REGULA GENERALIS.

RULE 11, CHAPTER IV.

NHAT the Eleventh Rule of Chapter Four of the present Rules of Court be repealed, and that in lieu thereof it be ordered as follows:—

lieu thereof it be ordered as follows :
That whenever any action is brought upon a bill of exchange, promissory note, check on a banker, or absolute order for the payment of money, the defendant shall not be at liberty to plead any plea to the declaration therein, unless he shall have obtained the leave of a Judge so to do: and no such leave shall be granted unless it be made to appear to the satisfaction of a Judge, on affidavit, setting forth distinctly dates, facts, and circumstances; and also, if the Judge shall so require, by the examination of the defendant viva voce upon oath, that the defendant has a valid and bond fide defence upon the merits.

And whenever any action is brought upon a bill of exchange, promissory note, check on a banker, absolute order for the payment of money, or upon any agreement, indenture, bond or covenant for the payment of any sum certain payable on demand, or on a fixed day, without any condition, or when the claim is for a debt, or liquidated demand in money, with or without interest, arising on a contract, express or implied, or in the nature of a debt. or on a guarantee, whether under seal or not, and the defendant shall not plead within the time limited for pleading, the plaintiff may file in the Office of the Prothonotary the original summons, together with an affidavit of the amount of principal and interest (if any) then due, and thereupon sign final judgment on such original summons, tax his costs and issue execution.
