### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HOTHAM, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Military Order of the Bath, Lieutenant Governor of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed by the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, in the fifteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "An Act to make provision for the better Administration of Justice in the " Colony of Victoria," it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor of the said Colony, by any orders to be by him, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, from time to time made and proclaimed, to define the times at which Circuit Courts should be holden in the said Colony, and the said times to alter and vary as he should, with the advice aforesaid, deem necessary; And whereas, by a Proclama-tion dated the 12th day of October, in the year 1852, a Circuit Court was appointed to be holden at Portland, in the Portland Circuit District, on the 1st day of November in every year, and it is deemed expedient to postpone the holding of the said Court in the present year: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant Governor of the said Colony, with the advice of the said Executive Council, under the authority of the hereinbefore recited Act, do hereby proclaim and direct that the said Circuit Court, within the Portland Circuit District, shall be holden at the said Town of Portland, in the said Circuit District, on Wednesday, the twentieth day of December next ensuing, instead of the said first day of November.
