LOCAL COURT REGULATIONS.

AVOCA DISTRICT.

IN accordance with the Act of Council, 18 Vict., No. 37, sec. 17, it is hereby notified that the following Regulations, applicable to the District of Avoca, have been assented to by His Excellency the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council.

*Regulations made by the Local Court of the District of Avoca.—Assented to 22nd November, 1855.*

XI.—Business Licenses.

Each Business License shall entitle the holder to occupy an allotment of ground having a frontage of 25 feet by a depth of 70 feet; a space of 12 feet wide must be left between each place of business, available for mining purposes, and the stores and premises may be undermined with the sanction of the Warden.

XII.—Extent of Claims.

The extent of claim to which each Miner's Right shall entitle the holder shall be, in dry sinking, for one miner 12 x 24 feet; for two miners, 24 x 24 feet; and in wet sinkings, 36 feet x 36 feet for as many miners as are necessary to work the claim, beyond which no greater area will be granted unless where it can be proved satisfactorily that two or more parties of miners taking up claims in the usual manner can, by combining, overcome any natural difficulties which may exist by means not detrimental to the interests of the public or other authorised miners. Such combination may be authorised under the distinct condition that the ground must be worked by the same number of miners as would be required were it divided into smaller claims. Any such party of miners must be in possession of a written sanction of the Warden, to be produced when required.

XIII.—Sluice Washing.

Sluice washing or other water privileges will be allowed only by special sanction, in order that care may be taken to guard against conferring the privileges in places where the permanent supply of water may be injured by the operation. When a party of miners have received permission for sluice washing or other privileges, they must obtain a special sanction from the Warden.

XIV.—Double Claims granted on Old Ground.

Double claims may be granted under a written authority from the Warden on ground previously worked and abandoned.

XV.—Wet sinkings.

In wet sinkings when a party have sank their shaft to the water, this party and all parties having claims within six on the supposed line, and one on the right and left of any shaft that is bottomed on the lead, must work every day, and all day, or day and night as may be found necessary, but this rule shall only take effect after the application of six parties working in such locality to the Warden of the district.

**XVI.—Wet sinkings in Quartz Reefs.**

In quartz sinkings when a run of water is struck the party striking the same, and all parties holding claims within eight must work every day and all day, or day and night, as may be found necessary, but this rule shall only take effect after the application of six parties working in such locality to the Warden of the district.

**XVII.—Registration of Claims.**

A party of miners holding one claim in the wet sinkings (beyond the limits named in the last rule), shall be allowed, on giving their names, to register their claims at the Warden's office for one month at a time, in which case it will only be necessary for one of the party to visit the claim daily.

**XVIII.—Claims not to remain unworked.**

No claim shall be kept unworked at any time or in reserve (shepherded) for longer than 24 hours, unless satisfactory reasons, such as sickness or some other urgent cause can be shown on the claim becoming subject of dispute, and except in cases of claims registered.

**XIX.—Registration of Quartz Claims.**

A party sinking for or on a quartz vein, who are compelled to abandon the same for want of means, shall be allowed to register their claims for one month at a time, provided the shaft be sunk to a depth of at least 50 feet, but the granting of such registration shall be at the discretion of the Warden.

**XX.—Plurality of Claims.**

No miner or party of miners shall in any case be allowed to hold more ground or claim than they are entitled to, and such proceeding shall be considered as a relinquishment of right to the claim disputed, however much previously worked.
