QUARANTINE.

CASES of Small-pox having occurred on board the steam ship Great Britain, during her passage from England to this port, His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, under the authority of the Acts of the Governor and Council of New South Wales, 3rd William IV., No. 1, and 5th Victoria, No. 12, has deemed it necessary to place the vessel, crew and passengers under quarantine, in conformity with the provisions of those Acts, for a period of fourteen days from the convalescence of the last case of infectious disease, of which all persons are hereby to take notice accordingly.

The boundaries of the Quarantine Station at Point Nepean are specified in a Proclamation dated the 23rd day of November, 1852.
