ADDITIONAL POLLING PLACES FOR SOUTH BOURKE, EVELYN, AND MORNINGTON.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HOTHAM, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Military Order of the Bath, Licutenant Governor of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

Legislative Council of New South Wales, passed in the fourteenth year of Her present Majesty's Reign, called "The Victoria Electoral "Act of 1851," it was amongst other things enacted, that the places for taking the poll at elections in the several Electoral Districts should be those specified in the schedule annoxed to the said Act marked B; and it was provided that such other places should be polling places for the said Electoral Districts as should be appointed for that purpose by the Governor, by any Proclamation to be issued by him in that behalf and published in the Government Gazette of the Colony: And whereas by four several Proclamations, dated respectively the first and ninth days of September, 1851, the thirty-first day of May, 1853, and the eighth day of February, 1855, certain premises situated on the Kangaroo Ground, on Unwin's Special Survey, near the Punt, on the Dandenong Road, Prahran, and at Hawthorn, were appointed to be additional polling places for the Electoral District of South Bourke, Evelyn, and Mornington: And whereas it is deemed expedient to revoke the said Proclamations, and to proclaim additional polling places, without appointing any premises, for taking the poll at elections for the said Electoral District: Now I, the Lieutenant Governor of the said Colony, by virtue of the authority vested No. 14.—February 10rn, 1855.—1.

in me by the said Act, do hereby revoke the said four Proclamations, and I do hereby proclaim and appoint the undermentioned places to be polling places for the Electoral District specified in connection therewith, in addition to the polling places appointed by the said Act:—

The Electoral District of SOUTH BOURKE, EVELYN, and MORNINGTON.—Additional polling places, Prahran, Bulleen, Kangaroo Ground, and Hawthorn.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this tenth day of February, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, and in the eighteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

T is hereby notified that the places for taking the poll at Elections for the Electoral District of South Bourke, Evelyn, and Mornington, appointed by "The Victoria Electoral Act "of 1851," and by Proclamation, are as follow:—

OTICE is hereby given that in pursuance of the exigency of a Writ issued by the Honorable the Speaker of the Legislative Council, an Election of a Member to serve in the Legislative Council for the Electoral District of South Bourke, Evelyn, and Mornington, in the place of John Dane, Esquire, resigned, will be held at the house of William Rose, known as the Devonshire Inn, at Brighton, in the said County of Bourke, on Monday, the 12th day of February next, at the hour of Twelve o'clock; and in the event of a Poll being lawfully demanded at such Election, such Poll will be taken on Tuesday,

the 13th day of February next, opening at Nine o'clock in the forenoon, and finally closing at Four o'clock in the afternoon of the same day, at the undermentioned places, viz.:—
