INDULGENCE OF THIRTY DAYS FOR RUSSIAN VESSELS TO DEPART.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HOTHAM, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Military Order of the Bath, Lieutenant Governor of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Order of Her Majesty in Council of the seventh day of April last it was ordered,—

“ That Russian merchant vessels which, at the time of the publication of this Order, should be in any ports or places in Her Majesty’s Indian territories, under the Government of the East India Company, or within any of Her Majesty’s foreign or colonial possessions, should be allowed Thirty Days from the time of the publication of this Order in such Indian territories, or foreign or colonial possession, for loading their cargoes and departing from such ports or places, and that such Russian merchant vessels, if met at sea by any of Her Majesty’s ships, should be permitted to continue their voyage, if on examination of their papers it should appear that their cargoes were taken on board before the expiration of the above term: Provided that nothing herein contained should extend, or be taken to extend to Russian vessels having on board any officer in the military or naval service of the enemy, or any article prohibited or contraband of war, or any despatch of or to the Russian Government.”

And it was further ordered, “ That any Russian merchant vessel which, prior to the twentieth day of March now last past, should have sailed from any foreign port bound for any port or place in any of Her Majesty’s Indian territories or foreign or colonial possessions, should be permitted to enter such port or place, and to discharge her cargo, and afterwards forthwith to depart without molestation; and that any such vessel, if met at sea by any of Her Majesty’s ships, should be permitted to continue her voyage to any port not blockaded.”

And it was also ordered, “ That all Governors, Officers, and authorities whom it may concern, in Her Majesty’s East Indian, foreign, and colonial possessions, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them respectively may appertain.”

Now I, the Lieutenant Governor of Victoria, as aforesaid, in pursuance of the said Order in Council, do hereby direct that any Russian merchant vessels which are now in any ports or places in the said Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, shall be allowed Thirty Days from and after Monday, the *Seventeenth* day of July now current, inclusively, for loading their cargoes and departing from all such ports or places. And I hereby direct the Collector of Customs and the Chief Port and Harbor Master of the said Colony to adopt all necessary measures herein; and I also direct and charge all persons in authority, and all Her Majesty’s faithful subjects, to aid and assist in giving effect to the said Order in Council.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this fifteenth day of July, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, and in the eighteenth year of Her Majesty’s Reign.

SALUT—

COMME le Gouvernement de Sa Majesté Impériale l'Empereur des Français nous a communiqué qu'une Exposition des Produits de l'Agriculture et de l'Industrie aurait lieu à Paris au mois de Mai de l'an Mil huit cent cinquante cinq, et comme le Secrétaire en Chef des Colonies de Sa Majesté, dans ses deux Dépêches du 9 Mai et du 18 Juillet de l'an Mil huit cent cinquante trois, a annoncé que toutes les facilités seraient accordées par les Douanes Françaises à l'introduction des objets appartenant aux personnes demeurant dans les Colonies Britanniques qui désireraient contribuer à l'Exposition, et que le Gouvernement de Sa Majesté Impériale a décidé que tous les objets de contrebande venant de l'étranger seraient admis à l'Exposition, et pourraient être ré-exportés sans payer de droits après la clôture de l'Exposition, ou pourraient être vendus en France en payant un droit *ad valorem* de trente pour cent; et comme il a été proposé de nommer des Commissaires pour choisir et transmettre en France les objets représentant les produits et les manufactures de la Colonie de Victoria qui seront jugés dignes d'être exposés: Sachez que, reposant toute confiance en votre savoir et en votre expérience, par ces présentes nous vous constituons et nous vous nommons, vous, John Vesey Fitzgerald Foster, Hugh Culling Eardley Childers, James Frederick Palmer, Redmond Barry, Andrew Clarke, Augustus Frederick Adolphus Greeves, William Henry Wright, Frederick Armand Powlett, Charles Pasley, George William Rusden, Godfrey Howitt, John Hutchinson, Charles James Griffith, William McCrea, Ferdinand Müller, Mark Nicholson, Joseph Anderson Panton, et Alfred R. C. Selwyn, nos Commissaires pour régler et mettre à exécution les détails nécessaires pour faciliter la transmission en France des produits et des manufactures de notre Colonie de Victoria, destinés à paraître à l'Exposition Universelle des Produits de l'Agriculture et de l'Industrie, à Paris, le mois de Mai, mil huit cent cinquante cinq; et pour vous aider dans l'exécution de ces présentes, nous nommons nos fidèles et bien-aimés MM. Andrew Clarke et John Hutchinson Secrétaires Honoraires de la dite Commission; et par ces présentes, nous vous donnons et accordons, ainsi qu'à trois ou plusieurs d'entre vous, le pouvoir et l'autorité nécessaires pour effectuer les projets de notre dite Commission par tous les moyens légaux. En outre, nous ordonnons et commandons que de temps à autre vous communiquiez le procès-verbal de vos séances à Son Excellence le Lieutenant Gouverneur, ou le fonctionnaire faisant les fonctions de Gouverneur de notre dite Colonie, et que vous lui soumettiez toutes les mesures que vous jugerez nécessaires pour son approbation avant de les exécuter. Et enfin, par ces présentes nous ordonnons que nos dits Commissaires, ou que trois ou plusieurs d'entre eux, pourront de temps à autre, et en tout lieu, agir en toutes choses indiquées dans la présente Commission, nonobstant leur ajournement de temps à autre.

AVIS AU PUBLIC.

Son Excellence le Lieutenant Gouverneur ayant nommé des Commissaires pour choisir, préparer, ordonner, et transmettre les objets destinés à représenter les ressources industrielles de la Colonie de Victoria, à l'Exposition Universelle des Produits de l'Agriculture et de l'Industrie de Paris, dans le mois de Mai, 1855, et le Conseil Législatif ayant voté la somme de 3,000 livres sterling pour défrayer les dépenses nécessaires, les Commissaires prient instamment les habitants de la Colonie de les aider cordialement dans le but qu'ils se proposent, car sans leur co-opération empressée et bienveillante tous les efforts et toute l'énergie des Commissaires seront insuffisants pour faire représenter dignement les produits de l'industrie de la Colonie de Victoria à l'Exposition prochaine.

L'importance d'exposer à Paris des échantillons de l'industrie, ainsi que des produits naturels de ce pays, est apparente, non seulement comme science et comme curiosité, mais encore comme utilité pratique, qui, en développant dans ce pays ses propres ressources, ne peut manquer d'exercer une influence étendue et salutaire dans ses arts, son commerce, et ses progrès matériels et sociaux.

L'exposition d'objets rares et curieux en Histoire Naturelle non seulement intéresse et instruit, mais en excitant l'esprit de recherche conduit à de nouvelles découvertes, dont les résultats ajouteront quelque chose de plus à l'avancement des applications utiles et aux agréments de la vie.

L'état actuel des affaires en Europe ne doit pas arrêter nos efforts. L'Angleterre sait protéger son commerce, et malgré ce qui peut se passer dans les Etats de l'Orient de l'Europe, Paris ne cessera pas d'être le centre de la Paix, et le soutien des Beaux Arts et de l'Industrie.

Par la manière dont on répondra à cet appel—par la position qu'elle prendra dans la lutte prochaine, lutte non d'intérêts contraires, mais d'une émulation franche et généreuse—la Colonie de Victoria sera jugée. Ce n'est pas en prodiguant de tous côtés ses richesses étonnantes, pur accident d'un jour, mais par la manière dont elle profite de ses ressources naturelles, que le monde décidera si son peuple a fait un digne usage des riches dons de la nature.

Les Commissaires sentent que du zèle que les colonistes déployeront dans leurs efforts, et dans leur co-opération avec eux, dépendra s'il sera en leur pouvoir de démontrer aux yeux du monde que, sans négliger nos propres intérêts, nous contribuons tout en notre pouvoir à l'avancement de la race humaine. C'est à Paris en 1855 que la Colonie de Victoria sera jugée digne ou indigne de la position qu'elle occupe parmi les pays de l'Hémisphère Méridionale.

PRISON BOUNDARIES OF THE HULK
PRESIDENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HOTHAM,
Knight Commander of the Most Honorable
Military Order of the Bath, Lieutenant
Governor of the Colony of Victoria and its
Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed by the Colo-
nial Legislature of Victoria, in the
sixteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled,
"An Act to make provision for the better con-
trol and disposal of Offenders," it was
amongst other things enacted, that it should be
lawful for the Lieutenant Governor of the said
Colony to proclaim any Hulk or Floating Prison
to be used as a public Prison for the reception
and safe keeping of all Prisoners convicted and
sentenced for any offences by any Court of the
said Colony, and to define the limits and bounda-
ries in and around such Hulk within which no
person shall come, and the place of embarking
and landing Prisoners to and from such Hulk,
and such Proclamation and the said limits and
boundaries from time to time to vary, alter, new
assign, and revoke; And whereas by a Proclama-
tion dated the 1st day of February, 1853, the
Hulk *President* was declared to be a public
Prison, and the limits and boundaries around the
same were thereby defined; And whereas the
said Hulk has been removed from its former
moorings, and is now moored within two cables'
length of the Lighthouse on Gellibrand's Point,
which bears S. 22° W., the outer end of the stone-
work of the new Jetty bearing N. 73° W.: Now
therefore I, the Lieutenant Governor as aforesaid,
by virtue of the authority of the said recited
Act, do hereby revoke so much of the said Pro-
clamation of the first day of February, 1853, as
relates to the limits and boundaries around the
said Hulk *President*, and I do hereby proclaim
the limits and boundaries between which and the
said Hulk no person shall come, to be indicated
and defined by four Buoys at right angles with
each other, each moored within one hundred
yards of the said Hulk, the two outer or northern
Buoys being painted black, and the other two
painted yellow; and that the place of landing
and embarking Prisoners to and from the said
Hulk shall be Gellibrand's Point aforesaid.

CITY COUNCIL OF MELBOURNE.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, 14 Victoria, No. 20, intituled, "An Act for regulating the formation, drainage, and repair of streets, courts, and alleys on private property within the City of Melbourne," it is amongst other things enacted, that where any street, court, or alley, on private property, in the City of Melbourne, shall not be, or shall not have been sufficiently paved, flagged, macadamized, levelled, drained, and sewered, or otherwise completed or repaired to the satisfaction of the Council of the said City, it shall be lawful for the said Council at any time, and from time to time, by any order under the hand of the Mayor or Town Clerk of the said City, for the time being respectively, to order that any such street, court, or alley, or any part thereof, shall be freed from obstruction, paved, flagged, macadamized, levelled, drained, and sewered, or otherwise completed or repaired, in such manner and within such time as to the said Council may appear expedient, and thereupon the owners of the tenements adjoining, or abutting upon such street, court, or alley on each side thereof, shall in such manner, and within such time as shall be expressed in such order, at their respective costs, charges, and expenses, remove all obstructions, and well and sufficiently pave, flag, and macadamize, level, drain, and sewer, or otherwise complete or repair so much of the said street, court, or alley to the centre thereof as may be opposite to and co-extensive with their respective tenements, adjoining or abutting on such streets, courts, or alleys respectively: And whereas the streets, courts, and alleys enumerated in the schedule to this order annexed, marked A, have not being sufficiently paved, flagged, macadamized, levelled, drained, and sewered, or otherwise completed or repaired to the satisfaction of the Council of the City of Melbourne:

Be it now ordered by the Council of the said City, that the streets, courts, and alleys enumerated in the schedule to this order annexed,

marked A, shall within forty days from the date of this order coming into operation, be freed from obstruction, paved, flagged, macadamized, levelled, drained, and sewered in such manner as is expressed in the schedule to this order annexed, marked B; and it is hereby notified to the owners respectively of the tenements adjoining or abutting upon the streets, courts, and alleys enumerated in the schedule to this order annexed, marked A, that if they, or any of them, shall neglect or omit to remove the obstructions, and pave, flag, macadamize, level, drain, and sewer, or otherwise complete or repair the street, court, or alley on which their tenements respectively adjoin or abut, in the manner and within the time expressed in this order, then the Council of the said City will remove all obstructions in the said streets, courts, and alleys, and pave, flag, macadamize, level, drain, sewer, and otherwise complete or repair the same, or such parts thereof as shall not have been so done pursuant to this order, and will thereupon ascertain, determine, and charge such respective owners with their several proportionate parts of the costs, charges, and expenses thereof, according to and co-extensive with their respective tenements adjoining or abutting on such street, court, or alley, having regard in such apportionment to the state and condition of the pavement, flagging, macadamizing, levelling, drainage, and sewerage in which such streets, courts, or alleys respectively, or any part thereof, shall or may be at the time of making this order.

No.

1. A private lane, commonly known as Little Napier-street, extending from Webb-street to Little Victoria-street.
2. A private lane, commonly known as Little George-street, extending from Webb-street to Little Victoria-street.

SCHEDULE B, REFERRED TO IN THIS ORDER.
Manner in which the Streets, Courts, and Alleys, enumerated in Schedule A, referred to in this Order, are ordered to be freed from obstruction, paved, flagged, macadamized, levelled, drained, and sewered.

The natural soil is to be reduced or made up as the case may require, so that the longitudinal section of the whole right-of-way shall in no part have an inclination of less than 1 in 120; and wherever practicable the entire length is to form one incline. In laying on any stuff it is to be spread in layers of not more than one foot

thick. The transverse section of the right-of-way is to show a roadway whose crown shall be one inch above the kerbs of the footways, and the fall from the crown of the water channels is to be at the rate of 1 in 25.

On either side of the roadway there is to be a water channel eighteen inches wide, consisting of two rows of bluestone pitchers, nine inches deep, and not less than nine inches by fourteen inches on the surface, with upright sides, set in loam, and rammed with a rammer weighing forty pounds, so as to subside four inches.

The bottom of the channel is to be seven inches below the top of the kerbs.

On either side of the roadway there is also to be a footway not more than three feet wide, and these are to be separated from the roadway by a red gum plank or kerb, ten inches by three, set on edge, and fastened with five inch spikes to piles four inches by four of red gum, three feet long, driven into the soil.

The footways are to be covered with a coat of gravel three inches thick, and the surface is to fall towards the channel at the rate of 1 in 10. The roadway is to be covered with a coat of broken metal, broken to a two and a half inch gauge, and laid on seven inches thick at the channels and eight inches at the crown; and this, when necessary, is to be covered with a coat of loam one and a half inches thick.

Wherever private entrances lead from the rights-of-way they are to be paved to the full width with bluestone pitchers, in the same manner as the channels; paving is to be extended from the channels towards the line of houses or fences, so as to cross the entire footway.

The whole of the work must be done under the inspection and subject to the approval of the City Surveyor, who is authorized to order any deviation from these general principles which the particularities of any case may require.
