months after the date of such Proclamation, and any applications which may be received will be published in the Government Gazette, and the Leases submitted to public competition and sold to the highest bidder.

Leases of quartz veins will be granted, and

Leases of quartz veins will be granted, and the extent so leased will be not greater than one mile in length of the vein. On application beingmade for lease of any portion of a quartz vein, the same will be put up to public auction, and the Lease granted to the highest bidder subject to such terms as shall be made known previous to sale, in addition to the royalty cited in the Act.

Licenses and Exemption Certificates.

Licenses and Exemption Certificates are not transferable, and any person using or exhibiting a License or Exemption Certificate originally granted to any other person, or altering any such License or Certificate, with a view to defraud the revenue, shall be subject to the penalties provided for such cases in the Act.

Extent of Claim.

The extent of claim to which each License to mine shall entitle the holder shall be:—

For One miner, 12 feet x 12, or 144 square feet.

"Two miners, 12 ", x 24, or 288 ", ",

"Three ", 18 ", x 24, or 482 ", ",

"Four ", 24 ", x 24, or 576 ", ",

beyond which no greater area will be granted under License, except that where it can be proved to the satisfaction of the Commissioners of the Gold Fields, or their assistants, that two or more parties of miners taking up claims in the usual manner on worked or flooded ground, can by combining, overcome any natural difficulties which may exist, by means not detrimental to the interests of the public or of other Licensees, the Commissioners or their assistants may at their discretion authorise such amalgamation, under the distinct condition that the ground must be worked by the same number of miners, as would be required were it divided into the smaller claims.

Any such amalgamated party must be in possession of a written sanction, to be produced when required.

Disputes.

All disputes connected with the occupation of lands held under Lease or License, whether for mining or other purposes, shall be decided by the Commissioners for the Gold Fields or their assistants.

No Claims to be held in Reserve.

No miner or party of miners can, at one and the same time, work more than one claim, or hold such claim in reserve or unworked; and such proceeding will be considered as a relinquishment of right to any claim however much previously worked, unless satisfactory reason, such as sickness or some other urgent cause, can be shewn to the Commissioner, on the claim becoming a subject of dispute.

Claims not allowed to interfere with public interests.

No claim will be allowed or granted on any ground the working or occupation of which the Commissioners or their assistants shall consider injurious to the interests of the public, such as the interference with the supply of water requisite to the wants of the public, the undermining or digging up of roads, or the crection of stores, tents, or buildings, which may obstruct desirable thoroughfares or interfere with mining.

Sluice Washing.

Sluice washing will be permitted at running streams, and no sluice washing will be allowed except by special sanction of the Commissioners or their assistants, who will guard against conferring the privilege in places where the perma-

nent supply of water may be injured by the operation.

When a party of miners have obtained permission for sluice washing, they must procure a written sanction from the Commissioner, which is to be produced when required by competent authority.

Permission to work Beds of Creeks and Water Holes.

Where the working and clearing of beds of creeks or water holes would be no injury to the public, the Commissioners in charge of the Gold Fields may grant permission to parties of miners to undertake the same. The portion of such beds of creeks or water holes allowed to each miner will be ten yards in length, irrespective of the breadth.

The Commissioner in charge will have power to impose such conditions relative to the working of such beds of creeks and water holes as the interests of the public may require, and if deemed expedient, to take a doposit from each miner to ensure the due performance of the same.

Half an Acre of Garden Ground may be granted to Annual Licensees.

Where it is practicable, the Commissioners may grant to holders of Annual Licenses (on ground not supposed to be auriferous, but in the immediate vicinity of the Gold Field on which such holder resides) land not exceeding half an acre in extent for the purposes of cultivation.
