TRANSFERABLE AND REMITTABLE GOVERNMENT DEBENTURES.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to direct that sealed Tenders be called for, to be received at the Office of the Colonial Secretary, Melbourne, until noon of the twenty-first day of May, 1855, from persons desirous to advance the whole or any portion of the sum of Four Hundred and Eighty Thousand Pounds Sterling, secured by Debentures, to be issued by the Colonial Treasurer under authority of the Act in Council, 18th Victoria, No. 26, and subject to the following terms and conditions, that is to say—

1. Each tender must be for an even sum of hundreds of pounds, and must state the year in which the tenderer wishes the Debentures he tenders for to be payable, and whether in Melbourne or London, and also where the interest is to be payable.
2. Tenders must be sealed, and endorsed, "Tender for Government Debentures," and addressed to the Colonial Secretary.
3. If the tender be accepted, Debentures in the form set forth in the Schedule A to the said Act annexed will be issued for (£100) one hundred pounds each, secured upon the general revenue of the Colony of Victoria, and made a first charge thereon, and will bear interest from the date of issue at the rate of six pounds (£6) per centum per annum, payable half-yearly on the 1st January and the 1st July; the first payment of such interest being due on the 1st January, 1856.
4. Three hundred of such Debentures will be payable on the 1st January in each year, commencing on the 1st January, 1857.
5. Any change in the place at which the principal or interest is payable, may be made by the holder giving six months' notice, in writing, in the manner prescribed in the Act annexed.
6. Debentures will be made payable to the holders and pass by delivery without assignment or endorsement.

7. The amount tendered, if accepted, must be paid in cash on or before the 1st June, 1855.

8. The tenders will be opened publicly at the time and place above specified, before the Colonial Secretary, the Colonial Treasurer, and such members of the Legislative Council as may desire to attend.

MUNICIPAL DISTRICTS OF EAST COLLINGWOOD, RICHMOND, PRAHRAN, ST. KILDA, SANDHURST, AND CASTLEMAINE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HOTHAM, Knight
Commander of the Most Honorable Military
Order of the Bath, Lieutenant Governor of the
Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "*An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*," it is amongst other things enacted, that any district of the Colony of Victoria, the area whereof shall not exceed nine square miles, and which shall contain a population of householders not less than three hundred, may, subject to the provisions of this Act, be constituted a Municipal District as thereafter mentioned, provided that no one point in any such area shall be distant more than six miles from any other point; and it is further enacted that it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, on the receipt of a petition, signed by not less than one hundred and fifty householders resident within any such district, praying that such district may be declared a Municipal District under the said Act, to cause the substance and prayer of such petition to be published in the *Government Gazette*, and (if no counter petition, signed by an equal or greater number of householders resident within such locality, shall have been delivered at the Office of the Colonial Secretary within one month from the date of such publication) the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice aforesaid, may, if he think fit, declare by Proclamation such locality a Municipal District by a name to be mentioned in such Proclamation, and also by the same or any other Proclamation may define the limits and boundaries of such Municipal District, and such limits and boundaries

at any time thereafter in the same manner on receipt of a similar petition may vary and alter, but so as in no case, as thereafter mentioned, to include within the limits or boundaries of such Municipal District an area of more than nine square miles, and upon the publication of any such Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, such locality so defined shall be deemed and taken to be a Municipal District within the meaning of the said Act; And whereas petitions have been presented to the Lieutenant Governor by the householders resident within the districts commonly called and known as East Collingwood, Richmond, Prahran, St. Kilda, Sandhurst, and Castlemaine, the substance and prayer of which petitions have been published, as directed by the said Act, but no counter petitions have been delivered in opposition thereto within the time allowed by law: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant Governor of the said Colony, do by this my Proclamation, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, with the advice of the Executive Council, declare that the several districts hereinafter described and named, shall be Municipal Districts within the meaning of the said Act: that is to say,—

THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF EAST COLLINGWOOD.—Commencing at the junction of Smith-street with Victoria Parade; thence north by the eastern side of Smith-street to Reilly-street; thence east by the southern side of Reilly-street to the Merri Creek; thence by the Merri Creek and the western banks of the River Yarra Yarra to Victoria-street; and thence west by the northern sides of Victoria-street and Victoria Parade, to the commencing point. And the said Municipal District shall be called by the name of "East Collingwood."

THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF RICHMOND.—Commencing at the angle formed by Hoddle-street and Victoria-street; thence by the southern side of Victoria-street to the River Yarra Yarra; thence by the western and northern banks of the said river to the Punt-road; and thence by the eastern side of the Punt-road and Hoddle-street to the commencing point. And the said Municipal District shall be called by the name of "Richmond."

THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF PRAHRAN.—Commencing at that point on the southern bank of the Yarra Yarra River intersected by the eastern boundary line of the City of Melbourne; thence south by the eastern side of the Punt-road to Wellington-street; thence east by the northern sides of Wellington-street and the Great Dandenong-road to the south-east angle of allotment 200 ^b; thence north by the western side of a Government road to the River Yarra Yarra; and thence by the southern bank of the River Yarra Yarra to the commencing point. And the said Municipal District shall be called by the name of "Prahran."

THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF ST. KILDA.—Commencing at the junction of Wellington-street with the Punt-road, at the north-west angle of allotment 68a; thence by the southern sides of Wellington-street and the Great Dandenong-road to the north-east angle of allotment 201 ^b; thence south by the western side of a Government road to the south-east angle of allotment 277; thence west by the northern side of a road known as the Glen Huntley-road to its intersection by the Punt-road at the north-west angle of allotment 20 ^b North Elwood; thence north by the eastern side of the Punt-road to the commencing point. And the said Municipal District shall be called by the name of "St. Kilda."

THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF SANDHURST.—Commencing at a point on the ridge which divides Commissioner and Iron Bark Gullies, bearing north 42 degrees west 14 chains 64 links from the northern angle of section 24b, Township of Sandhurst; thence south 47 degrees 40 minutes west 90 chains; thence south 32 degrees 40 minutes west 64 chains; thence south 17 degrees 5 minutes west 66 chains 50 links; thence south 73 degrees 53 minutes east, crossing Bendigo Creek, 75 chains 40 links; thence north 16

degrees east 60 chains; thence north 36 degrees east 47 chains; thence north 59 degrees 30 minutes east 101 chains; thence north 39 degrees 40 minutes east 43 chains; thence north 13 degrees 30 minutes east 228 chains; thence north 66 degrees 30 minutes west 67 chains, again crossing Bendigo Creek; thence south 24 degrees 45 minutes west 174 chains; and thence south 33 degrees 30 minutes west 73 chains to the commencing point. And the said Municipal District shall be called by the name of "Sandhurst."

THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF CASTLEMAINE.—Commencing at the south-west angle of the town reserve of Castlemaine; thence west 34 chains; thence south 88 chains; thence east, crossing Barker's Creek, 180 chains; thence north 396 chains, crossing Forest Creek, to the northern boundary of the Parish of Castlemaine; thence west, by the said northern boundary, again crossing Barker's Creek, 100 chains; thence south-westerly 156 chains to the north-west angle of the town reserve of Castlemaine; thence by the western boundary of the said reserve to the commencing point. And the said Municipal District shall be called by the name of "Castlemaine."





