NOTICE is hereby given that the Government Assay Office, in La Trobe-street west, Melbourne, is now open to receive Gold for smelting and assay, subject to the following regulations:—

1. Deposits of crude gold will be received every day, except Saturdays, between the hours of eleven and two.

2. Each parcel of gold so received will be weighed in the presence of the owner, or his agent, depositing the same at the Office, who will be required to sign the Deposit Book in which an entry of the particulars of the parcel is made, and will receive a corresponding deposit receipt, and the gold when assayed will be delivered to the person producing the deposit receipt. The individual depositing will, in every case, be taken to be the original owner of the gold.

3. Persons wishing to transmit gold per Escort to be passed through the Assay Office, are required to write in distinct characters on the outside of the parcel the words "For Assay." Parcels so directed will immediately on arrival in Melbourne be deposited at the Government Assay Office, and as soon as assayed will be deliverable in the form of bar at the Assay Office instead of the Gold Office, on production of the receipt and the owner's name.

4. The delivery of assayed gold will be made either at the Assay Office or at one of the Banks with which arrangements for that purpose may have been made by the depositor.

5. The detention at the Assay Office will in general be about three days, and will rarely exceed a week.

6. All parcels received at the Assay Office will be melted down and cast into bars and stamped with the Government Stamp, specifying the weight and fineness. The Delivery Notes will also specify the equivalent in British standard for facility of calculating the value.

7. The fineness will be expressed according to the decimal system now adopted at the Bank of England. For the guidance of those to whom the new system is not familiar, the fineness will also, for the present, be marked in carats.

8. According to the decimal system, fine gold is expressed as 1000-0, and standard gold of 22 carats as 916-6; gold of 12 carats would be 500-0; gold of 23 carats 958-3, and so on.

9. Upon each parcel of gold deposited, if not exceeding 50 oz. in weight, the Government charge will be 5 dwts. of gold taken from the bar: upon all parcels exceeding 50 oz., the charge will be one-half per cent.

10. Deficits will be allowed for at the rate of £3 17s. per ounce standard.
