**PROPOSED DEVIATION IN THE LINE
OF ROAD FROM KEILOR TO BACCHUS
MARSH, NEAR THE JUNCTION OF
THE TOOLAM TOOLERN CREEK WITH
THE WERRIBEE RIVER.**

NOTICE is hereby given that a map and survey plan, describing the exact course and bearings of, and the admeasurements required for, a deviation proposed to be made by the Central Road Board in the main road from Keilor to Bacchus Marsh, through the parishes of Pywheittjorrk and Mooradoranook, together with a description of the lands through which the same is proposed to pass, and the names of the owners and occupiers thereof so far as known, and also an estimate of the expense of the said work, have been deposited in the office of the Surveyor General, Melbourne, the particulars of which are as follow:—

The deviation commences at a point 148 chains 50 links from the south-east corner of section XX., in the parish of Pywheittjorrk, bearing north 44 degrees 55 minutes west 10 chains, thence south 61 degrees 5 minutes west 1 chain 8 links, thence south 43 degrees 52 minutes west 2 chains 74 links, thence south 25 degrees 35 minutes west 3 chains 11 links, passing through the property of William France Tullock, crosses the Toolam Toolern Creek, and joins the main road to the westward through the parish of Mooradoranook.

The quantity of land required to be taken for the proposed road is one acre two roods and thirty perches, and the estimated costs of effecting the said work is eighty-eight pounds seven shillings.

All persons affected by the proposed alteration are requested to set forth in writing, addressed to the President of the Central Road Board, within forty days from the first publication of this notice, any well-grounded objections that they may have to the said alterations, failing which they will be thereafter precluded from making any such objections or claiming any compensation whatsoever.
