PROPOSED DEVIATION IN THE LINE OF ROAD FROM KEILOR TO BACCHUS MARSH, NEAR THE JUNCTION OF THE TOOLAM TOOLERN CREEK WITH

THE WERRIBEE RIVER.

OTICE is hereby given that a map and survey plan, describing the exact course and bearings of, and the admeasurements required for, a deviation proposed to be made by the Central Road Board in the main road from Keilor to Bacchus Marsh, through the parishes of Pywheitjorrk and Mooradoranook, together with a description of the lands through which the same is proposed to pass, and the names of the owners and occupiers thereof so far as known, and also an estimate of the expense of the said work, have been deposited in the office of the Surveyor General, Melbourne, the particulars of which are as follow:
