ROAD FROM MELBOURNE TO MOUNT ALEXANDER—PROPOSED DEVIATION NEAR CARLSRUHE.

NOTICE is hereby given that a Map and Survey Plan, describing the exact course and bearings of, and the admeasurements required for, an alteration proposed to be made by the Central Road Board in the line of Road leading from Melbourne to Mount Alexander, near Carlsruhe, together with a description of the lands through which the same is proposed to pass, and the names of the owners and occupiers thereof, so far as they are known, have been deposited in the office of the Surveyor General, Melbourne.
