REFERRING to the notice of 24th March, 1853, defining the several portions of Crown Lands which the Lieutenant Governor had, with the advice of the Executive Council, caused to be reserved from lease, under Her Majesty's Order in Council of 9th March, 1847: It is hereby notified that His Excellency, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to cause the portions of Crown Lands hereafter described to be reserved from lease, in the manner intimated in the 9th section of the Order in Council referred to.

WESTERN PORT DISTRICT.

Description of the Agricultural Reserve at Heathcote (McIvor), containing thirty-nine square miles, more or less.

Commencing at a squared post 9 x 9 inches in diameter and 3 feet high at the east angle of the Heathcote Town Reserve, and bounded by lines bearing north 133 degrees east 529 chains, north 223 degrees east 120 chains, north 333 degrees east 66 chains 60 links, north 96 degrees 30 minutes east 155 chains, north 317 degrees 20 minutes east 416 chains, north 336 degrees 40 minutes east 327 chains 50 links, north 288 degrees east 77 chains, north 189 degrees east 164 chains, north 152 degrees 30 minutes east 100 chains, north 46 degrees 30 minutes east 84 chains, north 332 degrees 30 minutes east 105 chains, north 291 degrees 45 minutes east 107 chains 70 links, north 322 degrees 30 minutes east 117 chains, north 182 chains 50 links, north 82 degrees 30 minutes east 190 chains, north 104 degrees east 100 chains, north 14 degrees east 60 chains, north 284 degrees east 100 chains, north 14 degrees east 60 chains, north 104 degrees east 100 chains, north 147 degrees 25 minutes east 51 chains, north 60 degrees 40 minutes east 46 chains, north 150 degrees 40 minutes east 20 chains, north 240 degrees 40

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minutes east 46 chains, north 182 degrees 30 minutes east 116 chains, north 120 degrees east 153 chains, north 12 degrees 30 minutes east 60 chains, north 102 degrees 30 minutes east 20 chains, north 192 degrees 30 minutes east 45 chains, north 102 degrees 30 minutes east 47 chains 50 links, north 65 degrees 55 minutes east 85 chains, north 155 degrees 55 minutes east 25 chains, north 245 degrees 55 minutes east 205 chains, north 155 degrees 55 minutes east 200 chains, and north 65 degrees 55 minutes east 120 chains to the point of commencement.

Description of the Agricultural Reserve at the Campaspe River, north-east of Sandhurst, containing thirty-six square miles, more or less.

Commencing at the north-east angle of the parish of Strathfieldsaye; thence by a line north, crossing the Splitters' Gully and Kangaroo Creek, 6 miles; thence east, crossing the Campaspe, 6 miles; thence south 6 miles; thence west, crossing the Campaspe River and the Axe and Shepherd's Creek, 6 miles, to the point of commencement.

Description of the Agricultural Reserve on the Axe, Emu, and Sheepwash Creeks, south-east of Sandhurst, containing thirty-five square miles, more or less.

Commencing at a point 40 chains south of the south-east angle of the parish of Strathfieldsaye; thence west, crossing the Axe, Emu, and Sheepwash Creeks, 7 miles 40 chains; thence north 17 degrees 30 minutes east 4 miles 56 chains; thence east, crossing the Axe Creek, 7 miles 6 chains 46 links; thence south 4 miles 40 chains; and thence west 1 mile to the point of commencement.

Description of the Agricultural Reserve at Myers' Flat, north-west of Sandhurst, containing thirty-two square miles, more or less.

Commencing at a blazed tree on the west bank of Myers' Creek 40 chains north of Myers' Pad-dock; thence south 60 degrees west 1 mile 30 chains; thence north 30 degrees west 8 miles; thence north 60 degrees east, crossing Myers' Creek, 4 miles; thence south 30 degrees east 8 miles; thence south 60 degrees west 2 miles 50 chains, to the point of commencement.

MANAGEMENT OF TOWNS ACT EXTENDED
TO MELBOURNE, GEELONG, WILLIAMSTOWN,
PORTLAND, KYNETON, BELFAST,
BENALLA, WANGARATTA, AND KILMORE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HOTHAM,
Knight Commander of the Most Honorable
Military Order of the Bath, Lieutenant
Governor of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, "*An Act to provide for the Management of Towns and other places in Victoria*," it is amongst other things enacted that certain provisions of the said Act relating to the good order of towns and other populous places, being sections numbered V., VI., VII., VIII., IX. and X. in the said Act, should extend to and be in force in such cities, towns, districts, and places as the Lieutenant Governor might, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, declare to come under the operation of the same, respectively, or any of them, and that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor to define the limits of such places, and to vary and alter such limits, and to revoke any such Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant Governor aforesaid, do, by this my Proclamation, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, declare and appoint that the sections of the said Act, being numbered V., VI., VII., VIII. and IX., shall extend to and be in force within the following cities, towns, districts, and places, that is to say:—

The City of MELBOURNE and the country surrounding the corporate boundaries of the said city, and extending a distance of five miles from those boundaries, and all towns and places within the limits so described; and I do define such limits to be as follows, namely:—Commencing at a point on the coast of Port Phillip Bay, which is the south-eastern corner of T. Wilmore's portion A in section No. 3, parish of Cut-paw-paw; bounded on the west by the section line bearing north as far as the north-eastern angle of Peter Inglis's section of 640 acres, No. 16; thence by a road also bearing north to the north-west angle of Joseph Raleigh's portion 4 in section 21; on the north by a road running east from last mentioned point to the Saltwater River; thence by a continuation of the said road to the south-west angle of William Fletcher's portion 9 in section No. 5, in the parish of Dousta Galla; thence by the section line bearing east, crossing the Moonee Ponds, the main road to Sydney, and the Merri Creek, which section line forms the southern boundary of portions 91, 90, 89, in the parish of Jika Jika, as far as the south-east corner of George Urquhart's portion 89 aforesaid; on the east by the section line running south from the said point in portion 89 to the south-western angle of Archibald Walker's portion 113, where it strikes the Yarra Yarra; again, on the north, by the said River Yarra Yarra to the north-western angle of

J. W. Cowell's portion 59, in the parish of Boroondara; thence on the east by the western boundary of the said portion 59 till it strikes the road, bearing south to the Yarra Yarra River by the said road to the Yarra Yarra River, by the angle of the said river to the north-eastern angle of W. H. Yaldwyn's portion 18, in the parish of Prahran; thence again on the east by a road bearing south from the last mentioned point to the south-eastern angle of Archibald McMillan's portion 32, east of Elsternwick; on the south by a road bearing west from the said angle in portion 32 till it strikes the coast; thence by the line of sea coast to the commencing point aforesaid.

And also the Town of GEELONG and the country surrounding the corporate boundaries of the said town, and all places and towns within the limits herein described; and I do define such limits to be as follows, namely:—Commencing at the north-east angle of allotment 1 of section 1, parish of Moorpanyal, at Inner Geelong Harbor; thence by a line of road running west to the River Barwon; thence by the River Barwon to its confluence with Lake Conneware; thence by a line running in a north-westerly direction to the south-east angle of allotment 4 of section 11, parish of Moolap; thence north by a road to the north-east angle of allotment 6 of section 13 in the said parish; thence by the Government Reserve in a north-easterly direction to the south-west angle of portion 16 of section 1 in the said parish, being the western boundary of portion 16, to the Outer Geelong Harbor; thence along the coast to the commencing point aforesaid.

And also the towns of WILLIAMSTOWN, PORTLAND, KYNETON, BELFAST, BENALLA, WANGARATTA, and KILMORE, and I do define the limits of the towns of Williamstown, Portland, Kyneton, Belfast, Benalla, and Wangaratta, to be the boundaries of the respective townships thereof, and the limits of the town of Kilmore to be the following, that is to say:—Commencing at the south boundary line of Rutledge's Special Survey, at a chain of ponds 5 chains 50 links from the eastern boundary of the Sydney Road, and bounded on the east by that chain of ponds about 5 chains and a line bearing north 45 chains; on the north by a line bearing west 46 chains; on the west by a line bearing south 53 chains 75 links; and on the south by a line bearing east 47 chains 25 links to the commencing point: Also that portion commencing at the south-east angle of Rutledge's Special Survey, and bounded on the north by a line bearing west 41 chains 50 links; on the west by a line bearing south 80 chains; on the south by a line bearing east 41 chains 50 links; and on the east by a line bearing north 80 chains.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-first day of December, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-three, it was declared and appointed that certain County Courts should be established and holden in and for the respective portions of the said Colony, including counties and parts of counties thereafter described; And whereas it is expedient to alter certain of the said Courts as hereinafter mentioned, and the names thereof, and the places and districts in and for which the same shall have jurisdiction, and the limits thereof, as hereinafter mentioned, and in lieu thereof to appoint that County Courts shall be holden in and for the places and districts hereinafter described and defined: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant Governor aforesaid, by virtue of the powers vested in me in that behalf, do hereby alter the County Courts of Heathcote, Sandhurst, and Castlemaine, being certain of the said Courts mentioned in the said Proclamation, and the portions of the said Colony in and for which they shall have jurisdiction, and the limits thereof as hereinafter mentioned, and do hereby declare and appoint that County Courts shall be established and holden in and for the respective portions of the said Colony, including counties and parts of counties hereinafter described, that is to say:—

The County Court of CASTLEMAINE, having jurisdiction and to be holden in and for all that portion of the said Colony of which the boundaries are hereby defined as follows, that is to say:—Commencing at the source of the Deep Creek, in the Great Dividing Range, thence by that Range and the boundaries of the County of Talbot to the most northern part of the said county north of Mount Alexander; thence by a line westerly to the junction of McNeil's Creek with the River Loddon at Thalack Thalack, and by that river and the Deep Creek upwards to the source of the said Deep Creek in the said Dividing Range, being the commencing point aforesaid.

The County Court of CARISBROOK, having jurisdiction and to be holden in and for all that portion of the said Colony of which the boundaries are hereby defined as follows, that is to say:—Commencing at the source of the River Avoca in the Great Dividing Range, thence along that Range to the source of the Deep Creek; thence by that Creek and the River Loddon to the junction of McNeil's Creek with the said River Loddon at Thalack Thalack; thence by the Rivers Loddon and Murray to the western boundary of the Township Reserve of Castle Donnington; thence by a line south easterly to Lake Bael Bael and the River Avoca, and by that river to its source in the Great Dividing Range, being the said commencing point aforesaid.

The County Court of SANDHURST, having jurisdiction and to be holden in and for that portion of the said Colony whereof the boundaries are hereby defined as follows, that is to say:—Com-

mencing at the junction of McNeil's Creek with the River Loddon at Thalack Thalack; thence by a line easterly to the most northern point of the county of Talbot north of Mount Alexander; thence by the Mount Alexander Range and the Myrtle Creek to the confluence of that Creek with the River Coliban; and thence by the said river to its confluence with the River Campaspe; thence by a line south-easterly to the source of the McIvor or Mount Ida Creek, above John Hunter Patterson's sheep station; thence by a line north easterly to the confluence of Hughes' Creek with the River Goulbourn; thence by that River and the River Murray and the River Loddon upwards to the junction of the said River Loddon with McNeil's Creek, being the commencing point aforesaid.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation bearing date the sixth day of December, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-three, it was declared and appointed that Courts of General Sessions of Peace should be established and holden in and for the City and Town, and the several places and districts prescribed in the same thereafter mentioned; And whereas it is expedient to alter certain of the said Courts as hereinafter mentioned, and the names thereof, and the places and districts in and for which the same shall have jurisdiction, and the limits thereof, as hereinafter mentioned, and in lieu thereof to appoint that Courts of General Sessions of the Peace shall be holden in and for the places and districts hereinafter described and defined: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant Governor aforesaid, by virtue of the powers vested in me in that behalf, do hereby alter the Courts of General Sessions of the Peace for Heathcote, Sandhurst, and Castlemaine, being certain of the said Courts mentioned in the said Proclamation, and the portions of the said Colony in and for which they shall have jurisdiction, and the limits thereof as hereinafter mentioned, and do hereby declare and appoint that Courts of General Sessions of the Peace shall be established and holden in and for the following towns, places, and districts of the said Colony, that is to say:—

The Court of General Sessions for CASTLEMAINE, having jurisdiction in and for all that District of the Colony of which the boundaries are hereby defined as follows, that is to say: Commencing at the source of the Deep Creek in

the Great Dividing Range, thence by that range and the boundaries of the County of Talbot to the most northern part of the said county north of Mount Alexander; thence by a line westerly to the junction of McNeil's Creek with the River Loddon at Thalack Thalack, and by that river and the Deep Creek upwards to the source of the said Deep Creek in the Great Dividing Range, being the commencing point aforesaid.

The Court of General Sessions for CARISBROOK, having jurisdiction in and for all that district of the Colony of which the boundaries are hereby defined as follows, that is to say: Commencing at the source of the river Avoca in the Great Dividing Range, thence along that range to the source of the Deep Creek; thence by that Deep Creek and the River Loddon to the junction of McNeil's Creek with the said River Loddon at Thalack Thalack; thence by the rivers Loddon and Murray to the western boundaries of the Township Reserve of Castle Donnington; thence by a line south easterly to lake Bael Bael and the River Avoca, and by that river to its source in the Great Dividing Range aforesaid, being the said commencing point.

The Court of General Sessions for SANDHURST, having jurisdiction in and for that district of the Colony whereof the boundaries are hereby defined as follows, that is to say: Commencing at the junction of McNeil's Creek with the River Loddon, at Thalack Thalack, thence by a line easterly to the most northern point of the County of Talbot, north of Mount Alexander; thence by the Mount Alexander range and the Myrtle Creek to the confluence of that creek with the River Coliban, and thence by the said river to its confluence with the River Campaspe; thence by a line south-easterly to the source of the McIvor or Mount Ida Creek, above John Hunter Patterson's sheep station; thence by a line north-easterly to the confluence of Hughes' Creek with the River Goulburn; thence by that river and the River Murray and the River Loddon upwards to its junction with McNeil's Creek, being the commencing point aforesaid.

And I do hereby further declare and appoint that if any of the aforesaid days shall happen to fall on a Sunday or on Good Friday, the said Courts shall commence on the day next following: And I do also declare and appoint that if the Chairman of any of the said Courts of General Sessions shall not arrive at any of the said places in time to open any of such Courts on the days so named respectively as aforesaid, the same may be opened and held on any day or days following such days so named.
