A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Imperial Parliament, made and passed in the 15th and 16th years of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "*An Act to amend and consolidate the Laws relating to the carriage of Passengers by Sea,*" it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor of any of Her Majesty's possessions abroad, by any Proclamation to be by him issued for that purpose, to declare what shall be deemed, for the purposes of the said Act, the length of the voyage of any ship carrying passengers from such possessions to any other place whatsoever; and also what articles of food and provisions may be substituted for those named in the said Act, and what Medicines, Medical Instruments, and other matters shall be deemed necessary for the medical treatment of the passengers during such voyage:

Now, therefore, under the power and authority in me vested by the said Act of Parliament, I do hereby proclaim and declare that the length of the voyage of a "Passenger Ship," proceeding from this province to the undermentioned places, shall be determined by the following scale, that is to say:—

If the Ship be propelled by Sails alone—

To Western Australia.....	Days. 120
To any other of the Australian Colonies ...	140

No. 9.—JANUARY 31ST, 1854.—1.

To the Western Coast of America, north of the Equator, and the Islands adjacent thereto.....	Days. 180
If the Ship be propelled wholly by Steam Engines of not less power than after the rate of twenty horses to every one hundred registered tons, or by such Steam Engines in aid of Sails—	

To Western Australia	Days. 85
To any other of the Australian Colonies ...	90
To the Western Coast of North America, north of the Equator, and the Islands adjacent thereto	90

And I do hereby further proclaim and declare, that the supply of Medicines, Medical Instruments, and other matters necessary for the medical treatment of the passengers during the said several voyages, shall be regulated in accordance with the fortieth section of the said Act, and shall be provided pursuant thereto in every respect.

Given under my hand and seal at Fredericton, the first day of June, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty three, and in the sixteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

His Excellency the Governor General directs the publication, for general information, of the subjoined notice, containing a description of the Light which has been established at Gabo Island, and which he has been pleased to designate the "Flinders Light," in honor of the late Captain Matthew Flinders, Royal Navy, and in testimony of the eminent services rendered by him to the Australian Colonies by the numerous hydrographical surveys which he made of the Coast and Harbors.

FLINDERS LIGHT, GABO ISLAND.

The Lighthouse on Gabo Island, off Cape Howe, is situated in

Latitude 37° 34' 20" South.
Longitude 149° 54' 40" East.

It was completed and lighted on the 28th November, 1853, and a light will in future be exhibited from sunset to sunrise.

The Lighthouse is a skeleton timber erection, painted white; the roof and framing of the Lantern painted red; and the Ventilating Ball painted yellow.

It stands nearly in the centre of the Island, about three-quarters of a mile from its southern point, upon a sand hill 157ft. 6in. above the sea. The centre of the Light is 21ft. 6in. above the sand, making a total of 179ft. above the sea.

The following Magnetic Bearings are taken from the Lighthouse:—

Cape Howe N. 32° E.
Ram Head S.W.
Variation of Compass 11° E.

The Light is a Fixed White Light of the First Class, consisting of 24 Catoptric Lamps in 2 ranges, illuminating the whole horizon.

The Light is eclipsed by a small range of sand hills from S. 15° E. to S. 4° W. (in all 19 degrees), to a distance averaging about 2 miles out to sea.

It is estimated that the Light can be seen 20 miles distant in clear weather.

CLAUSE VI.—“If any iron, timber, or other bulky article be left on any public quay, after twenty-four hours notice to remove the same shall have been given by the Port Officer, Harbor Master, or proper Officer of Customs, to the owner or person in charge thereof, it shall be lawful for any two Justices of the Peace, on proof of such notice having been given, to issue their warrant for removing such iron, timber, or articles, and for selling the same after the expiration of five days from the removal thereof, and out of the proceeds of such sale to defray the expenses of such removal and sale, paying the surplus (if any) to such owner or person entitled thereto. And if no owner of such iron, timber, or article can be found, and there be no person in charge thereof, and such iron, timber, or article shall remain on any quay for the space of four days, the Port Officer, Harbor Master, or proper Officer of Customs may remove the same to some convenient warehouse or place at the risk and expense of the owner or person in charge, such expense to be recovered as herein after mentioned.”

CLAUSE XXV.—“The term quay shall be taken to mean any pier, jetty, quay, wharf, or landing place.”
