PRISON BOUNDARIES OF THE HULK SACRAMENTO.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HOTHAM, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Military Order of the Bath, Lieutenant Governor of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed by the Colonial Legislature of Victoria, in the sixteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to make provision for the better control and disposal of Offenders," it was

amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor of the said Colony to proclaim any Hulk or Floating Prison to be used as a public Prison for the reception and safe keeping of all Prisoners convicted and sentenced for any offence by any Court of the said Colony, and to define the limits and boundaries in and around such Hulk within which no person shall come, and the place of embarking and landing Prisoners to and from such Hulk, and such Proclamation and the said limits and boundaries from time to time to vary, alter, new assign, and revoke; And whereas by a Proclamation dated the 15th day of March, 1854, the Hulk *Sacramento* was declared to be a public Prison, and the limits and boundaries around the same were thereby defined; And whereas the said Hulk has been removed from its former moorings, and is now moored in Cowie's Creek, Corio Bay: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant Governor as aforesaid, by virtue of the authority of the said recited Act, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation of the 15th day of March, 1854, as relates to the limits and boundaries around the Hulk *Sacramento*, and I do hereby proclaim the limits and boundaries between which and the said Hulk no person shall come, to be as follow, viz:—All that portion of the North Shore and Cowie's Creek, in Corio Bay, contained within a space commencing at a point marked by a yellow painted post, one hundred and thirty-five feet north of the Beach; bounded on the north by a line running from the post aforesaid to another similar post bearing S.W. by W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W.; on the west by a line running S. by E. from, and marked by, the latter post and two yellow painted buoys; on the south by a yellow painted buoy moored at a point bearing east from the southern buoy of the western boundary; on the east by a line from the two eastern buoys, bearing N. by W. to the first-mentioned post; and that the place of landing and embarking Prisoners to and from the said Hulk shall be the north shore of Cowie's Creek aforesaid.

The following is a description of the Lighthouse, and the appearance of the Light, by Mr. DAVID STEVENSON, Engineer to the Commissioners:—

The Lighthouse is in N. Lat. 59° 23' 15", and W. Long. 2° 23' 38"; it stands on the Northern Point of the Island of North Ronaldshay, and by compass it bears from Moul-head of Papa-Westra W.N.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ North, distance 15 nautic miles; and from Start-Point of Sanday Lighthouse, S.S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ West, distance 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ miles.

The North Ronaldshay Light will be known to Mariners as a Revolving Light, producing a bright flash of the natural colour once in every 10 seconds. It will be visible all round the Compass. The Lantern is elevated 140 feet above the level of the sea; and the Light will be seen at the distance of about 18 nautic miles, and at lesser distances, according to the state of the atmosphere.

2. Start-Point Lighthouse.

The Start-Point Light, which is 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ miles from North Ronaldshay Light, being at present a Revolving Light, producing a bright flash once in every minute, the Commissioners further give notice, that on and after the night of Friday, the 1st September, 1854, when the new Revolving Light at North Ronaldshay is to be exhibited, the present Revolving Light at Start-Point will be changed to a Fixed Light of the natural colour.
