- Nomination of candidates for the office of Councillor on the 14th April.
- Taking the poll, if election is contested, on 16th April.
- Alderman to be elected on the 24th April.
- Nomination of candidates for the office of Assessor on the 6th August.
- Taking the poll, if the election is contested, 8th August.

NOTICE TO HEADS OF DEPARTMENTS. REQUISITIONS.

THE Lieutenant Governor has been pleased to approve of the following Revised Regulations relative to requisitions for supplies heretofore furnished by the Civil Commissariat, and to direct the former regulations on the same subject to be cancelled :—

1. Requisitions for authorized supplies of all kinds are to be made upon the Colonial Storekeeper in the form annexed, and must be signed by the Officer in charge, and by the Head of the Department.
2. The requisitions for general stores are to be made quarterly, on the 1st January, 1st April, 1st July, 1st October, respectively; and Heads of Departments are hereby expressly enjoined to transmit their applications to the Colonial Storekeeper in due time, and to make provision for the requirements of the subsequent three months. Fourteen days after the receipt of the requisition the supplies will be furnished.
3. The requisitions for forage are to be rendered on the 25th of each month, for the service of the month ensuing.
4. Provisions will be supplied as heretofore upon a daily voucher, covered by a monthly requisition.
5. The Storekeeper, unless with the especial sanction of the Lieutenant Governor, is on no account to furnish supplies to any department by which timely provision—as directed by these regulations—shall have been neglected.
6. Such articles only are to be placed in requisition as are allowed by the regulations of the Government Service for the time being, or as are indispensable for the proper conduct of the public service; and in all cases the size, weight, measurement, or quantity is to be given, as well as a correct description of the articles.
7. On receiving requisitions completed in conformity with these regulations, the Storekeeper is to report as to the cost of the articles for the approval of the Lieutenant Governor.

PETITION FOR MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS.

EMERALD HILL.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council, 18 Victoria, No. 15, the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to direct the publication of the substance and prayer of a Petition to His Excellency, signed by three hundred and eighty-seven householders, resident in the district commonly called and known as "Emerald Hill," South Melbourne, in the County of Bourke, setting forth—

"That the Petitioners are all householders within the meaning of the said Act, are more than one hundred and fifty in number, and are all resident within an area not exceeding nine square miles, containing a population of more than three hundred householders.

"That the locality generally known as Emerald Hill, within which the Petitioners reside, is a locality presently included within the corporate limits of the Corporation of the City of Melbourne.

"That your Petitioners are desirous that said locality should cease to be a portion of, or to be or be deemed to be within, the corporate limits of the Corporation of the said City of Melbourne, and have resolved to avail themselves of the provisions of the Act partly above recited to have the same effected; and also to have the said district of Emerald Hill, with an area of nine square miles, constituted a Municipal District, governed by a Council, to be created a Body Corporate in manner, and with and under the several powers, provisions, and conditions prescribed by and contained in the said Act."

And praying His Excellency, with the advice of the Executive Council,

"To cause the substance and prayer of this Petition to be published in the *Government Gazette* in terms of the Act partly above recited; and thereafter, and as soon as the provisions and terms of the said Act will permit—the consent of the Council of the Corporation of Melbourne being first had and obtained—to constitute, by proclamation, the locality generally known as Emerald Hill, with so much of the adjacent localities in the district as shall form an area of nine square miles, into a Municipal District by name, in such proclamation to be declared; and also by the same, or any other proclamation, to define the limits and boundaries of such Municipal District, the same to be a Municipal District under and in terms of, and having a Council created a Body Corporate, for the purposes and with the powers contained in the Act above described."

EAST COLLINGWOOD.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council, 18 Victoria, No. 15, the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to direct the publication of the substance and prayer of a Petition to His Excellency, signed by four hundred and four householders, resident in the district commonly called and known as "East Collingwood," in the County of Bourke, setting forth—

"The urgent necessity that exists for immediate steps being taken to prevent the streets becoming altogether impassable, and much suffering being thus entailed upon the inhabitants."

And praying His Excellency "to proclaim the district within the following boundaries a township, viz.:—Commencing in Smith-street at its junction with Victoria-parade, bearing north in a direct line to the Merri Creek, following its course to the Yarra Yarra, along the Yarra Yarra to the bottom of Simpson's-road, bearing west to the point of commencement."

PETITION FOR MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS.

PRAHRAN.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council, 18 Victoria, No. 15, the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to direct the publication of the substance and prayer of a Petition to His Excellency, signed by six hundred and ninety-six landowners and householders of the district commonly called and known as "Prahran," in the County of Bourke, setting forth—

The urgent necessity which exists for the immediate operation of the said Act in the district which they represent. The Petitioners state—

"That in order to make a municipality efficient, and to enable it practically to work successfully for the benefit of its inhabitants, as well as to become conducive to general purposes of utility, stability in its resources must form a primary element in its constitution, to secure which your Petitioners would venture to point out the following as the limits or boundaries of the municipal district under which your Petitioners seek to be incorporated, namely:—

"Commencing at the north-east angle of the Botanic Gardens, on the south bank of the River Yarra Yarra; thence south by the eastern boundary of the Botanic Gardens to the Domain Road; thence west by the southern boundary of the said Botanic Gardens to the main road between Melbourne and Brighton; thence south-east by the eastern side of the main Brighton Road to the Junction Hotel; thence south-east by the eastern side of a road one chain wide, to the south-west angle of portion LXVIIIg, parish of Prahran; thence east by the northern side of a road one chain wide to the south-east

angle of portion CCIB, parish of Prahran; thence north by the western side of a road one chain wide to the River Yarra Yarra, and by that river to the commencing point aforesaid."

The Petitioners further state—

"That the parish of Prahran, as laid down in the maps of the Government survey, includes the abovementioned district and a much larger territory over and above, and that the proposed district is considerably less than the area limited by the said Act."

The Petitioners also state as follows:—

"That from the circumstance of the entire district defined as aforesaid being more or less inhabited, and the fact of the portions principally settled upon, forming integral parts of the said parish of Prahran, together with their contiguity to and close connection with each other, it seems not only practicable, but highly expedient that that they should be amalgamated and formed into one township."

"That your Petitioners feel fully persuaded that to restrict the district to narrower limits than the above would be to neutralize a large amount of good which would otherwise result from a hearty and united co-operation of the inhabitants of that district under the Municipal Authorities Act."

And the Petitioners pray as follows:—

"That the beforementioned boundaries may be constituted the limits of the municipal district of Prahran, and that your Excellency will be pleased to issue the necessary proclamation for erecting it into a municipality, and defining the limits accordingly."

PETITION FOR MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS.

SOUTHERN PRAHRAN AND WINDSOR.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council, 18 Victoria, No. 15, the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to direct the publication of the substance and prayer of a Petition to His Excellency, signed by three hundred and forty landowners and householders of "Windsor, St. Kilda without the City and other portions of the southern division of the parish of Prahran," in the County of Bourke, setting forth—

That the petitioners are desirous that that portion of the southern division of the parish of Prahran, hereinafter described, be proclaimed as the Township of "Windsor," and submit the following boundaries:—

"On the north commencing at a point where the natural gully crosses the Brighton Road, in an easterly direction along the centre of a street known as Union-street to a Government road bounding Jackson's Paddock, and marked on plan LXVI; thence in a southerly direction along the centre of a Government road to a Government road known as the Glen Huntly Road; thence in westerly direction along the centre of the said Glen Huntly Road to the shore of Port Phillip Bay; thence in a northerly direction along the centre of a Government road known as the Punt Road, to

the Junction Hotel; thence in a north-westerly direction along the east side of the main Melbourne road to the starting point."

The petitioners further state that the proposed district is about four square miles, containing about 5000 inhabitants; and that from its beauty and salubrity they confidently anticipate a large increase to their numbers before long."

The Petitioners add:—

"Again your petitioners are most desirous to impress upon your Excellency's notice the benefits to be derived from the division of these very extensive suburbs into two distinct townships, as it will leave the inhabitants of Prahran in possession of that large and populous district, being the northern division of the parish, to be drained by the Yarra river, while the entire district now submitted to your Excellency must be drained directly into Hobson's Bay."

And the prayer is as follows:—

"Your petitioners now pray your Excellency to proclaim as the township of 'Windsor,' the district above described."

"We would further pray your Excellency not to grant the prayer of the petition recently presented to your Excellency by the inhabitants of Lower Prahran, as far as regards their southern boundary; but that such boundary, we most respectfully submit, be the gully in Union-street beforementioned and described as the proposed northern boundary of Windsor."

"Should the inhabitants of St. Kilda, within the City, petition your Excellency (as we are informed they propose doing) to become a portion of the proposed township of Windsor, we shall, with your Excellency's approval, be willing to include them in the boundaries of such township."

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by a Proclamation dated the twenty-sixth day of August, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, it was directed that all ships and vessels arriving in this Colony from the Island of Mauritius with infectious disease on board, or having had infectious disease during the voyage, and the crews and passengers of such ships and vessels should in every case perform Quarantine for a period of not less than forty clear days after the convalescence of the last case of infectious disease; and that all ships and vessels arriving in this Colony from the said Island without having had infectious disease on board, and the crews and passengers of such ships and vessels, should in every case perform Quarantine for three clear days; And whereas it has become unnecessary to subject such vessels and persons to the performance of Quarantine: Now I, the Lieutenant Governor of the said Colony, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HOTHAM,
Knight Commander of the Most Honorable
Military Order of the Bath, Lieutenant
Governor of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c.,
&c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "*An Act to alter the Laws relative to Jurors and Juries in certain Districts*," it was amongst other things enacted that the Lieutenant Governor of the said Colony, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, might, by Proclamation, declare and appoint certain portions of the said Colony to be Districts for the purposes in the said Act mentioned, to be called "Special Districts," and might define the limits of such Districts, and every such Special District should be the Jurors' District for the town and place within the limits of such "Special District" at which any court for the trial by jury of any civil or criminal issues or the assessment of damages should be holden; and it was also enacted that the said Lieutenant Governor might, in his discretion, once in every three months direct the Court of Petty Sessions at any town or place where any court for the trial by jury of civil or criminal issues or assessment of

damages had been or should thereafter be appointed to be holden, such town or place being within the limits of any of the said Special Districts, to cause Jury Lists for such Special District to be prepared, and might limit as occasion required the times within which such lists should be prepared, published, corrected, revised, and recorded, and the Jurors' Book made therefrom, and might appoint the day from and after which such Jurors' Book should be brought into use and should be used: And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-first day of December, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-three, certain Districts were appointed and defined in and for which amongst others the County Court of Kilmore should be holden: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant Governor of the said Colony, with the advice of the Executive Council, and by virtue of the power vested in me in that behalf, do hereby declare and appoint the District of Kilmore aforesaid to be a "Special District," under the provisions of the said Act; And I do hereby direct, limit, and appoint, that the Jury List for the said Special District shall be prepared and published on or before the twentieth day of February now current, and shall be corrected, revised, and recorded on or before the twenty-fifth day of the said month of February, and that the Jurors' Book shall be made therefrom on or before the twenty-seventh day of the said month of February, and that such Jurors' Book shall be brought into use and be used in and for the said District from and after the first day of March now next ensuing.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE MELBOURNE VOLUNTEER RIFLE BRIGADE.

THE Lieutenant Governor has been pleased to approve and confirm the following Rules and Regulations of the Melbourne Volunteer Rifle Brigade, made in accordance with the Act of Council, 18 Victoria, No. 7.

REGIMENTAL ORDERS,

2nd February, 1855.

The following Regulations were submitted to a General Meeting of the Corps on the 1st February, 1855, and were unanimously adopted.

1. The Lieutenant Colonel commanding will hold every member of the Corps liable to the observance of these regulations from the period on which he is furnished with a copy of them,

and confidently relies on the cheerful compliance of every member of the Corps who has its interest at heart.

2. The Lieutenant Colonel, feeling assured that to permit the affairs of the Corps to interfere with the private business of its members would be both inexpedient and injurious, wishes it to be clearly understood that all reasonable excuses will be taken into consideration in extenuation of a breach of them; at the same time it will be observed that the existing arrangements for drill, parade, &c., have been so ordered that it is in the power of every Member to obtain the necessary instruction, and to attend the Commanding Officer's parade without inconvenience.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE MELBOURNE VOLUNTEER RIFLE BRIGADE.

I. The Brigade shall be open to all respectable persons subject to the approval of the Mayor and Bench of Magistrates.

II. The entrance fee and annual subscription, amounting to one guinea in full, is to be paid to the Treasurer.

III. Each member shall provide himself with the uniform according to pattern.

IV. The ammunition required both for service and practice to be supplied by the Government.

V. In the absence of a superior officer, the charge which was entrusted to him devolves upon the next in rank.

VI. Members will be responsible that their arms and accoutrements are kept in serviceable order.

VII. Damage to Government arms, accoutrements or ammunition, shall be made good by the parties injuring the same.

VIII. The Adjutant will keep a list of the names of those who are most attentive to their drills and duties, for the information of the Commanding Officer, with the view to recommend such deserving members to His Excellency for promotion.

IX. Members wishing to resign must give twenty-eight days' notice, in writing, to the Adjutant.

X. Notice of absence exceeding seven days to be given to the Commanding Officer through the Adjutant.

XI. A member being absent from his district of enrolment more than three months at any one time, unless good and sufficient cause for the same be shewn, shall be considered to have resigned his appointment.

XII. Members of equal rank may exchange with each other from one company to another, with the consent of the Commanding Officer.

XIII. All complaints against any of the member of the Corps shall be submitted to a Board of not less than five members of the regiment; the President to be nominated by the Commanding Officer, and the remainder taken from a roster.

XIV. Any alterations or additions to the foregoing resolutions and regulations that may hereafter be found requisite are to be submitted to the Brigade for approval.

FINES.

The following fines will be enforced, the amount in accordance with the discretion of the commanding Officer, as to the manner in which they are incurred:—

1. Absence from parade, not exceeding ten shillings.

2. Late for parade, not exceeding two shillings and six pence.

3. Not giving notice of removal of abode, not exceeding five shillings.

4. Non-attention to instructions at drill, not exceeding five shillings.

N.B.—All Officers will be subject to double the above amounts.

LOCAL PAYMENT OF PURCHASE MONEY FOR CROWN LANDS.

THE Lieutenant Governor has been pleased to authorize the following Regulations, with a view of affording facility to purchasers of Crown Lands at sales held in the Country Districts, to complete the payment of their purchase money at the place of sale, it being understood that they apply only to places where a Gold Receiver's Office or branch of one of the Government Banks is established:—

1. Purchasers of Crown Lands may pay the whole amount of their purchase money to the Police Magistrate, or other officer conducting the sale, at once, if they desire to do so, instead of the deposit of ten per cent. usually taken.

2. Balances of purchase money may be afterwards paid to the officer conducting the sale on the purchaser intimating at the time of sale his intention to do so.

3. Advice of such intention should be given to the Colonial Treasurer or Sub-Treasurer by the officer who forwards the report of sale, so as to prevent the possibility of a balance being twice paid.

4. No such balance would be received at the Treasury or Sub-Treasury, unless it be shewn that it has not been paid at the place of sale.

5. The officer conducting the sale will name a day when balances will be received by him, and will forward the same in one remittance in cash by Escort, or by Bank draft procured at par, together with a list of particulars of the balances, which he will transmit in time to ensure their arrival at the Treasury or Sub-Treasury (as the case may be) within the month after the day of sale prescribed by law for the receipt of such balances.

6. The usual Treasury receipts for the balances will be forwarded to the officer who conducted the sale for delivery to the parties entitled to them.
