SITTINGS OF CIRCUIT COURTS AT GEELONG,  
PORTLAND AND CASTLEMAINE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HOTHAM, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Military Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation bearing date the 12th day of October, A.D. 1852, the Lieutenant Governor of the said Colony did order, direct and appoint that Circuit Courts should be holden at the Town of Geelong, in the Geelong Circuit District, and at the Town of Portland, within the Portland District, on the days therein named and appointed; And Whereas by another Proclamation bearing date the 11th day of October, 1852, the said Lieutenant Governor did direct and appoint that a Circuit Court should be holden at Castlemaine, within the Northern Circuit District, on the days therein named and appointed; And Whereas by another Proclamation bearing date the 8th day of September, A.D. 1855, the Governor of the said Colony did order, direct, and appoint that the aforesaid Circuit Court in the Geelong Circuit District should be holden at the Town of Geelong, in the said Circuit District, on the days therein named and appointed; and that the said Circuit Court, in the said Portland Circuit District should be holden on the day therein named and appointed. And Whereas it is expedient to alter the times for holding the said several Circuit Courts, in each of the said Districts: Now therefore, I, the Governor of the said Colony, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said Colony, do hereby order, direct and appoint that the aforesaid Circuit Court in the Geelong Circuit District, shall be holden at the Town of Geelong, in the said Circuit District, on the 1st day of February, the 10th day of April, the 10th day of July, and the 10th day of October, in the year 1856, and every following year, until otherwise ordered; and that the aforesaid Circuit Court, within the said Portland Circuit District, shall be holden at the Town of Portland, in the said Circuit District, on the 23rd day of January, and the 1st day of October, in the year 1856, and on the 1st day of October, in every following year, until otherwise ordered; and that the aforesaid Circuit Court, within the said Northern Circuit District, shall be holden at Castlemaine, in the said Circuit District, on the 18th day of February, the 26th day of April, the 26th day of July, and the 26th day of October, in the year 1856, and every following year, until otherwise ordered.

And I do, with the advice aforesaid, order and direct, that if any of the several days aforesaid, shall happen to fall on a Sunday or Good Friday, the Court or Courts to be holden on that day, shall commence and be holden on the day next following.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HOTHAM, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Military Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation bearing date the 28th day of December, A.D. 1854, the places and times for holding the several County Courts then existing in the said Colony were declared and appointed; And whereas by another Proclamation bearing date the 29th day of August, A.D. 1855, a County Court of Warrnambool was established; And whereas by another Proclamation bearing date the 11th day of September, A.D. 1855, a County Court of Gipps' Land was also established; And whereas it is expedient to appoint other times for holding the said first mentioned Courts, and also to appoint times for holding the said two last mentioned Courts: Now therefore I, the Governor of the said Colony, by virtue of the powers vested in me in this behalf, do hereby appoint that the several County Courts herein-after mentioned shall, during the year A.D. 1856, and all subsequent years until otherwise ordered, be holden respectively at the several places and times following, that is to say:—

The County Court of Bourke, at Melbourne, on the fifth day of the respective months of February, March, April, May, June, July, August, September, October, November, and December.

The County Court of Grant, at Geelong, on the twelfth day of the respective months of March, June, September, and December.

The County Court of Buninyong, at Ballarat, on the twenty-fourth day of the respective months of March, June, September, and December.

The County Court of Warrnambool, at Warrnambool, on the third day of the respective months of April and October.

The County Court of Villiers, at Belfast, on the eighth day of the respective months of April and October.

The County Court of Dundas, at Hamilton, on the sixteenth day of October.

The County Court of Portland, at Portland, on the fifteenth day of April and the twenty-first day of October.

The County Court of Kilmore, at Kilmore, on the thirteenth day of the respective months of January, March, June, and September.

The County Court of Kyneton, at Kyneton, on the seventeenth day of the respective months of January, March, June, and September.

The County Court of Castlemaine, at Castlemaine, on the twentieth day of the respective months of January, March, June, and September.

The County Court of Carisbrook, at Carisbrook, on the twenty-ninth day of the respective months of January, March, June, and September.

The County Court of Sandhurst, at Sandhurst, on the fifth day of the respective months of February, April, July, and October.

The County Court of Beechworth, at Beechworth, on the twentieth day of the respective months of February, April, July, and October.

The County Court of Gipps' Land, at Alberton, on the fifteenth day of the respective months of May and November.

And I do hereby further declare and appoint that if any of the aforesaid days shall happen to fall on a Sunday, or on Good Friday, any of the said Courts appointed to be held on such day shall commence and be held on the day next following:

And I do also declare and appoint that if the Judge of any of the said Courts shall not arrive at any of the said places in time to open any of such Courts on the days so appointed respectively as aforesaid, such Court may be opened and held on any day or days following such day so appointed as aforesaid.

##### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir CHARLES HOTHAM, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Military Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

**WHEREAS** by a Proclamation, bearing date the 28th day of December, A.D. 1854, the times and places for holding the several Courts of General Sessions then existing in the said Colony were declared and appointed; and whereas by another Proclamation, bearing date the 29th day of August, A.D. 1855, a Court of General Sessions for Warrnambool was established; and whereas by another Proclamation, bearing date the 11th day of September, A.D. 1855, a Court of General Sessions for Gipps Land was also established; and whereas it is expedient to appoint other times for holding the said first-mentioned Courts, and also to appoint times for holding the two last-mentioned Courts: Now therefore, I, the Governor of the said Colony, by virtue of the powers vested in me in this behalf, do hereby appoint that the several Courts of General Sessions hereinafter mentioned, shall during the year 1856, and all subsequent years, until otherwise ordered, be holden respectively at the several places and times following, that is to say:—

The Court of General Sessions for Bourke, at Melbourne, on the first day of the respective months of February, March, April, May, June, July, August, September, October, November and December.

The Court of General Sessions for Grant, at Geelong, on the eleventh day of the respective months of March, June, September and December.

The Court of General Sessions for Buninyong and Ballarat, at Ballarat, on the twenty-first day of the respective months of March, June, September and December.

The Court of General Sessions for Warrnambool, at Warrnambool, on the third day of the respective months of April and October.

The Court of General Sessions for Belfast, at Belfast, on the eighth day of the respective months of April and October.

The Court of General Sessions for the Grange, at Hamilton, on the sixteenth day of October.

The Court of General Sessions for Portland, at Portland, on the fourteenth day of April and the twentieth day of October.

The Court of General Sessions for Kilmore, at Kilmore, on the twelfth day of the respective months of January, March, June, and September.

The Court of General Sessions for Castlemaine, at Castlemaine, on the twentieth day of the respective months of January, March, June and September.

The Court of General Sessions for Carisbrook, at Carisbrook, on the twenty-sixth day of the respective months of January, March, June and September.

The Court of General Sessions for Sandhurst, at Sandhurst on the third day of the respective months of February, April, July and October.

The Court of General Sessions for Beechworth, at Beechworth on the sixteenth day of the respective months of February, April, July and October.

The Court of General Sessions for Gipps Land, at Alberton, on the twelfth day of the respective months of May and November.

And I do hereby further declare and appoint, that if any of the aforesaid days shall happen to fall on a Sunday or on Good Friday, any of the said Courts appointed to be held on such day, shall commence and be held on the day next following; and I do also declare and appoint, that if the Chairman of any of the said Courts of General Sessions shall not arrive at any of the said places in time to open any of such Courts on the days so appointed respectively as aforesaid, such Court may be opened and held on any day or days following such day so appointed as aforesaid.
