GOLD REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the Act 18 Victoria, No. 29, section 13, His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has been pleased, with the advice of the Executive Council, to direct the promulgation of the following Rules and Regulations:—

1. The holder of an Escort Receipt may, on payment of the custody fees (if any) due on the gold represented by it, and on filling up the accompanying Form A, deposit such gold for exportation at the Gold Office, at Melbourne or Geelong, as the case may be, and such gold will be exempted from the Escort Fee.

2. An Export Receipt, in the accompanying Form B, will be delivered to the depositor.

3. The gold represented by this receipt will be retained in the Gold Office until the Export Duty and rent (if any) thereon shall have been paid, and entry outwards made under the provisions of the 6th and 7th clauses of the Act 18 Victoria, No. 29.

4. A rent of one-sixth of a penny per ounce per day after the first month will be payable on gold deposited for exportation.

5. Gold may be repacked while in the Gold Office on the application of the holder of the receipt, and at his risk and expense. If any loss of weight shall then take place duty on the difference must be paid, and a fresh certificate issued.

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6. The fee hitherto charged on specie, bank notes and negotiable securities transmitted by Escort, either to or from the Gold Fields, will be for the future remitted.

7. These Regulations will take effect from the 14th day of May, 1855.

REGULATIONS FOR CARRYING GOLD COASTWISE.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the Act of Council, 18 Victoria, No. 29, section 9, the Lieutenant Governor has been pleased, with the advice of the Executive Council, to make the following Regulations under which gold may be carried coastwise, viz:—

1. The shipper or person in charge of gold carried coastwise must produce the gold to the Collector or proper Officer of Customs at the port of departure, who will give him a permit therefor, which permit and the gold represented by it he must produce to the proper Officer of Customs at the port of arrival.

2. All gold carried coastwise must be borne upon the transire of the vessel, unless she hold a general transire.

3. Any gold carried coastwise between Melbourne and Geelong (except in accordance with the above regulations) will be forfeited, and the owner or person in charge of the gold, and the owner and master of the vessel will be subject to the penalties set forth in the "*Customs Regulation Act*."

4. If any gold shipped under permit is not produced to the proper Officer of Customs at the port of arrival, the master and owner of the vessel will be liable to the penalties set forth in the 40th and 83rd sections of the Act, 16 Victoria, No. 23.

TRANSFERABLE AND REMITTABLE GOVERNMENT DEBENTURES.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to direct that sealed Tenders be called for, to be received at the Office of the Colonial Secretary, Melbourne, until noon of the twenty-first day of May, 1855, from persons desirous to advance the whole or any portion of the sum of Four Hundred and Eighty Thousand Pounds Sterling, secured by Debentures, to be issued by the Colonial Treasurer under authority of the Act in Council, 18th Victoria, No. 26, and subject to the following terms and conditions, that is to say—

1. Each tender must be for an even sum of hundreds of pounds, and must state the year in which the tenderer wishes the Debentures he tenders for to be payable, and whether in Melbourne or London, and also where the interest is to be payable.

2. Tenders must be sealed, and endorsed, "Tender for Government Debentures," and addressed to the Colonial Secretary.

3. If the tender be accepted, Debentures in the form set forth in the Schedule A to the said Act annexed will be issued for (£100) one hundred pounds each, secured upon the general revenue of the Colony of Victoria, and made a first charge thereon, and will bear interest from the date of issue at the rate of six pounds (£6) per centum per annum, payable half-yearly on the 1st January and the 1st July; the first payment of such interest being due on the 1st January, 1856.

4. Three hundred of such Debentures will be payable on the 1st January in each year, commencing on the 1st January, 1857.

5. Any change in the place at which the principal or interest is payable, may be made by the holder giving six months' notice, in writing, in the manner prescribed in the Act annexed.

6. Debentures will be made payable to the holders and pass by delivery without assignment or endorsement.

EAST INDIA COMPANY'S CIVIL SERVICE.

Indian Civil Service, appointed to take place in
July next, the same or similar regulations being
also applicable to the examinations which will be
repeated in the years 1856 and 1857.

EXAMINATION FOR APPOINTMENTS TO THE CIVIL SERVICE OF THE EAST INDIA COMPANY.

1. In July, 1855, an examination will take
place, by examiners appointed by the Board of
Commissioners for the Affairs of India, of candi-
dates for appointments to the Civil Service of the
East India Company.

2. Any natural-born subject of Her Majesty who shall be desirous of entering the Civil Service of the Company will be entitled to be examined at such examination, provided he shall, on or before the 1st of May, 1855, have transmitted to the Board of Commissioners:—

- (a) A certificate of his age being above eighteen years and under twenty-three years.
 - (b) A certificate, signed by a physician or surgeon, of his having no disease, constitutional affection, or bodily infirmity, unfitting him for the Civil Service of the Company.
 - (c) A certificate of good moral character, signed by the head of the school or college at which he has last received his education; or, if he has not received education at any school or college since the year 1852, then such proof of good moral character as may be satisfactory to the Board of Commissioners.
 - (d) A statement of those of the branches of knowledge hereinafter enumerated, in which he desires to be examined.
3. The examination will take place only in the following branches of knowledge:

4. The merit of the persons examined will be estimated by marks, according to the ordinary system in use at several of the Universities, and the numbers set opposite to each branch in the preceding paragraph denote the greatest number of marks that can be obtained in respect of it.

5. No candidate will be allowed any marks in respect of any subject of examination unless he shall, in the opinion of the examiners, possess a competent knowledge of that subject.

6. The examination will be conducted by means of printed questions and written answers, and by *viva voce* examination, as the examiners may deem necessary.

7. After the examination shall have been completed, the examiners shall add up the marks obtained by each candidate in respect of each of the subjects in which he shall have been examined, and shall set forth, in order of merit, the names of the twenty candidates who shall have obtained a greater aggregate number of

marks than any of the remaining candidates; and such twenty candidates shall be deemed to be selected candidates for the Civil Service of the East India Company. Their choice of the Presidency in India to which they shall be appointed, shall be determined by the order in which they stand on such list.

8. In August, 1856, and August, 1857, further examinations of the selected candidates will take place by examiners appointed by the Board of Commissioners for the Affairs of India, in the following subjects:

Law, including the ordinary rules of taking evidence and the mode of conducting civil and criminal trials	1000
The history of India	400
Political economy	400
Any language of India in which the selected candidate shall have given notice of his desire to be examined	200

and such further examinations will be conducted in the same manner as that above described. (The numbers set opposite to each subject denote the greatest number of marks which can be obtained in respect of such subjects.)

9. Each selected candidate, desirous of being examined at either of the further examinations of 1856 and 1857, shall, two months previously to such examination, transmit to the Board of Commissioners for the Affairs of India a statement mentioning the language or languages of India in which he is desirous of being examined.

10. Any selected candidate who, having been examined at the further examination of 1856, shall not have passed, may, nevertheless, be again examined at the further examination of 1857.

11. Any selected candidate who shall not have passed at one or the other of the further examinations of 1856 and 1857, shall be struck off the list of selected candidates.

12. The selected candidates who, at either of such further examinations, shall be deemed by the examiners to have a competent knowledge of Law, the History of India, Political Economy, and at least one Language of India, shall be adjudged to have passed and to be entitled to be appointed to the Civil Service of the East India Company; and the names of the selected candidates who shall have so passed shall be placed in a list in the order of their merit in such examinations, estimated as above by the total number of marks which they shall have obtained in respect of all the subjects in which they shall have been examined at such examination.

13. The seniority of the Civil Service of the East India Company of the selected candidates shall be determined by the date of the further examination at which they shall be adjudged to have passed; and, as between those who passed at the same further examination, their seniority in such Civil Service shall be determined according to the order in which they stand on the list resulting from such examination.

14. No person will, even after such examination, be allowed to proceed to India unless he shall comply with the regulations in force at the time for the Civil Service of the East India Company, and shall be of sound bodily health and good moral character.
