WHOLESALE SPIRIT ACT EXTENDED TO CARISBROOK AND MARYBOROUGH.

THE Lieutenant Governor has been pleased to extend, provisionally, the boundaries of the Township of Carisbrook, so as to include the place known by the name of Maryborough, and in pursuance of the power vested in His Excel-
