## SPECIAL LICENSING DISTRICTS.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HOTHAM, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Military Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's Reign, intituled, "*An Act to make provision for the Sale of Fermented and Spirituous Liquors and of Refreshments in certain Districts*," it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time to proclaim any part or portion of the said Colony to be a District, subject to the provisions of the said Act, to be called "A Special Licensing District," and to define the boundaries of such District: Now I, the Governor of the said Colony, do by this my Proclamation declare the following parts or portions of the said Colony to be "Special Licensing Districts," under the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

That portion of the said Colony known as the POLICE DISTRICT OF MYRNIONG OR MOUNT BLACKWOOD, the boundaries of which are as follow:—Commencing at Mount Bullanerook; thence north-westerly by the range dividing the waters of the Lerderberg and Macedon Rivers to the Great Dividing Range; thence by the Great Dividing Range to the source of the River Werribee; thence by the River Werribee southwards to a point due west from Mount Blackwood; thence by a line due east to Mount Blackwood; and thence by a line north-easterly to Mount Bullanerook, the commencing point:

And also that portion of the said Colony known as the POLICE DISTRICT OF BACCHUS MARSH, comprising that part of the County of Bourke north-west of the Settled District thereof, and south-west of the Mount Alexander Road, except the country included in the Police District of Myrniong.
