## CLOSING THE OLD CEMETERY, MELBOURNE.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Officer administering the Government of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed by the Colonial Legislature of New South Wales, in the fourteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for the establishment and regulation by Trustees of a General Cemetery near the City of Melbourne," it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Superintendent or Officer administering the Government of Port Phillip for the time being, by Proclamation, in the *Government Gazette*, to order that the Burial Ground then used by the inhabitants of the said City of Melbourne, or such part or parts thereof as it might be considered advisable or expedient to close, should be thenceforth closed, and that thereafter no burial or burials should be allowed to be made in such Burial Ground, or such part or parts thereof as should be mentioned in the said Proclamation: Provided always that nothing in the now reciting Act contained should be construed to extend to any vaults or enclosed portions of land in the said Burial Ground which at the time of the passing of the now reciting Act should be the private property of any person or persons whomsoever. And whereas it is deemed expedient that the said Burial Ground should be closed: Now therefore I, JOHN VESEY FITZGERALD FOSTER, the Officer Administering the Government as aforesaid, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested by the said recited Act, and of all and every other power and authority in any wise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby order and proclaim that the Burial Ground, commonly called and known by the name of the "Old Cemetery," used by the inhabitants of the City of Melbourne, in the said Colony of Port Phillip (now called and known as Victoria), shall, from and after the thirtieth day of this present month of June, be closed, and that thereafter no burial or burials shall be

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allowed to be made in any part of the said Burial Ground or Cemetery: Provided always that nothing herein contained shall extend to any vaults or enclosed portions of land in the said burial ground which, at the time of the passing of the said recited Act, were the private property of any person or persons whomsoever.

*Country and Special Lots put up and not bid for, may be claimed without competition.*

9. Lands of the Third class, namely, Country Lots, including such as are designated "Special Country Lots," which may have been exposed to public competition, at auction, subsequent to the date hereof, but not sold, may be had at their upset price by the person or persons who may first apply and pay for them at the Colonial Treasury; but such applications will not be entertained until one month from the day allowed for paying the balances of each sale has expired. This regulation, however, does not extend to Town or Suburban Allotments, nor to any land that may be held under license from the Crown, until the expiration of such license.
